<u>TODAY'S NEWS</u>: The Reds have agreed to terms on 1-year contracts with **OF Jay Bruce**, **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **3B Juan Francisco**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Sam LeCure**, **LHP** Matt Maloney, RHP Robert Manuel, RHP Josh Roenicke, IF Adam Rosales and C Craig Tatum...15 players remain unsigned.

ROTATION: RHP Edinson Volquez, RHP Johnny Cueto and RHP Homer Bailey are scheduled to pitch in Wed's exhibition opener vs the Rays at Port Charlotte...RHP Micah Owings will start Thu's home opener vs the Twins...the upcoming rotation also includes RHP Bronson Arroyo on Fri vs Phi, RHP Nick Masset on 2/28 at Bos, RHP Aaron Harang on 3/1 vs NYY and Bailey again on 3/2 at Pit.

SPORTS CLINIC: About 80 kids, along with their parents, enjoyed today's free Reds clinic at Ed Smith Stadium...the annual event was sponsored by the Sarasota Herald-Tribune, the local YMCA and Patrick's restaurant...participants included pitchers Micah Owings and RHP Jordan Smith, catchers Chris Denove and Chris Kroski, infielders Adam Rosales and Chris Valaika, outfielders Jeff Keppinger and Drew Stubbs and International League Manager of the Year Rick Sweet.

PROSTATE CANCER SCREENING: The Reds and the Men Against Prostate Cancer group will offer free comprehensive prostate cancer exams at Ed Smith Stadium on Monday from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. and Tuesday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m....the mobile examination center will be located at the corner of 12th Street and Tuttle Avenue...contact Rex Hardin of MAPC at (941) 926-9666.

WBC ROSTERS: Final 28-player rosters for the 16-team 2009 World Baseball Classic will be announced Tuesday...45-player provisional rosters for the WBC include 17 players in the Reds organization and 8 players on the 40-man roster: **1B Joey Votto** (Canada), **RHP Francisco Cordero** (Dominican Republic), **RHP Johnny Cueto** (DR), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (DR), **C/IF/OF Wilkin** Castillo (DR), OF Willy Taveras (DR), IF/OF Jerry Hairston Jr. (Mexico) and C Ramon Hernandez (Venezuela)...also on the provisional rosters are 9 minor leaguers: RHP James Avery (Canada), RHP Kyle Lotzkar (Canada), LHP Philippe Alexandre Valiquette (Canada), IF Yen-Wen Kuo (Chinese Taipei), LHP Luca Panerati (Italy), LHP Mateo Pizziconi (Italy), LHP Alexander Smit (The Netherlands), RHP Juan Carlos Sulbaran (The Netherlands) and RHP Luis Machuca (Panama)... Class AAA Louisville's Tomas Vera will be the head athletic trainer for Venezuela.

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC: National Team training camp begins on Friday for China, Chinese Taipei, Japan and Korea...National Team training camp for the other 12 teams begins on Mon, 3/2... the international tournament begins in Tokyo on 3/5, in San Juan and Toronto on 3/7 and in Mexico City on 3/8...the second round begins in Miami on 3/14 and in San Diego on 3/15...the semifinals are 3/21-3/22 and the final on 3/23, all at Dodger Stadium... ticket information and the complete schedule can be found at www.WorldBaseballClassic.com.

SUNSET SEASON: In 2009 the City of Sarasota Sports Complex is hosting the Reds' spring training activities for the 12th and final season...next year the organization will move its spring training site 20 miles west of Phoenix to Goodyear, Arizona...the Reds will share the Goodyear Ballpark and Recreational Sports Complex with the Indians, who moved into the facility last fall...Cin's portion of the plans includes a 40,700-square foot clubhouse, 6 full practice fields and 2 half fields...the teams will share the 10,000-seat ballpark...the Reds' agreement includes a 20-year lease and two 5-year team options...next spring, 15 Major League Baseball clubs will train in Arizona and 15 will train in Florida.

GOVERNOR'S BASEBALL DINNER: Is scheduled for Tuesday at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg... every team in the Grapefruit League received an invitation from Florida Gov. Charlie Crist, who once worked in the commissioner's office after law school...tickets can be purchased through the Florida Sports Foundation at (850) 488-8347.

**OUT OF OPTIONS**: The following players on the 40-man roster do not have options: **RHP Bronson** Arroyo, RHP Francisco Cordero, IF/OF Jeff Keppinger, RHP Mike Lincoln, RHP Nick Masset, 2B Brandon Phillips, LHP Arthur Rhodes and RHP David Weathers.

SPRING TRAINING ROSTER: The Reds begin spring training camp with 63 players, including 29 pitchers, 8 catchers, 16 infielders, 10 outfielders and 23 non-roster invitees...most recently, the club invited to Major League camp 65 (2008), 57 (2007), 63 (2006), 55 (2005), 56 (2004), 64 (2003), 70 (2002), 58 (2001), 72 (2000) and 54 (1999) players.

OPENING DAY: If RHP Aaron Harang is tabbed the Opening Day starter (vs NYM, 1:10pm), he would become the first Reds pitcher to start 4 consecutive Opening Day games since RHP Jose Rijo had

the honors in 4 straight seasons from 1992-95...the only other Reds pitchers to make at least 3 consecutive Opening Day starts are Pete Donohue (5 straight, 1923-27), Si Johnson (3, 1932-34) and Mario Soto (5, 1982-86)...Soto holds the club record for most Opening Day starts (6).

**OPENING DAY TICKETS:** Are on sale only at <u>reds.com</u> as part of the **Power Pack** promotion...the 10-game package also includes tickets to all 3 games of the Indians series over Memorial Day weekend, the 3-game weekend series against the Cubs series in June and weekend games against the Brewers (Sat, 7/18), Dodgers (Sun, 8/30) and Pirates (at, 10/3)...prices start at \$115.

THE BOSS: On 4/23/08 Walt Jocketty was named president of baseball operations and general manager...he replaced GM Wayne Krivsky...Jocketty was hired on 1/11/08 as special advisor to Reds President and Chief Executive Officer Bob Castellini...he joined the Reds after 13 years with the Cardinals... Jocketty led StL to 7 playoff apps, 6 National League Central Division titles, NL pennants in 2004 and '06 and the World Series championship over the Tigers in 2006.

THE SKIPPER...: Dusty Baker is in his second season as Reds field manager...in 15 seasons as a Major League manager has produced a 1,236-1,0129 record (.523)...his 1,236 career victories tie Joe Cronin for 36th on the all-time list, just 3 wins behind Bill Rigney...his teams have finished first or second 9 times and won at least 90 games in a season 5 times...has been named National League Manager of the Year 3 times by the Baseball Writers' Association of America (1993, 1997, 2000), twice by The Sporting News (1997, 2000) and once by The Associated Press (1993)...in 2003 finished second in the BBWAA voting.

THE POWER OF TRADITION: Spring training guest instructors include Joe Morgan, Lee May (3/1-3/7), Johnny Bench (3/3-3/7), Doug Flynn (3/4-3/10), Jack Billingham (3/4-3/11), Greg Vaughn (3/17-3/24), Cesar Geronimo (3/18-3/25) and Jim Maloney (3/18-3/25).

<u>DANDY DOMINICAN</u>: Reds prospect **3B Juan Francisco** established a Dominican Winter League regular season record for home runs by a lefthanded batter with 12...he shattered the mark held by Rafael Batista, who hit 8 homers during the 1974-75 DWL regular season...including the playoffs, in 62 apps and 246 at bats for Gigantes del Cibao **Francisco** hit .350 with 14 doubles, 2 triples, 18hr, 55rbi and 52 runs scored.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS TO...: Hall of Fame broadcaster Marty Brennaman, the voice of the Reds on Radio network, has been named Ohio Sportscaster of the Year for the second straight year and for the 15th time overall...in July 2000 ceremonies at the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York, Brennaman received the Ford C. Frick Award for his "major contributions to the game of baseball"...he also is a member of the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association Hall of Fame, the National Radio Hall of Fame and the Virginia Sports Hall of Fame...last month he was selected by the American Sportscasters Association as one of the Top 50 broadcasters of all time...the 2009 season will be Brennaman's 45th as a broadcaster, his 36th in Cincinnati.

SPRING TRAINING TICKETS ON SALE: Tickets for Reds 2009 spring training games at Ed Smith Stadium in Sarasota are on sale at the complex box office, on-line at reds. com and by phone at (877) 647-7337...fans also can order season tickets via reds. com or by calling (941) 954-4464...ticket prices are \$16 for box seats, \$14 for reserved seats and \$9 for general admission...there is an additional \$2 charge per ticket for each of 6 Premium games...the Reds' 36-game spring training schedule opens on Wed, 2/25 and features 16 games at Ed Smith Stadium, including a March 4 contest against the Netherlands' World Baseball Classic entry.

**GOING GREEN AT THE ED**: Fans can park for half price at Ed Smith Stadium lots for Reds spring training games if their vehicles have at least 4 people...regular parking is \$10 per vehicle but just \$5 if at least 4 fans car pool.

**NUXHALL EXHIBIT**: Fans have just a couple more weeks to see the *The OI' Lefthander: A Tribute to Joe Nuxhall* exhibit at the Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame and Museum...the popular exhibit that documents Joe's remarkable career will close at the end of February...a new exhibit featuring the sights and sounds of **Crosley Field** will open later in March...tickets to the Reds Hall of Fame and Museum are \$10 for adults and \$8 for seniors and students...kids under 5 years old, active military members and military veterans are admitted free.

<u>HOT STOVE LEAGUE</u>: The **Hot Stove League** show can be heard at 6:00 p.m. every Tuesday on **700 WLW Radio**, via the internet at <u>reds.com/hotstove</u> and on the **Reds On Radio Network**.

THE BIG ONE: From March 2-6, Reds on Radio rightsholder 700 WLW will broadcast its nightly SportsTalk show live from Fin Daddy's on Beneva Road in Sarasota...host Paul Daugherty and Executive Vice President of Player Procurement Bill Dennison can be heard March 2 from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. ET, March 3 from 6:00 to 7:00, March 4 from 6:00 to 8:00, March 5 from 6:00 to 8:30 and March 6 from 6:00 to 9:00.

REDS ON TV: Reds television rightsholder FOX Sports Ohio will broadcast 3 spring training games, including 3/19 vs Red Sox at Sarasota (7:05 p.m. ET), 3/20 vs Astros at Kissimmee (live at 1:05, replayed at 7:00) and 3/21 vs Pirates at Sarasota (1:05)... Reds Season Preview '09, hosted by George Grande and Jeff Piecoro, will air on 3/31 at 10:00 p.m. and will be replayed on 4/1 (6:30), 4/2 (7:00), 4/4 (7:00) and 4/5 (8:00)...the Emmy-Award winning Reds Live pre-game show returns in 2009 with popular hosts Piecoro and Jim Day...the pre-game show will air half an hour prior to each of FOX Sports Ohio's regular-season telecasts.

MLB NETWORK 2009 PREVIEW: The Reds' segment of MLB Network's 30 Clubs In 30 Days series is scheduled for Fri, 3/6 at 8:00 p.m. ET.

2008 SPRING TRAINING: Last spring the Reds finished 17-15 (.531)...won their last 3 spring games and 5 of their last 6 exhibition contests...posted a winning record for the fifth consecutive spring (18-16 in 2004, 17-15 in 2005, 22-11 in 2006, 18-12 in 2007)... went 10-6-1 at Sarasota's Ed Smith Stadium and 7-9 on the road...average attendance at 7,500-seat Ed Smith Stadium in Sarasota was 5,323, including 2 sellouts (3/17 vs Det, 3/24 vs Tor)...the Ed Smith Stadium attendance total of 90,489 (17 dates) was the highest since the Reds moved to Sarasota in 1998...the Reds began spring training camp with 62 players, then signed to a 1-year contract RHP Josh Fogg (2/21) and to minor league contracts OF Corey Patterson (3/4) and Jerry Hairston Jr. (3/3)... Giants Rule 5 draftee LHP Jose Capellan joined camp on 3/13, the day after he was claimed off waivers from San Francisco, but on 3/28 he was returned to the Red Sox...SS Alex Gonzalez missed all spring with a compression fracture in his left knee and wouldn't play for the Reds in 2008...C David Ross was bothered all spring by low back spasms and didn't play in his first "A" game until 3/26...RHP Matt Belisle didn't pitch in an "A" game after 3/14 because of a sore right forearm...all 3 players began the 2008 season on the disabled list...RHP Mike Lincoln led the staff in apps (10)...RHP Aaron Harang led the staff in spring training innings pitched (22.0)...RHP Edinson Volquez led the club in strikeouts (26k in 20ip)...Jolbert Cabrera led the team in doubles (8)...Adam Dunn led the club in HR (4)...Scott Hatteberg tied for the team lead in total bases (30)...Jeff Keppinger led the team in hits (24)...Brandon Phillips led the team in RBI (17) and total bases (30, tied).
