TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Melody Yount's** Cardinals and **Game 5** (3-1) of a 5-game homestand that included the **Brewers** (1-1)...tomorrow night begin a 6-game trip to **Ari** (3g) and **SD** (off day, 3g).

AARON'S ACES: This afternoon **Aaron Harang** is hosting 30 fans in sun deck Section 143 as part of his **Aaron's Aces** program targeting local **military families**...guests receive an autographed t-shirt, in-stadium welcomes via the public address announcer and scoreboard and a \$10 concession voucher...prior to today's game, **Aaron** was scheduled to meet the guests in the bullpen...fans with family members currently on active duty or who recently returned from active duty can sign up online at www.reds.com/community, then click on ticket programs.

.500: At **17-13** the Reds are 4g over .500 this late in a season for the first time since they were 4g over at **67-63 in 2006**...haven't been 5g over .500 since they were **67-62 in 2006**...during that **2006 season** the Redlegs reached a season-high 12g over .500 at **36-24**.

CENTRAL CASTING: Today's game is Game 28 in a stretch of **23-28g** against **National League Central** opponents (15-11 overall, **14-8 vs NL Central**, 1-1 vs Pit, 2-1 at Mil, 3-1 at Hou, 2-1 at Chi, **1-2 vs Atl**, 1-2 vs Hou, 2-1 at Pit, **1-1 at Fla**, 1-1 vs Mil, **2-0 vs StL**).

QUALITY CONTROL: In the Reds' 30g the opposing pitcher has produced **20 quality starts**, including 11 straight from **4/14-4/25**...the Reds went **10-10** (.500) when the opposing starter produced a quality appearance...the Reds have produced 15 quality starts (**Cueto 4, Harang 4, Arroyo 3, Volquez 3, Owings 1**) and went **13-2** in those QS (.867).

DOT, DOT, DOT...: The Reds are **5-1** on travel days...regardless of today's outcome the Red are **2-0-2** in their last 4 series...**Dusty Baker** has **1,253** career victories as a manager, tying **Billy Martin** for 32nd on the all-time list...the Reds (13-0) and the Giants (12-0) are the National League's only undefeated teams when leading after 5 innings...**RHP Francisco Cordero** tomorrow will celebrate his **34th** birthday.

SPELLING RELIEF: The Reds' bullpen has converted all 9 save opps, all by **Francisco Cordero**, and for the second straight season will be the last bullpen in the Major Leagues to suffer a blown save...in 2008, Cin's pen didn't blow a save until the **41st game** (5/14)...including last season, **Cordero** has recorded each of the Reds' last **43 saves** (34sv in 2008, 9sv in 2009).

ZEROES: Reds pitchers lead the National League with **6 team shutouts** (SF & Pit T2nd w/ 4sho)...produced those 6 shutouts in their first **26g**, their fastest to 6 blankings since the **1914 staff** threw its sixth shutout in the **25th** game...Cin produced 6 team shutouts all of last season.

PLAYING FROM BEHIND: The Reds have trailed in 18 of their 30g this season...9 times allowed runs in the first inning...are **13-2** when they score first and **4-11** when the opponent scores first.

ALL-STARS AMONG US: Major League Baseball and *People* magazine invite fans to nominate individuals who have gone above and beyond to serve their communities during these difficult times...30 **Everyday All-Stars**, one representing each team, will attend and be honored at the **All-Star Game in St. Louis**...one person will be featured in *People* magazine...to nominate an **Everyday All-Star**, log on to PeopleAllStars.com.

GILLETTE CIVIL RIGHTS GAME: At Great American Ball Park on **Sat, 6/20** the Reds and Chicago White Sox will meet in the **Gillette Civil Rights Game**, the first time the contest will be played during the regular season...the weekend's festivities will include a roundtable discussion at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center's **Harriet Tubman Theater** (Fri, 6/19, 4:00 p.m.), a luncheon at **Duke Energy Center** honoring the 3 winners of Major League Baseball's **Beacon Awards** (Sat, 6/20, 11:30 a.m.) and a **Youth Summit** at **Fountain Square** downtown (Sat, 6/20, 4:00 p.m.)...the luncheon on Sat, 6/20 will honor Beacon of Hope winner **Bill Cosby**, Beacon of Life winner **Hank Aaron** and Beacon of Change winner **Muhammad Ali**...for more information, log on to www.mlb.com/civilrightsgame.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (7-8, .467): The Reds have gone 1-3-2 in their 6 home series, including this one (1-2 vs NYM, 1-1 vs Pit, 1-2 vs Atl, 1-2 vs Hou, 1-1 vs Mil, 2-0 vs StL)...regardless of today's outcome will have produced a winning record on a homestand for the first time this season (2-3, 2-4, 3-1)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **248-253-1**..

REDS ON THE ROAD (10-5, .667): At **10-5** the Reds have the second-most road wins in the Major Leagues (Marlins 11-7, Blue Jays 10-8) ...**went 4-0-1 in their first 5 road series**...produced winning records on each of their first 2 road trips (7-3, 3-2)...entering this season and dating back to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (34): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 0, SECOND - 6, THIRD - 13, FOURTH - 11, FIFTH - 3, SIXTH - 1...have spent **21** days above, **5** days at and **7** days below .500.

REDS vs CARDINALS: The Reds are 930-1,052 all-time vs the Cardinals, including 2-0 this season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 26-23, including 2-0 this season...**Albert Pujols'** 13 homers here trail only **Lance Berkman's** 20 and **Jason Bay's** 14...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 9/11-9/13, 2007 (3g).

UP NEXT: REDS at DIAMONDBACKS: The Reds are 38-38 all-time vs the Diamondbacks, including 4-2 in 2008...the last 8 seasons are 20-31 vs Ari, including a 16-game losing streak from 5/8/01-8/13/03...**at Chase Field:** Reds are 19-18, including 2-1 in 2008 and 3-3 the last 2 seasons...are 18-9 with the roof closed and 1-9 with the roof open.

Last Pitched: Tue at Fla and in the 7-0 victory threw a career-high 8.0 shutout innings for the second consecutive start (3h, 4bb, 7k, 1hbp, 1wp, 110 pitches, 62 strikes)...allowed only a double to Hermida and 3 singles...stranded 5 baserunners.

Red Hots: Is making his seventh start of the season...in his previous 6 starts the Reds went 4-2 and scored 31 runs (5.17 r/g)...last season didn't allow his 14th earned run until his 14th appearance...in his 6 apps produced 3 quality starts, all in his last 4 starts...in each of his last 2 starts threw a career-high 8.0 innings and didn't allow a run in either.

Zeroes: Hasn't allowed a run in **16 innings**, the longest scoreless streak of his career and the longest by a Reds pitcher so far this season...is the longest scoreless streak by a Reds starter since **Bronson Arroyo** threw 16.0 consecutive scoreless frames from **4/21-5/1, 2006**...reliever **Mike Lincoln** threw 19.0 straight scoreless innings last season.

Volquez To Vander Meer: Allowed 1 hit in 5.0 innings in a 4-3 loss vs Atl on 4/24 and 1 hit in 8.0 innings in a 3-0 win on 4/29 vs Hou...became the first pitcher in the Major Leagues to record consecutive starts of at least **5.0 innings** while allowing no more than **1 hit** since Wsh's **Shawn Hill** did it on each side of a trip to the disabled list in **2007**...became the first Reds pitcher with similar consecutive starts since **Ron Villone** did it in **1999** (1 hit in 7ip on 6/24 at Hou, 1 hit in 8ip on 6/30 vs Ari)...**Villone** was the first Reds pitcher to do it since **Johnny Vander Meer** threw consecutive no-hitters in **June 1938** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's first game and suffered the 3-2 loss to the Netherlands (3ip, 2h, 3r, 0er, 2bb, 3k, 58 pitches)...in the first inning allowed 3 unearned runs on 2 hits, 2 errors, 1 walk and 1 wild pitch.

Spring Training: Went 2-0, 1.19 in his 5 spring training starts and 1 relief appearance...didn't allow a run until his 17th inning.

Volquez' Most Recent Starts: **4/8 vs NYM**, in the Reds' second game of the season suffered the 9-7 loss (4.1ip, 6h, 5r, 4er, 4bb, 4k, 1hr, 107 pitches, 60 strikes)...left trailing, 5-4...allowed Delgado's 2-run HR in the second inning and 3 runs on 3 hits and an error in the fifth...**4/13 at Mil**, in the Reds' first road game of the season and earned the 7-6 victory (5ip, 7h, 6er, 4bb, 4k, 1hbp, 2hr)...left leading, 7-6...in the first inning allowed Fielder's run-scoring groundout...in the second allowed 4 runs on 3 hits and a walk, capped by Hart's 3-run HR, and in the third allowed Hart's leadoff HR...benefitted from the Reds' 6-run third...**4/19 at Hou** and earned the 4-2 victory (6ip, 4h, 1er, 5bb, 7k, 104 pitches, 62 strikes)...left trailing, 1-0, but benefited from the Reds' 3-run seventh inning highlighted by pinch-hitter Micah Owings' 2-run double...allowed only Miguel Tejada's RBI-single with 1 out in the third inning...**4/24 vs Atl**, issued a career-high 7 walks and suffered the 4-3 loss (5ip, 1h, 3er, 7bb, 7k, 1hr, 1hbp, 97 pitches, 53 strikes)...left trailing, 3-2...allowed just 1 hit, a solo HR by Jeff Francoeur with 2 outs in the fifth inning...threw 40 pitches in the fourth frame, in which he walked 5 batters to force in 2 runs...became the first pitcher in the Major Leagues to walk 5 batters in an inning since Wsh's Jason Bergmann walked 5 in the top of the third inning on 8/13/08 vs NYM and the first Reds pitcher to do it since Ryan Dempster walked 6 batters in the bottom of the second inning on 4/30/03 at Col...**4/29 vs Hou**, in the 3-0 victory allowed just 1 hit and no runs in a career-high 8.0 innings (1bb, 6k, 1hbp, 106 pitches, 67 strikes)...left leading, 3-0...allowed only Tejada's 2-out double in the first inning.

Tomorrow at D'Backs: Bronson Arroyo

Last Pitched: Wed vs Mil and suffered the 15-3 loss (1ip+4bf, 7h, 9er, 3bb, 0k, 2hr, 46 pitches, 24 strikes)...tied for the shortest start of his career...left trailing, 9-0...in the first inning allowed 5 runs on 2 walks and 4 hits, including a 3-run HR by Hardy...in the second allowed Braun's grand slam.

Red Hots: Tomorrow at Ari will make his seventh start of the season and the 200th start of his career...in his previous 6 starts the Reds went 4-2 and scored 27 runs (4.50 r/g)...since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 109 starts and ranks third in the National League with 685.1 innings pitched.

Streiking: Posted a **2.96era** in his 4 wins (27.1ip, 9er) and a **24.30era** in his 2 losses (6.2ip, 18er).

Short Cuts: Made the 2 shortest starts of his career (1ip, plus 4 batters) in a 14-1 loss at Tor on 6/24/08 and a 15-3 loss Wed vs Mil...in between those 2 starts went **15-5, 3.76**...his 15 victories in that span was second-most in the Major Leagues (**Roy Halladay**, 17-6, 2.77).

Perfect: Began the season 3-0 for the third time in his career but for the first time won his first 3 starts of a season...won his first 2 starts in 2006, when he started off 5-0...began the 2005 campaign 4-0...was the first Reds pitcher to begin the season in the rotation and win his first 3 starts since **LHP Pete Schourek** did it in 1996 and the first righthander since **Jack Armstrong** won his first 5 starts of 1990.
