They Were Family

Prior to tonight's game the Pirates will honor their 1979 World Series championship team...both teams will wear throwback uniforms and hats from that season...30 years ago, the Pirates swept the Reds in the National League Championship Series before beating the Orioles to win the World Series.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Danny Hart's** Pirates and **Game 2** (0-1) of a 6-game road trip that includes an off day in Milwaukee on Monday followed by 3g at **Miller Park**...following this road trip return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-game homestand vs **LAD** (3g) and **Pit** (4g) that includes a **day/night doubleheader** (1:10pm, 7:10pm) vs the Pirates on **Mon, 8/31**...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with 20g at **Great American Ball Park** and 21g on the road.

DOT, DOT, DOT: In the last 3g Reds batters are **1-for-23 with RISP**...for the third straight day the Reds face a season-high **17.5-game deficit**...at **51-70** are a season-high **19g below .500** for the second time (50-69)...since the All-Star break are **9-25** (.265) and have lost **12.5g** in the NL Central standings...at **44-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

ON REHAB: **3B Scott Rolen** (DL, concussion) last night made his second rehab appearance at Louisville and in the Bats' 15-6 win at Indianapolis went 0-for-3 with a run scored...in the Bats' 8-3 loss on Thu at Indy he went 2-for-3 with an RBI...he is expected to join the Reds here tonight...**Rolen** is eligible to be reinstated from the DL tomorrow...he was injured on **8/2 vs Col**, when in his second game as a Red he was hit in the helmet by a **Jason Marquis** pitch.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **100 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues (Hou 90, SD 82, Bal 81), and have been outscored in the opening frame, **100-61**...allowed first-inning runs in 50 of their 121g this season.

BATTING LEADER: **Joey Votto** is hitting .308 but missed 21g while on the disabled list and remains 6 plate apps shy of qualifying for the National League leaders...even with an 0-for-6, **Votto** would be hitting .302.

HAL McCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he has worked for the *DDN* for 49 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

M*A*S*H: The Reds currently have **7 players on the disabled list**, including 4 players from their **Opening Day** roster: **C Ramon Hernandez** (left knee surgery), **RF Jay Bruce** (broken right wrist), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (right elbow surgery) and **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement surgery)...also on the DL are **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (season-ending left shoulder surgery), **IF Danny Richar** (season-ending left shoulder surgery) and **3B Scott Rolen** (concussion, on rehab assignment).

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion**, **SS Alex Gonzalez**, **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **100 different lineups** in 121g.

SURGERIES: Six Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder) and **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow)...**Castillo**, **Richar** and **Volquez** will not play again the rest of the season.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: Six Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum** and **OF Drew Stubbs**...in **2008**, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto**, **IF Paul Janish**, **OF Jay Bruce**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Daryl Thompson**, **IF Adam Rosales**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **RHP Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

REDS HALL OF FAME: Through September 2, Reds fans can vote for the **Reds Hall of Fame Class of 2010** online at reds.com/HOF or via paper ballot that can be found at the **Hall of Fame and Museum**, the **Reds Community Corner** at **Section 120** in Great American Ball Park or at participating **Skyline Chili** and **Montgomery Inn** locations...the candidates include **Bret Boone**, **Jeff Brantley**, **Norm Charlton**, **John Franco**, **Danny Graves**, **Kevin Mitchell**, **Hal Morris**, **Paul O'Neill**, **Chris Sabo** and **Scott Sullivan**.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (26-35 .426): The Reds went 2-5 on their most recent homestand (1-3 vs Wsh, 1-2 vs SF)...went **5-12-3 in their 20 home series**...produced a winning record on just 2 of their 10 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **267-280-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (25-35 .417): The Reds are 0-1 on this road trip (0-1 at Pit)...have dropped 12 of their last 15 road games and 14 of their last 18 road games...went **8-9-2 in their previous 19 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 5 of their 9 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips.

IN THE STANDINGS (138): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 1, **SECOND** - 9, **THIRD** - 46, **FOURTH** - 35, **FIFTH** - 46, **SIXTH** - 1...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...for the third straight day face a season high **17.5-game deficit**...at **51-70** are a season high-**19g under .500 for the second time (50-69)**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **59** days below .500.

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **971-1,019 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 3-3 this season...**at PNC Park:** Reds are 33-32 all-time, including 2-2 this season...**last Pirates sweep:** at Cin: 7/23-7/24, 2003 (2g); 3/31-4/3, 2003 (3g); 7/11-7/14, 1991 (4g)...at Pit: 8/20-8/21, 1998 (2g); **4/11-4/13, 2008 (3g)**; 8/22-8/24, 1969 (4g).

Last Pitched: Sun vs Wsh and in the 5-4 loss was the victim of a blown save (6ip, 6h, 3er, 0bb, 2k, 1hr, 1hbp, 1wp, 93 pitches, 61 strikes)...left leading, 4-3, but the Nationals took a 5-4 lead in the eighth inning with a pair of runs off Rhodes...allowed a 2-run HR to Willingham in the fourth inning and an RBI-double to Willingham in the sixth.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced **LEER**...media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his fifth career start, all this season...in his 4 starts the Reds went 2-2 and scored 14 runs (4 r/g)...has 3 quality apps in 4 starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on **7/31 vs Col** made his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...on **8/5 vs Chi** earned his first career victory since **5/18/06 vs Phi** (5-4 Brewers win)...on **8/11 at StL** singled off **Mitchell Boggs** for his first Major League hit.

Shutout: In his 4-0 victory on **8/5 vs the Cubs** threw a complete-game shutout in just his second Major League start (4h, 1bb, 4k)...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since **Charlie Leibrandt** beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on **4/13/80** and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' **Clay Buchholz** threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start... courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Scattering Hits: In his 5-4 victory on **8/11 at StL**, earned the decision after allowing 11 hits, all singles, and 1 run in 6+ innings...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, became just the third pitcher since 1900 to earn a win while allowing zero or 1 run and at least 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched or less...the other 2 were Cle's **Jack Kralick** in **1965** (6ip, 11h, 1r) and Bal's **Pat Rapp** in **2000** (6ip, 11h, 1r).

2009 Season: In December was signed by the Phillies to a minor league contract and began the season with Class AAA Lehigh Valley (8g, 7gs, 5-2, 4.75)...on 5/22 was traded to the Reds in exchange for cash...went 8-1, 2.51 in 11 starts and 1 relief appearance at Class AAA Louisville before he was promoted on 7/31 to take the spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Micah Owings**, who went on the disabled list with a tight right shoulder...overall at Class AAA went **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...when promoted, his 13 victories tied for the most among all minor league pitchers...twice was International League Pitcher of the Week, from **4/13-4/19** for Lehigh Valley (2gs, 2-0, 1.59) and from **7/20-7/26** for Louisville (2gs, 2-0, 1.88).

Career Highlights: Prior to this season had made all 66 of his Major League apps in relief...was International League Pitcher of the Week twice in 2009 and once in 2008...in 2007 was a Pacific Coast League All-Star and started the Triple-A All-Star Game...in 2000 was a California League All-Star.

Career Highs: **Innings:** 9.0, 8/5/09 vs Chi; **Hits:** 11, 8/11/09 at StL; **Runs:** 5, 4/23/06 vs Cin; **Earned Runs:** 5, 4/23/06 vs Cin; **Walks:** 6, 7/31/09 vs Col; **Strikeouts:** 4, 8/5/09 vs Chi; **HR allowed:** 1 (10x), last on 8/16/09 vs Wsh (Willingham, 2-run).

Lehr's Most Recent Starts: **7/31 vs Col** and received no decision in the 5-3 loss (5ip, 4h, 3er, 6bb, 0k, 0hr, 97 pitches, 52 strikes)...left with the score tied, 3-3... was his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...in the first inning allowed 2 runs on 3 hits, a walk and an error...**8/5 vs Chi** and in his second career start threw a 4-hitter to earn the 4-0 win (9ip, 1bb, 4k, 117 pitches, 78 strikes)...was his first Major League complete game and shutout and his first victory since **May 2006...8/11 at StL** and earned the 5-4 victory (6+ip, 11h, 1er, 1bb, 1k, 0hr, 89 pitches, 58 strikes)...left leading, 4-1... allowed 11 singles and stranded 7 baserunners...gave up only an RBI-single to Ludwick with 2 outs in the third inning...in the sixth inning singled off Mitchell Boggs for his first Major League hit.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Homer Bailey

Last Pitched: Tue vs SF and received no decision in the 10-inning, 8-5 loss (5.2ip, 7h, 5er, 3bb, 4k, 92 pitches, 54 strikes)...left with the score tied, 5-5...in the third inning allowed a solo HR to Uribe...took a 5-1 lead into the sixth inning but allowed 4 runs on 2 walks and 4 hits...the Giants won it with 3 runs in the 10th off Cordero.

Red Hots: Tomorrow will make his 12th start of the season and his first career appearance vs the Pirates...in his 11 starts overall the Reds went 3-8 and scored 53 runs (4.82 r/g)...has 3 quality starts... once was the victim of a blown save...has walked 28 batters, 14 scored.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...in that 5/23 start vs the Indians became only the sixth different pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season, in the club's 42nd game...was the longest such streak to begin a season since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994** campaign.

At Louisville: In 14 apps for the Bats produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps (5-1, 1.07, 50.1ip, 47h, 6er, 12bb, 45k)...in his first start of the season allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era) and in his last 13 starts posted a 2.03era (84.1ip, 19er)...following his most recent start for the Bats ranked among the International League leaders in innings pitched (89.2, 1st), wins (8, 2nd), strikeouts (82, 2nd) and ERA (2.71, 10th)...**for the Bats, in 6 starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81.**

IF Paul Janish pitched in the ninth inning of the 15-3 loss vs Mil on 5/6 (1ip, 5h, 5er, 0bb, 2k, Fielder 2-run HR) and in the eighth inning of the historic 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (1ip, 4h, 6er, 2bb, 1k, Werth grand slam)...he became the first Reds position player to pitch since Lenny Harris on 6/1/98 at SF and the first Reds position player to pitch more than once in a season since OF Mel Queen took the mound 7 times during the second half of the 1966 campaign.				

Reds Pitchers: Rank 11th in the National League with a 4.39 staff ERA...**on the roadtrip are 0-1, 5.63, (8ip, 5er)**...in the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 22 runs in a game for the first time since a 22-6 loss at Chi on **8/13/37**...the Reds already have 11 team shutouts, their highest total since they had 11sho in 1999...haven't had more than 11 shutouts since 1990, when they threw 12...had 6 shutouts all of last year.s
