TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (0-2) of a 3-game series vs **Timmy O'Driscoll's** Brewers and **Game 3** (0-2) of a 7-game road trip that also includes an upcoming visit to StL's **Busch Stadium** (4g)...is **Game 3** (0-2) of a stretch in which the Reds will play 13-16g on the road...following this trip return to **Great American Ball Park** for a brief 3-game weekend set with the Cubs before hitting the road again for **Wsh** (3g) and **KC** (3g).

CENTRAL CASTING: Today's game is **Game 6** (3-2) of 13 straight vs **National League Central Division** rivals (3-0 vs Hou, **0-2 at Mil**, 4g at StL, 3g vs Chi)...following this 13-game stretch won't play within the division again until **Fourth of July** weekend (3g at StL), a drought that includes 21 consecutive games outside the **Central**.

DOT, DOT, DOT...: The Reds' current **5-game road losing streak** is a season high...**Alex Gonzalez** needs 4rbi to reach **500** in his career.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: RHP **Carlos Fisher** is the only Reds player this season to make his Major League debut...last season 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including RHP **Johnny Cueto**, IF **Paul Janish**, OF **Jay Bruce**, LHP **Daniel Ray Herrera**, RHP **Daryl Thompson**, IF **Adam Rosales**, OF **Chris Dickerson**, RHP **Ramon Ramirez**, C/IF/OF **Wilkin Castillo** and RHP **Josh Roenicke**.

QUALITY CONTROL: Opposing pitchers have produced **27 quality starts**, including 11 straight from **4/14-4/25**... the Reds went **13-14** (.481) when the opposing starter produced a quality appearance...the Reds produced 23 quality starts (**Cueto** 7, **Arroyo** 6, **Harang** 5, **Volquez** 3, **Owings** 2) and went **19-4** in those QS (.826).

ZEROES: The Reds and Giants lead the National League with **6 team shutouts**...the Reds produced their 6 shutouts in the first **26g**, their fastest to 6 blankings since the **1914 staff** threw its sixth shutout in the **25th** game... Cin produced 6 team shutouts all of last season.

GILLETTE CIVIL RIGHTS GAME: At Great American Ball Park on **Sat, 6/20** the Reds and Chicago White Sox will meet in the **Gillette Civil Rights Game**, the first time the contest will be played during the regular season...the weekend's festivities will include a roundtable discussion at the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center's **Harriet Tubman Theater** (Fri, 6/19, 4:00 p.m.), a luncheon at **Duke Energy Center** honoring the 3 winners of Major League Baseball's **Beacon Awards** (Sat, 6/20, 11:30 a.m.) and a **Youth Summit** at **Fountain Square** downtown (Sat, 6/20, 4:00 p.m.)...scheduled to attend the **Sat, 6/20** luncheon are Beacon of Change winner **Muhammad Ali**, Beacon of Hope winner **Bill Cosby** and Beacon of Life winner **Hank Aaron**...Beacon Award presenters include **Sugar Ray Leonard** (Ali), Hall of Fame pitcher **Bob Gibson** (Cosby) and **Commissioner Allan H. (Bud) Selig** (Aaron)...Grammy Award-winning gospel artist **BeBe Winans** will perform at the luncheon and at that night's game... former **President Bill Clinton** will be the keynote speaker at the luncheon...for more information, log on to www.mlb.com/civilrightsgame.

VOTE REDS!: Through **7/2**, fans can help pick the starting lineups of the **2009 All-Star Game** in St. Louis by voting online at www.reds.com...fans attending games at Great American Ball Park can vote using **laptop computers** set up near **Section 114** on Terrace Level...one online voter per game will be selected randomly to receive a **Kroger gift card**...in-stadium balloting ends on **6/28**...Reds players on the ballot include **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **SS Alex Gonzalez**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **OF Willy Taveras** and **OF Jay Bruce**.

ALL-STAR RESOLUTION: State Senator **Gary Cates** (R-Butler County) has introduced a resolution in the Ohio Senate urging Major League Baseball to select the Reds and Great American Ball Park as hosts for the **2013 All-Star Game**...the Reds last hosted the Mid-Summer Classic in **1988** at Riverfront Stadium...the club already is hosting one of MLB's jewel events this summer, when on **6/20** the Reds and White Sox meet here in the **Gillette Civil Rights Game**.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (13-12, .520): The Reds went **3-4-2** in their 9 home series and produced a winning record on 2 of their 4 homestands (2-3, 2-4, 3-2, 6-3)...at **13-12** their record at home is above .500 for the first time this season...in 7 seasons at GABP are **254-257-1**...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...**at 217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (13-10, .565): The Reds went **5-2-1 in their first 8 road series**, including this one...produced winning records on each of their first 2 road trips (7-3, 3-2) and a .500 record on the third trip (3-3)...entering this season and dating back to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (55): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 8, THIRD - 24, FOURTH - 18, FIFTH - 3, SIXTH - 1...at **20-14** and again at **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...have spent **43** days above, **5** days at and **7** days below .500.

REDS vs BREWERS: The Reds are 93-92-1 all-time vs the Brewers, including 3-4 this season and 13-12 the last 2 seasons...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 27-26, including 1-1 this season...**at Miller Park:** Reds are 39-36, including 2-3 this season and 8-5 the last 2 seasons...**last Brewers sweep:** at Cin: 8/30-9/1, 2002 (3g); 8/25-8/28, 2003 (4g)...at Mil: 4/27-4/28, 2004 (2g), 7/3-7/5, 2006 (3g).

UP NEXT: REDS at CARDINALS: The Reds are 930-1,053 all-time vs the Cardinals, including 2-1 this season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 26-24, including 2-1 this season...**Albert Pujols'** 14 homers there trail only **Lance Berkman's** 20 (**Jason Bay** 14)...**at Busch Stadium:** Reds are 8-16, including 1-5 in 2008 and 3-12 there the last 2 years...lost 8 of the last 9g there, including each of the last 5g...**at Old Busch** went 119-139...**last Reds sweep:** at StL: 6/26-6/27, 2001 (2g); 6/5-6/7, 2006 (3g); 5/4-5/7, 1990 (4g)...**last Cardinals sweep:** at StL: 6/28-6/29, 2005 (2g); 9/26-9/28, 2008 (3g); 8/13-8/16, 2001 (4g).

Last Started: Tue vs Hou and received no decision in the 6-4 victory (5ip, 6h, 3er, 4bb, 3k, 99 pitches, 62 strikes)...allowed all 3 runs in the fourth inning on a 2-run double by Rodriguez and a run-scoring single by Maysonet...in the fourth inning took Lee line drive off the right hip.

Red Hots: Is making his ninth start of the season, his third start since an emergency relief appearance on 5/16 at SD...in his previous 8 starts the Reds went 4-4 and scored 39 runs (4.88 r/g)...has 2 quality starts...with an 8-2 win on 4/26 vs Atl snapped his 9-game losing streak dating back to a 9-3 Diamondbacks victory on 5/25/08 at Atl...in 14 apps and 10 starts between victories went **0-9, 8.53** (51.2ip, 49er).

In Relief: Made his only relief appearance of the season in the 16-inning, 6-5 loss at SD on 5/16...threw a career-high 5.2 innings in relief (3h, 1er, 3bb, 5k, 1hr, 81 pitches, 44 strikes)...entered the game in the 11th inning as the Reds’ seventh and final pitcher...retired his first 10 batters until Scott Hairston singled with 1 out in the 14th inning...Nick Hundley homered to end the 5-hour, 14 minute struggle...**in 2 starts since then is 0-1, 9.00 (8ip, 8er).**

At The Plate: In 2007 won the National League’s **Silver Slugger Award** (.333, 4hr, 15rbi)...has **6 career home runs**, including **1 this season** (5/10 vs StL, pinch-hit solo off **Ryan Franklin**)...his 5 career home runs prior to 2009 are listed on **page 149** of the media guide...**overall this season is hitting .296 (8-27, 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 4rbi)**...on 5/7 vs Mil produced the first triple by a Reds pitcher since **Eric Milton** did it on 4/13/06 at Cubs.

As A Pinch Hitter: This season as a pinch hitter is 3-for-7 with a home run (5/10 vs StL, solo off **Ryan Franklin**)...is tied with **Laynce Nix** for the club lead in pinch-hit RBI (3) and ranks second in pinch hits (3)...in the seventh inning of the 4-2 win on 4/19 at Hou snapped the 1-1 tie with a pinch-hit, 2-run double off **Geoff Geary**...was his third career **game-winning RBI** as a pinch hitter (2gwrbi in 2008, 1gwrbi in 2009)...over the last 5 seasons, the only other *pitcher* to produce a pinch-hit, game-winning RBI is Hou’s **Jason Jennings** in the 14th inning of a 12-11 victory at Atl on 8/2/07 (RBI-single off **Oscar Villarreal**)...has **2 career pinch-hit HR**, both of which tied games...in the last 50 years, the only other pitcher to hit a pinch-hit HR that tied a game was **Brooks Kieschnick** of the Brewers, who did it in 2003 and 2004...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Owings’ Most Recent Starts: **4/15 at Mil**, in his Reds pitching debut suffered the 9-3 loss (5+ip, 5h, 4er, 2bb, 2k, 2hr, 89 pitches, 47 strikes)...left with the score tied, 3-3, but was charged with another run scored off Burton...the Brewers added 4 more runs off Burton in that 5-run sixth inning...Owings allowed Fielder’s sac fly in the first and leadoff HR to Cameron in both the second and fourth frames...**4/21 at Chi**, in the Reds’ first game of the season at Wrigley Field and suffered the 7-2 loss (4.2ip, 5h, 5r, 2er, 4bb, 3k, 1hr, 94 pitches, 61 strikes)...left trailing, 4-2, but was charged with another run scored off Lincoln...in the second inning allowed a leadoff HR to Micah Hoffpauir...in the fifth was charged with 3 unearned runs...start of the game was delayed 12 minutes by weather...gametime temperature was 40 degrees with a 15 mile per hour wind blowing left to right...**4/26 vs Atl** and earned the 8-2 victory (7ip, 6h, 1er, 3bb, 6k, 1hr, 102 pitches, 60 strikes)...left leading, 8-1...allowed only a solo HR to David Ross with 1 out in the seventh inning...his first victory since May 2008 snapped a personal 9-game losing streak...**5/2 at Pit** and suffered the 8-6 loss (5.2ip, 9h, 5er, 2bb, 0k, 99 pitches, 64 strikes)...left trailing, 5-3...in the first inning allowed 4 runs on 4 hits, 1 walk and 1 hit batter...**5/7 vs Mil** and earned the 6-5 victory (6ip, 7h, 5r, 4er, 1bb, 4k, 100 pitches, 67 strikes)...left leading, 6-5...allowed 3 runs in the fourth inning and 2 runs in the sixth...his RBI-triple in the bottom of the fourth off Braden Looper gave the Reds a 4-3 lead they would not relinquish...**5/12 at Ari**, in his first career appearance vs his former team earned the 3-1 victory (7+ip, 4h, 1er, 2bb, 4k, 1hbp, 90 pitches, 53 strikes)...took a 4-hit shutout into the eighth inning but then hit with a pitch leadoff batter Ryan Roberts...was charged with that run, which scored on Felipe Lopez’ RBI-double off Arthur Rhodes...**5/21 vs Phi** and suffered the 12-5 loss (3ip, 6h, 5er, 3bb, 3k, 1hr, 71 pitches, 41 strikes)...left trailing, 5-0...allowed 1 run in the first inning, 3 runs in the second and a solo HR to Dobbs in the third.

Tomorrow at StL: Edinson Volquez

Last Pitched: On 5/16 at SD and was the victim of a blown save in the 16-inning, 6-5 loss (5.2ip, 4h, 2er, 3bb, 2k, 1hr, 93 pitches, 52 strikes)...left the game with mild spasms in his mid-back, an injury that led to a stint on the disabled list...left leading, 5-2, but the Padres scored a run in the seventh off Lincoln and solo runs in the eighth off Rhodes and Weathers to tie it...Nick Hundley ended it with a homer off Micah Owings, who threw a career-high 5.2 innings in relief.

Red Hots: Tomorrow at StL will be reinstated from the 15-day disabled list to make his ninth start of the season, his first since 5/16...since 5/22 had been on the DL with back spasms...in his previous 8 starts the Reds went 4-4 and scored 43 runs (5.38 r/g)...opponents are hitting just .185, best mark in the National League...produced 3 quality starts.

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic’s first game and suffered the 3-2 loss to the Netherlands (3ip, 2h, 3r, 0er, 2bb, 3k, 58 pitches)...in the first inning allowed 3 unearned runs on 2 hits, 2 errors, 1 walk and 1 wild pitch.
