Bruce Update

Jay Bruce left Sat's game at NYM in the bottom of the first inning with a fractured right wrist suffered while diving for David Wright's single to right field...an MRI the next day showed no damage to the tendons or ligaments...he is expected to miss 6-8 weeks.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is the first game of the Second Half and Game 1 of an abbreviated 4-game homestand, all vs Mike Vassallo's Brewers...following this series the Reds hit the road for a 7-day, 6-game trip to LAD (3g) and Chi (off day, 3g)...the Reds will finish the season with 41g at Great American Ball Park and 34g on the road.

HAIRSTON'S HEROES: Tonight Jerry Hairston Jr. is hosting 30 fans in moon deck Section 143 as part of his Hairston's Heroes program targeting underprivileged children...the kids will receive an autographed t-shirt, while the entire group receives \$10 in concession vouchers and in-stadium welcomes via the public address announcer and scoreboard.

WORLD 7, USA 5: Sunday's All-Star XM Futures Game in St. Louis was shortened by rain to 7 innings...play was halted in the middle of the first inning for 4 hours and 9 minutes...Class AAA Louisville's OF Chris Heisey started in LF and batted sixth for Team USA...he finished 0-for-2....Class A Dayton's RHP J.C. Sulbaran pitched a scoreless seventh inning to earn the save (1ip, 2bb)...additional Futures Game alumni include Reds players Homer Bailey (2006), Jay Bruce (2007), Francisco Cordero (1999), Edwin Encarnacion (2003-05), Brandon Phillips (2002), Edinson Volquez (2005) and Joey Votto (2006-07)...Cordero and Volquez are the only 2 Reds players to appear in both the Futures Game and the All-Star Game ... Cordero was an All-Star in 2004 and 2007, Volquez was an All-Star

JET LAG: The Reds' upcoming road trip includes their second visit of the 2009 season to the West Coast (3g at LAD, off day, 3g at Chi)...in May were swept by the **Padres** in a 3-game series at SD's **PETCO Park**..over the last 4 seasons the Reds are 11-28 (.282) on the West Coast (0-9 at LAD, 4-9 at SD, 5-6 at SF, 1-2 at Oak, 1-2 at Sea)...that 11-28 record includes an active 9-game losing streak at Dodger Stadium, where the Reds haven't won since their final appearance of 2005 (a 6-1 victory by Brandon Claussen on 7/28/05)...were swept in all three 3-game series there since then.

INJURY PLAGUED: Because of injuries, the Reds have played just 10g (5-5) that included the projected Opening Day lineup of C Ramon Hernandez, 1B Joey Votto, 2B Brandon Phillips, 3B Edwin Encarnacion, SS Alex Gonzalez, RF Jay Bruce, CF Willy Taveras and either Chris Dickerson or Jerry Hairston Jr. in LF.

<u>M*A*S*H</u>: From the **Opening Day roster** the Reds are missing starting **SS Alex Gonzalez** (right elbow surgery, out 4-5 weeks), RF Jay Bruce (broken right wrist), starting RHP Edinson Volquez (right elbow) and reliever RHP Mike Lincoln (bulging disc in his neck)...all are on the disabled list, along with C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo (season-ending left shoulder surgery) and IF Danny Richar (torn labrum, left shoulder)...Gonzalez and Volquez were scheduled to resume their workouts today...several other players missed action because of various ailments, including 1B Joey Votto (stress), 2B Brandon Phillips (hairline fracture, right thumb), OF Willy Taveras (tight right hamstring), IF/OF Jerry Hairston Jr. (flu) and 3B Edwin Encarnacion (chip fracture, left wrist).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: RHP Carlos Fisher, LHP Matt Maloney, IF Drew Sutton and RHP Robert Manuel made their Major League debuts this season...in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: RHP Johnny Cueto, IF Paul Janish, OF Jay Bruce, LHP Daniel Ray Herrera, RHP Daryl Thompson, IF Adam Rosales, OF Chris Dickerson, RHP Ramon Ramirez, C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo and RHP Josh Roenicke.

ALL-STAR AMONG US: Sherri J. Friedman of Amberley Village was the Reds' nominee for PEOPLE Magazine's All-Stars Among Us campaign, which recognizes an individual from each Major League Baseball team who serves his or her community in extraordinary ways...she was honored on the field during ceremonies prior to the All-Star Game in St. Louis...Friedman was elected in online voting for her community service through Most Valuable Kids of Greater Cincinnati, an organization that distributes unused tickets to underserved children...she has helped 22,000 kids experience local sporting and entertainment events, including more than 4,800 Reds games.

ALL-STAR RESOLUTION: State Senator Gary Cates (R-Butler County) has introduced a resolution in the Ohio Senate urging Major League Baseball to select the Reds and Great American Ball Park as hosts for the 2013 All-Star Game...the Reds last hosted the Mid-Summer Classic in 1988 at Riverfront Stadium...in June the club hosted one of the summer's MLB jewel events, the Gillette Civil Rights Game.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (20-20 .500): The Reds went 5-7-2 in their previous 14 home series... produced a winning record on just 2 of their 7 homestands (2-3, 2-4, 3-2, 6-3, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3)...in 7 seasons at GABP are 261-265-1...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...at 217-217-1 the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since 6/26/04 (57-57)...also reached .500 at 219-219-1.

REDS ON THE ROAD (22-25, .468): The Reds went 7-6-2 in their 15 road series...produced a winning or .500 record on 4 of their previous 7 road trips (7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4, 3-3, 2-5)...entering this season and dating to 2006, the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips.

IN THE STANDINGS (101): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 9, SIXTH - 1...at 20-14 and 26-20 were a season-high 6g over .500...prior to this season hadn't been 6g over .500 since 2006, when they reached a season-high 12g over .500 at 36-24...at 42-45 are a season-high 3g under .500...have spent 64 days above, 15 days at and 22 days below .500.

REDS vs BREWERS: The Reds are 93-93-1 all-time vs the Brewers, including 3-5 this season and 13-13 the last 2 seasons...<u>at <mark>Great American Ball Park</mark>:</u> Reds are 27-26, including 1-1 this season...<u>at Miller Park</u>: Reds are 39-37, including 2-4 this season and 8-6 the last 2 seasons... last Reds sweep: at Cin: 7/19-7/20, 2004 (2g); 5/6-5/8, 2002 (3g)...at Mil: 6/5-6/6, 2001 (2g); 7/11-7/13, 2003 (3g); 5/13-5/16, 2002 (4g)...last Brewers sweep: at Cin: 8/30-9/1, 2002 (3g); 8/25-8/28, 2003 (4g)...at Mil: 4/27-4/28, 2004 (2g), 5/29-5/31, 2009 (3g).

Last Pitched: On 7/8 at Phi, recorded a career-high 6 strikeouts but received no decision in the 3-2 loss (6ip, 7h, 2er, 0bb, 6k, 1hr, 95 pitches, 63 strikes)...left with the score tied, 2-2...allowed only an RBI-single to Howard in the fourth inning and a 2-out, solo HR to Werth in the sixth...Phillies won it in the ninth on Victorino's game-ending single off Weathers.

Red Hots: Is making his fifth start of the season, his fourth since his second promotion...in 3 starts since he rejoined the staff on 6/27 is 1-0, 3.44 (18.1ip, 7er)...in his 4 starts overall the Reds went 1-3 and scored 19 runs (4.75 r/g)...once was the victim of a blown save...has walked 15 batters. 7 scored.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...in that 5/23 start vs the Indians became only the sixth different pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season, in the club's 42nd game...was the longest such streak to begin a season since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994** campaign.

At Louisville: In 14 apps for the Bats produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps (5-1, 1.07, 50.1ip, 47h, 6er, 12bb, 45k)... in his first start of the season allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era) and in his last 13 starts posted a 2.03era (84.1ip, 19er)...following his most recent start for the Bats ranked among the International League leaders in innings pitched (89.2, 1st), wins (8, 2nd), strikeouts (82, 2nd) and ERA (2.71, 10th)...for the Bats, in 6 starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81.

IL Pitcher of the Week: Twice this season was named the International League's Pitcher of the Week...in 2 starts the week of 4/20-4/26 went 2-0, 2.92 with 18 strikeouts in 12.1 innings (10h, 6bb)...in the 10-3 win at Toledo on 4/26, over 6.1 innings he struck out a career-high 15 batters to tie the Louisville single-game record...in 2 starts from 6/1-6/7 went 2-0 without allowing a run (14.2ip, 11h, 2bb, 14k).

Bailey's Most Recent Starts: 5/23 vs Cle, in his only appearance of the season received no decision in the 7-6 loss (4.1ip, 3h, 6er, 6bb, 3k, 1hr, 95 pitches, 53 strikes)...left leading, 6-4, with the bases loaded and 1 out but was charged with 2 more runs scored off Burton...the 6 runs allowed tied his career high and the 6 walks were a new career high...walked the leadoff batter in the first, second and fifth innings...in the second allowed 4 runs on a 2-run HR to De Rosa and a 2-out, 2-run single to Cabrera...was optioned to Louisville the next day...6/27 at Cle, in his second start of the season earned the 7-3 victory (5ip, 3h, 3er, 7bb, 2k, 106 pitches, 54 strikes)...left leading, 6-3...for the second straight start established a career-high for walks...2 batters who walked scored...after the Reds scored 4 runs in the top of the second allowed a run scoring-GIDP in the bottom of the inning...with 2 outs in the fourth allowed Sizemore's 2-run single...7/3 vs StL and was the victim of a blown save in the 7-4 loss (7.1ip, 3h, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hbp, 104 pitches, 70 strikes)...left leading, 3-0, but was charged with 2 of the runs that scored on Pujols' grand slam off Weathers...Pujols drove in 5 of the Cardinals' 7 runs.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: Bronson Arroyo

Last Pitched: On 7/10 at NYM, in the Reds' first game at new Citi Field threw a 4-hitter in the 3-0 win (9ip, 0bb, 5k, 115 pitches, 75 strikes)...didn't allow a runner to reach second base...was his eighth career complete game and his second career shutout.

Red Hots: Tomorrow will make his 19th start of the season, his third of the year vs the Brewers...with 9 victories is 2 shy of the National League leaders...in his previous 18 starts the Reds went 9-9 and scored 71 runs (3.94 r/g)...has 9 quality starts...since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 121 starts and ranks second in the National League with 763.1 innings pitched (Aaron Harang 764.1ip).

In The Big Inning: Allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 9 of his 18 starts, including 7 of his last 10 starts...has posted a 10.00era in the first inning (18ip, 20er) and a 4.50era after the first frame (94ip, 47er).
