Reds pitchers haven't allowed a run at Great American Ball Park in the last 20 innings, including consecutive complete game shutouts by RHP Justin Lehr (8/5 vs Chi, 4-0 win) and RHP Bronson Arroyo (last night vs Wsh, 7-0 win)... according to Elias Sports Bureau, the Reds have produced consecutive complete game shutouts at home for the first time since 1996, when Roger Salkeld beat the Expos, 7-0, on 6/16 and Mark Portugal beat the Phillis, 7-0, on 6/24... the current 20-inning scoreless streak here is the longest by the Reds' staff at home since the 25-inning scoreless streak that encompassed the complete games by Salkeld and Portugal (6/15-6/25, 1996).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 4-game series vs **Mike Gazda's** Nationals and **Game 2** (1-0) of a 7-game homestand that includes a day off Monday followed by a mid-week visit from the **Giants** (3g)...following this homestand the Reds hit the road again for a 6-game trip to **Pit** (3g) and **Mil** (off day, 3g)...including tonight's game will finish the 2009 campaign with 26g at **Great American Ball Park** and 22g on the road.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Reds have won 5 of their last 8g following a 1-14 stretch...since the All-Star break the Reds are **8-19** and have lost **8.0g** in the NL Central standings...at **44-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

MEDICAL UPDATES: RHP Johnny Cueto left Mon's start at StL after 2.0 innings with a tight left hip flexor but isn't expected to miss tomorrow's start vs the Nationals...RHP Homer Bailey left Wed's game at StL in the first inning after he was hit on the arch of his left foot by an Albert Pujols line drive...x-rays were negative...he is not expected to miss Tue's start vs the Giants...RHP Micah Owings (DL, tight right shoulder) on Mon at Lehigh Valley made a rehab start for Louisville (4.2ip, 5h, 1er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 79 pitches, 52 strikes)...he is scheduled to make another rehab start for the Bats tomorrow...3B Scott Rolen (DL, concussion) will begin light weight lifting and cardiovascular excercises once his headaches subside.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed 100 first inning runs, the most in the Major Leagues (SD 78, Mil/Hou 77) and have been outscored in the opening frame, 100-61...have allowed first-inning runs in 50 of their 114g this season.

BATTING LEADER: **Joey Votto** is hitting .315 but missed 21g while on the disabled list and thus remains 12 plate apps shy of qualifying for the National League leaders...even with an 0-for-12, **Votto** would be hitting .303.

HAL McCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he has worked for the *DDN* for 49 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown... the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

<u>M*A*S*H</u>: The Reds currently have **8 players on the disabled list**, including 5 players from their **Opening Day** roster: **C Ramon Hernandez** (left knee surgery), **RF Jay Bruce** (broken right wrist), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (right elbow surgery), **RHP Micah Owings** (tight right shoulder) and **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement surgery)... also on the DL are **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (season-ending left shoulder surgery), **IF Danny Richar** (season-ending left shoulder surgery) and **3B Scott Rolen** (concussion)...each member of the **Opening Day** starting infield missed extended time because of various ailments, including **SS Alex Gonzalez** (disabled following right elbow surgery), **1B Joey Votto** (disabled with stress/anxiety), **2B Brandon Phillips** (hairline fracture, right thumb) and since-traded **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (disabled with a chip fracture in his left wrist).

<u>OPENING DAY LINEUP</u>: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion**, **SS Alex Gonzalez**, **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **93 different lineups** in 114g.

<u>SURGERIES</u>: Six Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder) and **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow)...**Castillo**, **Richar** and **Volquez** will not play again the rest of the season.

<u>SIGNATURE SUNDAY</u>: One hour after **Sunday's** 1:10 p.m. game vs Wsh, the entire Reds team will host in the FOX Sports Ohio Champions Club **Signature Sunday** to benefit the Reds Community Fund...fans can chose from the \$250 **Baseball** package (includes a team-signed baseball), \$500 **Bat** package (team-signed bat) or \$750 **Jersey** package (team-signed jersey)...all packages include 2 tickets to that afternoon's game against the Nationals...fans can sign up online at <u>reds.com/signature</u> or by calling (513) 765-7234.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (25-30 .455): The Reds are 1-0 on this homestand (1-0 vs Wsh)...went **5-10-3 in their previous 18 home series**...produced a winning record on 2 of their previous 9 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3,** 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **266-275-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

REDS ON THE ROAD (25-34, .424): The Reds have dropped 11 of their last 14 road games and 13 of their last 17 road games...went 8-9-2 in their 19 road series...produced a winning or .500 record on 5 of their 9 road trips (7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4, 3-3, 2-5, 0-6, 3-3).

IN THE STANDINGS (130): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 38, SIXTH - 1...at 20-14 and 26-20 were a season-high 6g over .500...prior to this season hadn't been 6g over .500 since 2006, when they reached a season-high 12g over .500 at 36-24...on 8/10 and 8/12 were a season-high 13.5g out of first place...at 45-61 were a season high 16g under .500...have spent 64 days above, 15 days at and 51 days below .500.

REDS vs NATIONALS: The Reds are 227-190 all-time vs the franchise formerly known as the Montreal Expos, including 3-1 this season...at Great American Ball Park: Reds are 14-7 vs the franchise, including 1-0 this season and 12-4 vs the Nationals...Cin has won the last 5g here vs Wsh.

Last Started: Sun at SF and snapped his career-high 9-game losing streak with a 5-2 victory (7+ip, 7h, 2er, 2bb, 7k, 0hr, 104 pitches, 70 strikes)...left leading, 5-1, but was charged with another run on Sandoval's GIDP off Masset...allowed only Sandoval's run-scoring GIDP in the sixth inning... was his first win since 5/25.

Red Hots: Is making his 25th start of the season...with 12 quality starts is tied with Johnny Cueto for second on the staff to Bronson Arroyo (14qs)...in his previous 24 starts the Reds went 10-14 and scored 87 runs (3.63 r/g)...in his 24 starts Reds batters hit .239 (192-805)...on 6/4 at StL suffered the 3-1 loss in a game in which Harang and Chris Carpenter each threw a complete game.

The Streak: In 13 starts from 5/30-8/3 went 0-9, 5.49...snapped that career-high 9-game losing streak with a 5-2 win on 8/9 at SF...the 9-game skid tied Bal's Jason Berken for the longest in the Major Leagues this season...was the longest by a Reds pitcher in a single season since Tom Hume's 9-game losing streak from 4/19-7/4, 1978.

<u>Staff Ace</u>: Since he was acquired from the Athletics at the **2003 trading deadline** is the Reds' leader in most statistical pitching categories, including starts (191), wins (69), innings pitched (1217.1) and strikeouts (1,033)...since the beginning of the **2006 season** ranks second in the National League with **798.2** innings pitched (**Bronson Arroyo** 1st, 805ip)... in 2005 and 2007 won the BBWAA's Johnny Vander Meer Award as the club's Most Outstanding Pitcher.

Community Affairs: Is one of the club's more active members of the local community...for the third straight season, as part of his Aaron's Aces ticket program is hosting at all Sunday home games children of military personnel serving in the War On Terrorism...along with wife Jen donated \$55,000 to the Miracle League of Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky and on 5/9 attended the dedication of that field at the Durham Recreation Complex in Western Hills...for his community service has been the club's nominee for the Robert Clemente Award (2007, 2009), Branch Rickey Award (2007) and Marvin Miller Man of the Year Award (2007, 2008, 2009).

Harang vs Nationals: On 5/25/05 at Great American Ball Park was scheduled to pitch against the Nats but was scratched because of the flu...on 8/2/07 was scheduled to face Wsh at RFK Stadium but was scratched with a sore back...on 7/5/08 was scheduled to face Wsh at GABP but was scratched with stiffness in his right forearm.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Mon at StL and left the 4-1 loss after the second inning with a tight left hip flexor (2ip, 1h, 1er, 1bb, 2k, 39 pitches, 23 strikes)...in the first inning allowed a sac fly to Holliday.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow will make his 24th start of the season...in his 23 starts the Reds went 11-12 and scored 84 runs (3.65 r/g)...in 9 of his 23 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 16 of his 23 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Quality: With 12 quality starts is tied with **Aaron Harang** for second on the staff behind **Bronson Arroyo** (14qs)...his 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14) are the longest stretches of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20).

Streaking: Through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69...in 7 starts since then is 0-5, 9.49 (30.1ip, 32er)...the 5-game losing streak is the longest of his young career...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went 4-0, 1.25 (36ip, 5er)...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since Tim Belcher had a 4-game run from 5/27-6/13, 1992 (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).
