TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Timmy O'Driscoll's** Brewers and **Game 5** (3-2) of a 6-game road trip that included a weekend series **at Pit** (1-2) and a day off here...tomorrow the Reds return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-game homestand vs **LAD** (3g) and **Pit** (4g) that includes Mon's **day/night doubleheader** (1:10pm, 7:10pm) vs the Pirates...including today's game the Reds will finish the season with 20g at **Great American Ball Park** and 17g on the road.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Reds have played 2 straight extra-inning games and 4 extra-inning contests in their last 8g...for the fifth straight day are a season-high **18.5g out of first place**...in the last 7g Reds batters are **10-for-65 with RISP** (.154)...since the All-Star break are **12-26** (.316) and have lost **13.5g** in the National League Central standings...at **46-0** the Reds club is the NL's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **103 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues (Hou 101, SD 88, Bal 82), and have been outscored in the opening frame, **103-62**...allowed first-inning runs in 51 of their 125g this season.

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he will be honored in a pregame ceremony on **Wed, 9/16**...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 49 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **104 different lineups** in 125g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: Six Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum** and **OF Drew Stubbs**...in **2008**, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto**, **IF Paul Janish**, **OF Jay Bruce**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Daryl Thompson**, **IF Adam Rosales**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **RHP Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

REDS HALL OF FAME: Through September 2, Reds fans can vote for the **Reds Hall of Fame Class of 2010** online at reds.com/HOF or via paper ballot that can be found at the **Hall of Fame and Museum**, the **Reds Community Corner** at **Section 120** in Great American Ball Park or at participating **Skyline Chili** and **Montgomery Inn** locations...the candidates include **Bret Boone**, **Jeff Brantley**, **Norm Charlton**, **John Franco**, **Danny Graves**, **Kevin Mitchell**, **Hal Morris**, **Paul O'Neill**, **Chris Sabo** and **Scott Sullivan**.

EMMY AWARD: For the second consecutive year, Reds TV rightsholder **FOX Sports Ohio** has won an **Emmy Award** for its *Reds Live* pre-game show (sports programs category)...congratulations to hosts **Jim Day** and **Jeff Piccoro**, producer **Kent Weaver** and directors **Brian Hunterman** and **Roy Alfors**...FOX Sports Ohio also won an **Emmy** for its **Columbus Blue Jackets** NHL game coverage (live sporting event category).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (26-35 .426): The Reds went 2-5 on their most recent homestand (1-3 vs Wsh, 1-2 vs SF)...went **5-12-3 in their 20 home series**...produced a winning record on just 2 of their 10 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **267-280-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...at **217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (28-36 .438): The Reds are 3-2 on this road trip (1-2 at Pit, 2-0 at Mil)...went **8-10-2 in their previous 20 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 5 of their previous 9 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (143): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 50, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...for the fifth straight day face a season-high **18.5-game deficit**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **64** days below .500.

REDS vs BREWERS: The Reds are 97-95-1 all-time vs the Brewers, including 7-7 this season and 17-15 the last 2 seasons...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 29-28, including 3-3 this season...**at Miller Park:** Reds are 41-37, including 4-4 this season and 10-6 the last 2 seasons...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 7/19-7/20, 2004 (2g); 5/6-5/8, 2002 (3g)...at Mil: 6/5-6/6, 2001 (2g); 7/11-7/13, 2003 (3g); 5/13-5/16, 2002 (4g)...**last Brewers sweep:** at Cin: 8/30-9/1, 2002 (3g); 8/25-8/28, 2003 (4g)...at Mil: 4/27-4/28, 2004 (2g), 5/29-5/31, 2009 (3g).

UP NEXT: REDS vs DODGERS: Reds are 995-1,035 since 1900 vs the Dodgers, including 0-3 in 2009 and 1-10 the last 2 seasons...have lost their last 9g vs LAD and their last 12g at Dodger Stadium...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 7-13, including 1-4 in 2008...LA was Cin's only NL opponent with a winning mark at Cinergy Field (123-118)...**at Dodger Stadium:** Reds are 160-184, including 0-3 in each of the last 4 seasons...haven't won there since their final appearance of the 2005 season, a 6-1 victory by **Brandon Claussen** on **7/28/05**...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 5/7-5/8, 1996 (2g); 6/12-6/14, 1992 (3g); 9/22-9/24, 1969 (4g)...at LA: 9/23-9/24, 1992 (2g); 5/14-5/16, 2004 (3g); 8/5-8/8, 1976 (4g)...**last Dodgers sweep:** at Cin: 9/26-9/27, 1983 (2g); **6/17-6/19, 2008 (3g)**...at LA: 7/20-7/21, 1998 (2g); **7/20-7/22, 2009 (3g)**; 4/14-4/17, 1975 (4g).

Last Pitched: Sat at Pit and suffered the 12-2 loss (5ip, 8h, 6er, 3bb, 0k, 1hr, 74 pitches, 47 strikes)...left trailing, 6-2...in the first inning allowed 3 runs on 4 hits...in the fifth allowed a 2-run HR to Doumit.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced **LEER**...media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his sixth career start, all this season...in his 5 starts the Reds went 2-3 and scored 16 runs (3.20 r/g)...has 3 quality apps in 5 starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on **7/31 vs Col** made his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...on **8/5 vs Chi** earned his first career victory since **5/18/06 vs Phi** (5-4 Brewers win)...on **8/11 at StL** singled off **Mitchell Boggs** for his first Major League hit.

Shutout: In his 4-0 victory on **8/5 vs the Cubs** threw a complete-game shutout in just his second Major League start (4h, 1bb, 4k)...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since **Charlie Leibrandt** beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on **4/13/80** and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' **Clay Buchholz** threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Scattering Hits: In his 5-4 victory on **8/11 at StL**, earned the decision after allowing 11 hits, all singles, and 1 run in 6+ innings...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, became just the third pitcher since 1900 to earn a win while allowing zero or 1 run and at least 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched or less...the other 2 were Cle's **Jack Kralick** in **1965** (6ip, 11h, 1r) and Bal's **Pat Rapp** in **2000** (6ip, 11h, 1r).

2009 Season: In December was signed by the Phillies to a minor league contract and began the season with Class AAA Lehigh Valley (8g, 7gs, 5-2, 4.75)...on 5/22 was traded to the Reds in exchange for cash...went 8-1, 2.51 in 11 starts and 1 relief appearance at Class AAA Louisville before he was promoted on 7/31 to take the spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Micah Owings**, who went on the disabled list with a tight right shoulder...overall at Class AAA went **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...when promoted, his 13 victories tied for the most among all minor league pitchers...twice was International League Pitcher of the Week, from **4/13-4/19** for Lehigh Valley (2gs, 2-0, 1.59) and from **7/20-7/26** for Louisville (2gs, 2-0, 1.88).

Career Highlights: Prior to this season had made all 66 of his Major League apps in relief...was International League Pitcher of the Week twice in 2009 and once in 2008...in 2007 was a Pacific Coast League All-Star and started the Triple-A All-Star Game...in 2000 was a California League All-Star.

Career Highs: **Innings:** 9.0, 8/5/09 vs Chi; **Hits:** 11, 8/11/09 at StL; **Runs:** 6, 8/22/09 at Pit; **Earned Runs:** 6, 8/22/09 at Pit; **Walks:** 6, 7/31/09 vs Col; **Strikeouts:** 4, 8/5/09 vs Chi; **HR allowed:** 1 (11x), last on 8/22/09 at Pit (Doumit, 2-run).

Lehr's Most Recent Starts: **7/31 vs Col** and received no decision in the 5-3 loss (5ip, 4h, 3er, 6bb, 0k, 0hr, 97 pitches, 52 strikes)...left with the score tied, 3-3...was his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...in the first inning allowed 2 runs on 3 hits, a walk and an error...**8/5 vs Chi** and in his second career start threw a 4-hitter to earn the 4-0 win (9ip, 1bb, 4k, 117 pitches, 78 strikes)...was his first Major League complete game and shutout and his first victory since **May 2006**...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since **Charlie Leibrandt** beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on **4/13/80** and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' **Clay Buchholz** threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start...**8/11 at StL** and earned the 5-4 victory (6+ip, 11h, 1er, 1bb, 1k, 0hr, 89 pitches, 58 strikes)...left leading, 4-1...allowed 11 singles and stranded 7 baserunners...gave up only an RBI-single to Ludwick with 2 outs in the third inning...in the sixth inning singled off Mitchell Boggs for his first Major League hit...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, became just the third pitcher since 1900 to earn a win while allowing zero or 1 run and at least 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched or less...the other 2 were Cle's **Jack Kralick** in **1965** (6ip, 11h, 1r) and Bal's **Pat Rapp** in **2000** (6ip, 11h, 1r)...**8/16 vs Wsh** and in the 5-4 loss was the victim of a blown save (6ip, 6h, 3er, 0bb, 2k, 1hr, 1hbp, 1wp, 93 pitches, 61 strikes)...left leading, 4-3, but the Nationals took a 5-4 lead in the eighth inning with a pair of runs off Rhodes...allowed a 2-run HR to Willingham in the fourth inning and an RBI-double to Willingham in the sixth.

Tomorrow vs Dodgers: Homer Bailey

Last Pitched: Sun at Pit and earned the 4-1 victory (7ip, 4h, 1er, 4bb, 4k, 0hr, 114 pitches, 69 strikes)...left leading, 4-1...threw 28 pitches in the scoreless first inning (2h, 1bb)...stranded 3 baserunners in the first inning, 2 in the second and 6 overall...allowed only an RBI-single to Young in the fifth inning.

Red Hots: Tomorrow vs LAD will make his 13th start of the season and the 30th start of his Major League career...in his 12 starts overall the Reds went 4-8 and scored 57 runs (4.75 r/g)...has 4 quality starts...once was the victim of a blown save...has walked 28 batters, 14 scored.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...in that 5/23 start vs the Indians became only the sixth different pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season, in the club's 42nd game...was the longest such streak to begin a season since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994** campaign.

At Louisville: In 14 apps for the Bats produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps (5-1, 1.07, 50.1ip, 47h, 6er, 12bb, 45k)...in his first start of the season allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era) and in his last 13 starts posted a 2.03era (84.1ip, 19er)...following his most recent start for the Bats ranked among the International League leaders in innings pitched (89.2, 1st), wins (8, 2nd), strikeouts (82, 2nd) and ERA (2.71, 10th)...**for the Bats, in 6 starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81.**

IL Pitcher of the Week: Twice this season was named the International League's **Pitcher of the Week**...in 2 starts the week of **4/20-4/26** went 2-0, 2.92 with 18 strikeouts in 12.1 innings (10h, 6bb)...in the 10-3 win at Toledo on 4/26, over 6.1 innings he struck out a career-high 15 batters to tie the Louisville single-game record...in 2 starts from **6/1-6/7** went 2-0 without allowing a run (14.2ip, 11h, 2bb, 14k).
