TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** (0-0) of a 3-game series vs **Jonathan Hoffman's** Mets and **Game 5** (1-3) of a 7-game road trip that also included a **1-3** visit **at Phi**...is the Reds' first trip to Flushing's **Citi Field** and their final series before the **All-Star** break...on Thursday at **Great American Ball Park** will open the second half of the season with an abbreviated 4-game homestand vs the **Brewers** before hitting the road again for a 7-day, 6-game trip to **LAD** (3g) and **Chi** (off day, 3g).

DOT, DOT, DOT....: At **41-43** the Reds are a season-high **2g below .500** for the fifth time (0-2, 1-3, 34-36, 35-37)...also for the fifth time are facing a season-high **4.5-game deficit**...**Joey Votto** has a career-high **12-game hitting streak** (18-50, .360, 1hr, 5rbi), the longest active streak on the team...**Ryan Hanigan** leads all National League rookie batters in on-base percentage (.422)...**Ramon Hernandez** needs 1 run scored to reach **500** in his career.

INJURY PLAGUED: The Reds are **5-5** in the 10 games that included the projected Opening Day lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion**, **SS Alex Gonzalez**, **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** in LF.

M*A*S*H: From the **Opening Day** roster the Reds are missing starting **SS Alex Gonzalez** (right elbow surgery, out 4-5 weeks), starting **RHP Edinson Volquez** (right elbow) and reliever **RHP Mike Lincoln** (bulging disc in his neck)...all are on the disabled list, along with **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (season-ending left shoulder surgery) and **IF Danny Richar** (torn labrum, left shoulder)...**Gonzalez** today in Cincinnati was scheduled to resume hitting off a tee and throwing...**Volquez** tomorrow in Cincinnati is scheduled to long toss off flat ground...several other players missed action because of various ailments, including **1B Joey Votto** (stress), **2B Brandon Phillips** (hairline fracture, right thumb), **OF Willy Taveras** (tight right hamstring), **IF/OF Jerry Hairston Jr.** (flu) and **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (chip fracture, left wrist).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: RHP **Carlos Fisher**, LHP **Matt Maloney**, IF **Drew Sutton** and RHP **Robert Manuel** made their Major League debuts this season...in **2008**, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: RHP **Johnny Cueto**, IF **Paul Janish**, OF **Jay Bruce**, LHP **Daniel Ray Herrera**, RHP **Daryl Thompson**, IF **Adam Rosales**, OF **Chris Dickerson**, RHP **Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and RHP **Josh Roenicke**.

ALL-STAR AMONG US: Sherri J. Friedman of **Amberley Village** is the Reds' nominee for *PEOPLE Magazine's All-Stars Among Us* campaign, which recognizes an individual from each Major League Baseball team who serves his or her community in extraordinary ways...she will be honored on the field during ceremonies prior to the **All-Star Game** in St. Louis...**Friedman** was elected in online voting for her community service through **Most Valuable Kids of Greater Cincinnati**, an organization that distributes unused tickets to underserved children...she has helped 22,000 kids experience local sporting and entertainment events, including more than 4,800 Reds games.

ALL-STAR RESOLUTION: State Senator **Gary Cates** (R-Butler County) has introduced a resolution in the Ohio Senate urging Major League Baseball to select the Reds and Great American Ball Park as hosts for the **2013 All-Star Game**...the Reds last hosted the Mid-Summer Classic in **1988** at Riverfront Stadium...in June the club hosted one of the summer's MLB jewel events, the **Gillette Civil Rights Game**.

XM ALL-STAR FUTURES GAME: Class AA Carolina **OF Chris Heisey** (U.S. Team) and Class A Dayton **RHP Juan Carlos Sulbaran** (World Team) have been selected to participate in Major League Baseball's **XM II-Star Futures Game** on Sunday, 7/12 at **Busch Stadium** in St. Louis...**Futures Game** alumni include Reds players **Homer Bailey** (2006), **Jay Bruce** (2007), **Francisco Cordero** (1999), **Edwin Encarnacion** (2003-05), **Brandon Phillips** (2002), **Edinson Volquez** (2005) and **Joey Votto** (2006-07)...**Cordero** and **Volquez** are the only 2 Reds players to appear in both the **Futures Game** and the **All-Star Game**...**Cordero** was an All-Star in 2004 and 2007, **Volquez** was an All-Star last year.

MINOR LEAGUE PLAYERS OF THE MONTH: Class AA Carolina **IF Zack Cozart** and LHP **Travis Wood** have been named the organization's **Minor League Players of the Month**...in 27g **Cozart** hit .319 with 6 doubles, 6hr, 12rbi and 4sb...in 6 starts **Wood** went 4-0, 1.13 with 1 shutout (40ip, 24h, 6bb, 39k).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (20-20 .500): The Reds went **5-7-2** in their **14 home series** and produced a winning record on just 2 of their 7 homestands (2-3, 2-4, 3-2, 6-3, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **261-265-1**...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...**at 217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (21-23, .477): The Reds are 1-3 on this road trip...went **7-5-2** in their **previous 14 road series**...produced the following records on their previous road trips: 7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4 and 3-3...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (95): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 34, FIFTH - 4, SIXTH - 1...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...5 times were a season-high **2g under .500** (0-2, 1-3, 34-36, 35-37, 41-43)...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **16** days below .500.

Wins Beginning 6/29/08

In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, **Bronson Arroyo** made the shortest start of his career and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer (1+ip, 11h, 10er)...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29/08. **Arroyo** has 19 wins, tied for second-most in the Major Leagues since then:

Unlucky June 24: On 6/24 each of the last 2 seasons started against the Blue Jays at Tor's Rogers Centre...in those 2 starts, a 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 and an 8-2 loss on 6/24/09, allowed 17 runs in 4.2 innings...in the **2008 loss** became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs while retiring 3 batters or fewer...in the **2009 loss** allowed 5 runs in the first inning on homers by Hill (2-run), Wells (solo) and Lind (2-run)...in the **calendar year between those 2 starts went 19-9, 4.19**...the 19 wins were the second-most in the Major Leagues in that 1-year span (Tor's **Roy Halladay**, 22-6, 2.49).

Perfect: Began the season 3-0 for the third time in his career but for the first time won his first 3 starts of a season...won his first 2 starts in 2006, when he started off 5-0...began the 2005 campaign 4-0...was the first Reds pitcher to begin the season in the rotation and win his first 3 starts since **LHP Pete Schourek** did it in 1996 and the first righthander since **Jack Armstrong** won his first 5 starts of 1990.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Mon at Phi, in the historic 22-1 loss allowed a career-high 9 runs in the shortest start of his career (0.2p, 5h, 9er, 3bb, 1k, 1hbp, 2hr, 49 pitches, 25 strikes)...left trailing, 7-0, and was charged with 2 more runs scored on Utley's 3-run HR off Herrera...allowed 2-run HR to both Victorino and Dobbs, a 2-run double to Hamels and an RBI double to Rollins...the Phillies tied a club record with 10 first-inning runs...was the most lopsided loss in franchise history.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow will make his 18th start of the season, his third career appearance vs the Mets...in his 17 starts the Reds went 10-7 and scored 68 runs (4 r/g)...in 9 of his 17 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 14 of his 17 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Quality: Leads the team with 11 quality starts...his 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14) are the longest stretches of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season.

Road Warrior...Tomorrow will make his 11th start on the road...for the season is **2-2, 3.43** in 7 starts at home (44.2ip, 17er) and **6-3, 3.47** in 10 starts on the road (59.2ip, 23er).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).

Last Pitched: Sun vs StL and suffered the 10-1 loss (5+ip, 11h, 8r, 5er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 89 pitches, 58 strikes)...left trailing, 8-0....allowed 2 runs in the first inning, 2 in the fourth and 4 in the fifth.

Red Hots: Is making his 18th start of the season, his second of the year vs the Mets...in his previous 17 starts the Reds went 8-9 and scored 68 runs (4 r/g)...has 8 quality starts but none in his last 3 apps...hasn't gone more than 3 apps without producing a quality start since he began the **2008 season** with 5 straight non-quality starts...since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 120 starts and ranks third in the National League with 754.1 innings pitched (**Aaron Harang** 761.1ip, **Roy Oswalt** 754.2ip).

In The Big Inning: Allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 9 of his 17 starts, including 7 of his last 9 starts...has posted a 10.59era in the first inning (17ip, 20er) and a 4.92era after the first frame (86ip, 47er).
