TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (0-2) of a 3-game series vs **Jay Horwitz'** Mets and Game 3 (0-2) of a 6-game homestand to open the season that also includes **Jim Trdinich's** Pirates (tomorrow-Sun)...following this homestand the Reds embark on their longest road trip of the season, an 11-day, 10-game jaunt to **Mil** (3g), **Hou** (off day, 4g) and **Chi** (3g).

WEATHER DAY: Today is the first **Weather Day** at Great American Ball Park...a presentation was hosted inside the ballpark by **FOX 19 News** meteorologists **Steve Horstmeyer**, **Pat Berry** and **Frank Marzullo**...during pregame ceremonies, Reds chief operating officer **Phil Castellini** and vice president of ballpark operations **Declan Mullin** received **StormReady** supporter status recognition from **National Weather Service** meteorologist in charge **Kenneth Haydu** for our efforts in establishing severe weather safety plans and to actively promote weather awareness.

HAIRSTON UPDATE: **Jerry Hairston Jr.** left last night's game with stiffness and soreness in his lower left leg after fouling 2 balls off his medial tibia...x-rays were negative...he will be evaluated again today.

ONLINE CHAT: Reds Vice President and Assistant General Manager **Bob Miller** will participate in an online chat at reds.com tomorrow at **11:00 a.m. ET**...fans can log on and post their questions beginning at **8:00 a.m.**.

CIVIL RIGHTS GAME: At Great American Ball Park on **Sat, 6/20** the Reds and Chicago White Sox will meet in the **Civil Rights Game**, the first time the contest will be played during the regular season...the weekend's festivities will include a roundtable discussion at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center's **Harriet Tubman Theater** (Fri, 6/19, 4:00 p.m.), a luncheon at **Duke Energy Center** honoring the 3 winners of Major League Baseball's **Beacon Awards** (Sat, 6/20, 11:30 a.m.) and a **Youth Summit at Fountain Square** downtown (Sat, 6/20, 4:00 p.m.)...the luncheon on Sat, 6/20 will honor Beacon of Hope winner **Bill Cosby**, Beacon of Life winner **Hank Aaron** and Beacon of Change winner **Muhammad Ali**...for more information, log on to www.mlb.com/civilrightsgame.

VOTE NOW: Through 4/30, fans can vote online at reds.com to decide which **Reds pitcher** will have a 2009 bobblehead...the **Fans Choice Bobblehead** will be given to the first 30,000 fans on **Sat, 7/18 vs Mil** and is part of a collectible set of 4 bobbleheads that also features **Joey Votto** (Sat, 5/9 StL), **Jay Bruce** (Sat, 7/4 vs StL) and **Brandon Phillips** (Sat, 8/15 vs Wsh).

NON-ROSTER INVITEES: The Opening Day roster includes a pair of non-roster invitees, **OF Darnell McDonald** and **OF Laynce Nix**...the club's most recent Opening Day rosters included 5 non-roster invitees last season (**RHP Johnny Cueto**, **RHP Mike Lincoln**, **LHP Kent Mercker**, **C Paul Bako**, **OF Corey Patterson**), 1 in 2007 (**RHP Victor Santos**), 1 in 2006 (**IF Andy Abad**) and 2 in 2005 (**IF Rich Aurilia**, **1B Jacob Cruz**).

RECORD-SETTING 2008 SEASON: Reds pitchers threw **2 complete games** and for the fourth time in the last 7 years tied the club record for fewest complete games in a season (2001, 2002, 2005)...**Bronson Arroyo** earned a 2-1 complete game win on 8/26 at Hou and **Aaron Harang** produced a 3-0 win on 9/17 vs StL...Cin was the last team in the Major Leagues to record a CG (132nd game)...**RHP Francisco Cordero** established a club record for games finished (63)...**Joey Votto** established a club record for home runs by a first baseman in his rookie season (24).

LEFTHANDERS: In the **2008 season finale**, an 11-4 loss at StL, **Adam Pettyjohn** became the only lefthanded pitcher to start a game for the Reds last season...snapped a streak of 180 consecutive starts by Reds righthanders, dating back to **Phil Dumatrait's** 10-5 loss vs Mil on 9/9/07...according to Elias Sports Bureau, it was the first time since at least 1900 that the Reds went an entire season with only 1 start by a lefthander...the **2006 Diamondbacks** were the last team to finish a Major League season with fewer than 2 starts by a lefthanded pitcher...the Reds were the only team to do it in 2008.

RISING STARS: In 2008, **OF Jay Bruce**, **1B Joey Votto** and **RHP Johnny Cueto** ranked among the National League rookie leaders in almost every statistical category...**Cueto** led NL rookie pitchers in strikeouts (158), while **Votto** ranked first in hitting (.297), hits (156), HR (24), total bases (266), multi-hit games (42), on-base percentage (.368) and slugging percentage (.506)...**Votto** (24hr, 84rbi) and **Bruce** (21hr, 52rbi) became the first pair of Reds rookies ever to produce more than 13 home runs each in the same season...the Reds were the only team in the Major Leagues this season to have 2 rookies with as many as 21hr each...**Votto** hit 23 of his 24 homers as a first baseman, a new club record for HR by a rookie at that position (**Ted Kluszewski**, 12hr, 1948).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (0-2, .000): In 2008, at **43-38** the Reds established a new Great American Ball Park record for victories in a season...went **12-11-3** in their 26 home series...in 6 seasons at GABP are **241-247-1** (35-46 in 2003, 40-41 in 2004, 42-39-1 in 2005, 42-39 in 2006, 39-42 in 2007, 43-38 in 2008)...**at 217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (31-50, .383): Last season the Reds went **8-16-2** in their 26 road series...produced 3 winning road trips: from **6/20-6/29** went 5-4 at NYY/Tor/Cle, from **8/12-8/14** went 2-1 at Pit and from **9/8-9/14** went 4-2 at Mil/Ari...dating back to 2006, **the Reds have produced a losing record in 23 of their last 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (3): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 0, SECOND - 0, THIRD - 0, FOURTH - 1, FIFTH - 1, SIXTH - 1...have spent **0** days above, **0** days at and **3** days below .500.

REDS vs METS: Reds are 294-250 all-time vs the Mets, including 0-2 this season and 3-4 last season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 8-13, including 0-2 this season and 2-2 last season...**last Mets sweep:** at Cin: 4/28-4/29, 1997 (2g); 7/4-7/6, 2003 (3g).

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **969-1,015 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 6-9 in 2008...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 25-28 all-time, including 4-5 in 2008 and 7-9 the last 2 seasons.

In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, **Bronson Arroyo** made the shortest start of his career (1+ip, 11h, 10er) and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29, **Arroyo** finished the 2008 season with 11 wins, second-most in the majors:

Player of the Week: For the period ending 8/31 of last season was voted **National League Co-Player of the Week** along with Wsh's **Cristian Guzman**...in 2 starts that week **Arroyo** went 2-0, 1.69 with 1 complete game...was his first weekly award.

Career Highlights: In each of the last 4 seasons recorded at least 32 starts and 200 innings...is 1 of only 8 Major League pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 4 seasons (Mark Buehrle, Dan Haren, Roy Oswalt, Andy Pettitte, Johan Santana, Javier Vazquez, Brandon Webb)...in each of the last 3 seasons led the Reds in starts and in 2 of the last 3 seasons led the Reds in starts and in 2 of the last 3 seasons led the staff in innings pitched...was National League Co-Player of the Week for 8/25-8/31, 2007...in 2006 was a National League All-Star, participated in Major League Baseball's All-Star tour of Japan in November and was voted by the Cincinnati chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America the winner of both the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the club's Most Outstanding Pitcher and the Joe Nuxhall Good Guy Award.

Tomorrow vs Pirates: RHP Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Sat vs Reds minor leaguers in a Futures Game at Fifth Third Bank in Dayton...earned the 9-6 victory (4ip, 4h, 1er, 1bb, 1k).

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow vs Pit will make his season debut and 32nd start of his career...last season produced 14 quality apps...in his 31 starts the Reds went 12-19 and scored 118 runs (3.81 r/g).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the 16-team tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 victory vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).

Rookie Season: Became the first Reds rookie to make 30 starts since **Tom Browning** in 1988 (38gs) and the first Reds rookie *righthander* to make 30 starts since **Gary Nolan** in 1967 (32gs).

Rookie Leader: In 2008 led all National League rookie pitchers in strikeouts (158) and ranked among the NL rookie leaders in ERA (8th), starts (31, T1st), wins (9, T2nd), innings pitched (174.0, 4th) and opponents' BA (.264, 6th)...averaged 8.2 strikeouts per 9 innings to rank eighth among all NL pitchers.

Major League Debut: On 4/3 vs Ari made his Major League debut at 22 years, 48 days old and earned the 3-2 victory (7ip, 1h, 1er, 0bb, 10k, Upton HR, 92 pitches, 68 strikes)...became the first pitcher in modern Major League history to debut with 10 strikeouts and 0 walks, the first Reds pitcher since 1900 to record 10 strikeouts in his ML debut and only the third pitcher to win his ML debut while allowing 1 hit and recording at least 10 strikeouts (Steve Woodard 1997, Juan Marichal 1960)...retired his first 15 batters and allowed only 1 baserunner overall, Justin Upton homered leading off the sixth.

Control Freak: According to Elias Sports Bureau is the only pitcher since 1900 to record as many as 18 strikeouts without a walk in his first 2 career starts...threw 16.0 innings and recorded 22 strikeouts before issuing his first career walk, to Pit's Nate McLouth on 4/13 in his third start.

Arroyo vs Mets: In his last 6 starts vs NYM is 4-1, 2.02 (49ip, 11er) with 2 complete games and 2 more 8.0-inning apps...has 2 of his 5 career complete games vs NYM, both at Shea Stadium...in the 3-2 loss on 7/12/07 at Shea Stadium allowed homers to the first 2 batters he faced (Reyes, Gotay)...was the first time in Mets history that their first 2 batters of a game homered.

Reds Pitchers: In the last 11g of spring beginning 3/22 posted a 2.51era...allowed just 2 home runs after 3/21, including a 9-game stretch near the end of camp in which they didn't allow a homer (3/22-3/31, 79.2ip)...last season ranked 13th in the National League in team ERA (4.55) and first in HR allowed (201; Hou 2nd, 197)...for the fourth time in the 7 years tied the franchise record for fewest complete games in a season (2cg, 2001, 2002, 2005, 2008).

Reds Starters: In the last 11g of spring training beginning 3/22 posted a 2.08era...last season, among National League starting rotations ranked first in home runs allowed (142; Wsh 2nd, 133) and 14th in ERA (4.97)...made **54 starts of 5.0 innings or fewer**, including 20-66 starts after the All-Star break...made **23 starts of 4.0 innings or fewer**, including 11-66 starts after the All-Star break...pitched into the eighth inning 8 times and into the ninth twice...last season produced 78 quality starts (**Volquez** 20, **Arroyo** 18, **Harang** 17, **Cueto** 14, **Fogg** 3, **Ramirez** 3, **Bailey** 2, **Belisle** 1)...the Reds went 56-22 in those quality starts (.718).

Reds Relievers: In the last 11g of spring training beginning 3/22 posted a 3.12era...last season, with a 3.81 bullpen ERA ranked third in the National League...**Francisco Cordero** established a new club record with 63 games finished (62, **Tom Hume** in 1980, **Jeff Shaw** in 1997)...converted their first 7 saves opps, 27 of their last 48 save opps and each of their last 5 save opps...the Reds' bullpen didn't blow a save until the 41st game, on 5/14...was the last bullpen in the Major Leagues to blow a save...suffered 2 blown saves in their first 50g of the season but then in the 51st contest, on 5/25 at SD, suffered 3 blown saves in the 18-inning, 12-9 loss...in that loss to the Padres recorded 17 strikeouts in 13.1 innings, both 2008 season single-game highs.
