Today's Transactions

CF Willy Taveras today went on the 15-day disabled list with a strained right quadriceps suffered on a bunt attempt in the seventh inning of last night's game...he will be replaced on the roster by **OF Drew Stubbs** (#6), who when he plays will be making his Major League debut...there was no need for a corresponding 40-man roster move...**Stubbs** has spent the season at Louisville, where he was an International League mid-season All-Star and IL Batter of the Week from 5/4-5/10 (.423, 5 2b, 6sb)...he leads the International League with 46 stolen bases in 54 attempts and made 106 starts for the Bats, including 97 in CF, 5 in LF and 4 in RF (.268, 25 2b, 2 3b, 3hr, 39rbi)...**Stubbs** was the Reds' first-round pick (8th overall) in the 2006 first-year player draft.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Jim Moorehead's** Giants and **Game 6** (1-4) of a 7-game homestand that included a **1-3** series the Nationals...following this series the Reds hit the road again for a 6-game trip to **Pit** (3g) and **Mil** (off day, 3g)...including tonight's game will finish the 2009 campaign with 22g at **Great American Ball Park** and 22g on the road.

DOT, DOT, DOT: At **50-68** the Reds are **18g under .500** and face a **16.5-game deficit**, both season highs...since the All-Star break are **8-23** and have lost **11.5g** in the NL Central standings...at **44-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings...**Reds pitchers** have a season high 4-game hitting streak (4-7, .571, 2rbi).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: When he plays, **OF Drew Stubbs** will become the sixth Reds player to make his Major League debuts this season, joining **RHP Carlos Fisher, LHP Matt Maloney, IF Drew Sutton, RHP Robert Manuel** and **C Craig Tatum**...in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto, IF Paul Janish, OF Jay Bruce, LHP Daniel Ray Herrera, RHP Daryl Thompson, IF Adam Rosales, OF Chris Dickerson, RHP Ramon Ramirez, C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

MEDICAL UPDATES: **2B Brandon Phillips** left Sat night's game after he was hit on the left wrist by a **J.D. Martin** pitch...x-rays were negative...he did not play Sun but played all 10 innings last night...**RHP Micah Owings** (DL, tight right shoulder) yesterday threw a 55-pitch bullpen without complaint...on Sat he made his second rehab start for Louisville and earned the 4-1 win vs Toledo (5.2ip, 3h, 0r, 5bb, 3k, 93 pitches, 52 strikes)...he made his first rehab start on 8/10 at Lehigh Valley (4.2ip, 5h, 1er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 79 pitches, 52 strikes)...**3B Scott Rolen** (DL, concussion) has begun workouts.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **100 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues (Hou 87, SD 82, Bal 80), and have been outscored in the opening frame, **100-61**...allowed first-inning runs in 50 of their 118g this season.

BATTING LEADER: **Joey Votto** is hitting .316 but missed 21g while on the disabled list and remains 6 plate apps shy of qualifying for the National League leaders...even with an 0-for-6, **Votto** would be hitting .311.

M*A*S*H: The Reds currently have **8 players on the disabled list**, including 5 players from their **Opening Day** roster: **C Ramon Hernandez** (left knee surgery), **RF Jay Bruce** (broken right wrist), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (right elbow surgery), **RHP Micah Owings** (tight right shoulder) and **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement surgery)...also on the DL are **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (season-ending left shoulder surgery), **IF Danny Richar** (season-ending left shoulder surgery) and **3B Scott Rolen** (concussion)...each member of the **Opening Day** starting infield missed extended time because of various ailments, including since-traded **SS Alex Gonzalez** (disabled following right elbow surgery), **1B Joey Votto** (disabled with stress/anxiety), **2B Brandon Phillips** (hairline fracture, right thumb) and since-traded **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (disabled with a chip fracture in his left wrist).

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez, 1B Joey Votto, 2B Brandon Phillips, 3B Edwin Encarnacion, SS Alex Gonzalez, RF Jay Bruce, CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **96 different lineups** in 117g.

SURGERIES: Six Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder) and **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow)...**Castillo, Richar** and **Volquez** will not play again the rest of the season.

REDS HALL OF FAME: Through September 2, Reds fans can vote for the **Reds Hall of Fame Class of 2010** online at reds.com/HOF or via paper ballot that can be found at the **Hall of Fame and Museum, the Reds Community Corner** at **Section 120** in Great American Ball Park or at participating **Skyline Chili** and **Montgomery Inn** locations...the candidates include **Bret Boone, Jeff Brantley, Norm Charlton, John Franco, Danny Graves, Kevin Mitchell, Hal Morris, Paul O'Neill, Chris Sabo** and **Scott Sullivan**.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (25-34 .424): The Reds are 1-4 on this homestand (0-1 vs SF, 1-3 vs Wsh)...went **5-11-3 in their previous 19 home series**...including this one have produced a winning record on 2 of their 10 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 1-4**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **266-279-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

IN THE STANDINGS (135): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 43, SIXTH - 1**...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **50-68** today the Reds are **18g under .500** and face a **16.5-game deficit**, both season highs...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **56** days below .500.

REDS vs GIANTS: Reds are 912-1,119 all-time vs the Giants franchise, including 2-2 this season and 5-1 in 2008...won 7 of the last 9g vs SF...at **Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 10-10, including 0-1 this season and 3-0 last season...prior to last night's loss Cin won the previous 4g vs SF here...**last Giants sweep:** at Cin: 5/13-5/14, 1997 (2g); 4/5-4/7, 1999 (3g); 5/12-5/15, 1983 (4g)...at SF: 9/18-9/19, 1991 (2g); 5/3-5/5, 2002 (3g); 7/26-7/29, 1990 (4g).

IF Paul Janish pitched in the ninth inning of the 15-3 loss vs Mil on 5/6 (1ip, 5h, 5er, 0bb, 2k, Fielder 2-run HR) and in the eighth inning of the historic 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (1ip, 4h, 6er, 2bb, 1k, Werth grand slam)...he became the first Reds position player to pitch since **Lenny Harris** on 6/1/98 at SF and the first Reds position player to pitch more than once in a season since **OF Mel Queen** took the mound 7 times during the second half of the 1966 campaign.

Reds Pitchers: Rank 11th in the National League with a 4.42 staff ERA...on the homestand are **1-4, 4.89, (46ip, 25er, 1cg)**...in the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 22 runs in a game for the first time since a 22-6 loss at Chi on **8/13/37**...the Reds already have 11 team shutouts, their highest total since they had 11sho in 1999... haven't had more than 11 shutouts since 1990, when they threw 12...had 6 shutouts all of last year.s

Reds Starters: Rank 13th in the National League with a 4.88 rotation ERA...on the homestand are **1-2, 5.04 (30.1ip, 17er, 1cg)**...have produced 55 quality starts (**Arroyo 14, Harang 13, Cueto 12, Owings 6, Volquez 3, Bailey 3, Lehr 3, Maloney 1**)...the Reds went 38-17 in those quality starts (.691)...from **6/3-6/10** produced a season-high **7 consecutive quality starts**, their best stretch since they threw 8 consecutive QS from **8/6-8/14, 2005**...through the first 41g of the season used just 5 starting pitchers, their longest such streak to begin a year since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994 campaign**...on 5/23 vs Cle, in the club's 42nd game, **RHP Homer Bailey** became the Reds' sixth starting pitcher...**Aaron Harang** threw a 3-hitter in the 2-0 win vs Pit in the club's fifth game of the season...was the earliest complete game by a Reds pitcher since **Pete Harnisch** beat the Cardinals, 3-0 in Busch Stadium, in the **fourth** contest of the **1999** campaign.

Reds Relievers: Rank third in the National League with a 3.63 bullpen ERA (SF 3.33, LAD 3.46)...on the homestand are **0-2, 4.60 (15.2ip, 8er)**...in 7.1 innings during the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 13r/12er, the bullpen's highest single-game totals since identical totals in a 16-3 loss on **6/1/98 at SF**...bullpen's ERA excluding that game drops from 3.63 to 3.42 (360.1ip, 137er)...didn't blow a save until the club's 36th game, a 6-5 loss in 16 innings on 5/16 at SD...for the second straight season the Reds' bullpen was the last in the Major Leagues to suffer a blown save...in 2008 didn't blow a save until the 41st game (5/14)...over the last 2 seasons **Cordero** has recorded **59** of the bullpen's **60** saves (34sv in 2008, 25sv in 2009)...**David Weathers** has the club's only other save over the last 2 seasons (6/10/09 at Wsh).

51 JARED BURTON, rhp **36g, 0-0-0, 5.36**
Has posted a 3.18era in 5 apps since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list (5.2ip, 2er)...from 7/26-8/9 was on the DL with right shoulder fatigue...made rehab apps for Dayton (1g, 1ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 3k) and Louisville (2g, 1-0, 2ip, 0h, 0bb, 2k)...began the season with Cin and posted a 6.33era in 20 apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 6/1, when Edinson Volquez came off the disabled list...never left the team and was recalled the next day, when Volquez returned to the disabled list...posted a 2.19era in 9 more apps for the Reds before he was optioned to Louisville on 7/1, when IF Drew Sutton was promoted...returned to Cin on 7/20 and made 2 more apps before he went on the disabled list with the right shoulder injury...overall made 10 apps for Louisville (3-0, 0.82, 11ip, 8h, 1er, 3bb, 10k).

48 FRANCISCO CORDERO, rhp **47g, 1-3-25, 2.30**

Was an All-Star for the third time (2004 for Tex, 2007 for Mil)...in his last 17 apps has posted a 2.65era (17ip, 5er)...with 25 saves ranks among the National League leaders... converted 25 of his 26 save opps, including each of his last 10 save opps...in the 12-inning, 4-2 win on 6/10 at Wsh returned to the mound after a rain delay and suffered his only blown save since 7/21/08 vs SD...including last season has recorded 59 of the bullpen's last 60 saves (34sv in 2008, 25sv in 2009, Weathers 1sv in 2009)...with 236 career saves ranks 30th on that all-time list...Ugeth Urbina is 29th with 237 saves...in the 3-0 victory on 4/22 at Chi recorded his 100th save in the National League to become only the 11th pitcher in history with at least 100 saves in each league (see box).

In the first inning of Wed's 5-2 loss at StL replaced the injured Bailey and threw a career-high 4.1 innings...in his last 17 apps has posted a 2.30era (27.1ip, 7er)...10 times has thrown at least 2.0 innings and 13 times has thrown more than 1.0 inning... in the 11-inning, 4-3 win on 5/24 vs Cle picked up the victory his Major League debut... in his outing on 6/7 vs the Cubs faced 4 batters but recorded 5 outs (K/CS, K, K, K)... on 5/21 was promoted from Louisville (13g, 2-0-2, 2.00, 18ip, 11h, 4er, 4bb, 21k, 0hr, .175 opponents' BA).

Last name is pronounced MASS-it...has made a career-high 48 apps...opponents are hitting just .190 (36-189), including .182 by RH batters (22-121)...from 4/28-6/14 produced a career-best 16.2-inning scoreless streak, the longest by a Reds pitcher this season...from 5/19-5/25 was on the 15-day disabled list with a strained left oblique muscle...posted a 1.23era in 11 apps before his disabling (14.2ip, 2er) and a 3.46era in 37 apps since he came off the DL (39ip, 15er).
