In Good Company....

Joey Votto yesterday at Mil hit his 20th home run of the season, after he had 24 homers as a rookie in 2008...he is the first Reds player with at least 20 homers as a rookie and again in the following season since Hall of Famer **Frank Robinson** hit 38 home runs in 1956 and 29 homers in 1957...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Joe Jareck's** Dodgers and **Game 1** of a 7-game homestand that also includes a 4-game set with the **Pirates**...that upcoming series vs Pit includes Monday's **day/night doubleheader** (1:10pm, 7:10pm)...the Reds are coming off a **4-2 road trip** to **Pit** (1-2) and **Mil** (3-0) that included their first 3-game sweep at **Miller Park** since **July 2003**...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with 20g at **Great American Ball Park** and 16g on the road.

UPCOMING ROSTER MOVES: The Reds are expected to recall from Louisville **LHP Matt Maloney** (#56) to make tomorrow's start against the Dodgers...on Monday, **RHP Johnny Cueto** (inflammation, right shoulder) is expected to be reinstated from the 15-day disabled list in time to start the second game of the day/night doubleheader vs the Pirates...the corresponding roster moves will be made as necessary.

DOT, DOT, DOT: Tonight the Reds and **Make-A-Wish Foundation** tonight are hosting 14-year-old **Joel Brown** of Mason...the Reds' **4-game winning streak** ties their season high (5/24-5/27)...are **47-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings...the media guide bios for **Wladimir Balentien**, **Justin Lehr**, **Corky Miller**, **Scott Rolen**, **Drew Sutton** and **Kip Wells** are available in the press box.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **107 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues and have been outscored in the opening frame, **107-62**...allowed first-inning runs in 52 of their 126g this season.

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he will be honored in a pregame ceremony on **Wed, 9/16**...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 49 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **105 different lineups** in 126g.

SURGERIES: Seven Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: Six Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum** and **OF Drew Stubbs**...in **2008**, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto**, **IF Paul Janish**, **OF Jay Bruce**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Daryl Thompson**, **IF Adam Rosales**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **RHP Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

REDS HALL OF FAME: Through **Wednesday**, Reds fans can vote for the **Reds Hall of Fame Class of 2010** online at reds.com/HOF or via paper ballot that can be found at the **Hall of Fame and Museum**, the **Reds Community Corner** at **Section 120** in Great American Ball Park or at participating **Skyline Chili** and **Montgomery Inn** locations...the candidates include **Bret Boone**, **Jeff Brantley**, **Norm Charlton**, **John Franco**, **Danny Graves**, **Kevin Mitchell**, **Hal Morris**, **Paul O'Neill**, **Chris Sabo** and **Scott Sullivan**.

EMMY AWARD: For the second consecutive year, Reds TV rightsholder **FOX Sports Ohio** has won an **Emmy Award** for its *Reds Live* pre-game show (sports programs category)...congratulations to hosts **Jim Day** and **Jeff Piccoro**, producer **Kent Weaver** and directors **Brian Hunterman** and **Roy Alfors**...FOX Sports Ohio also won an **Emmy** for its **Columbus Blue Jackets** NHL game coverage (live sporting event category).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (26-35 .426): The Reds went 2-5 on their most recent homestand (1-3 vs Wsh, 1-2 vs SF)...went **5-12-3 in their previous 20 home series**...produced a winning record on just 2 of their 10 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **267-280-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38).

REDS ON THE ROAD (29-36 .446): The Reds' current 4-game road winning streak ties their longest of the season (5/5-5/13)...went 4-2 on their most recent road trip (1-2 at Pit, 3-0 at Mil)...went **9-10-2 in their 21 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 10 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (144): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 51, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...for 5 straight days from **8/22-8/26** faced a season-high **18.5-game deficit**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **65** days below .500.

REDS vs DODGERS: Reds are 995-1,035 since 1900 vs the Dodgers, including 0-3 in 2009 and 1-10 the last 2 seasons...have lost their last 9g vs LAD and their last 12g at Dodger Stadium...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 7-13, including 1-4 in 2008...LA was Cin's only NL opponent with a winning mark at Cinergy Field (123-118)...**at Dodger Stadium:** Reds are 160-184, including 0-3 in each of the last 4 seasons...haven't won there since their final appearance of the 2005 season, a 6-1 victory by **Brandon Claussen** on **7/28/05**.

Last Pitched: Sun at Pit and earned the 4-1 victory (7ip, 4h, 1er, 4bb, 4k, 0hr, 114 pitches, 69 strikes)...left leading, 4-1...threw 28 pitches in the scoreless first inning (2h, 1bb)...stranded 3 baserunners in the first inning, 2 in the second and 6 overall...allowed only an RBI-single to Young in the fifth inning.

Red Hots: Is making his 13th start of the season and the 30th start of his Major League career...in his 12 starts overall the Reds went 4-8 and scored 57 runs (4.75 r/g)...has 4 quality starts...once was the victim of a blown save...has walked 28 batters, 14 scored.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...in that 5/23 start vs the Indians became only the sixth different pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season, in the club's 42nd game...was the longest such streak to begin a season since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994** campaign.

At Louisville: In 14 apps for the Bats produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps (5-1, 1.07, 50.1ip, 47h, 6er, 12bb, 45k)...in his first start of the season allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era) and in his last 13 starts posted a 2.03era (84.1ip, 19er)...following his most recent start for the Bats ranked among the International League leaders in innings pitched (89.2, 1st), wins (8, 2nd), strikeouts (82, 2nd) and ERA (2.71, 10th)...**for the Bats, in 6 starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81.**

IL Pitcher of the Week: Twice this season was named the International League's **Pitcher of the Week**...in 2 starts the week of **4/20-4/26** went 2-0, 2.92 with 18 strikeouts in 12.1 innings (10h, 6bb)...in the 10-3 win at Toledo on 4/26, over 6.1 innings he struck out a career-high 15 batters to tie the Louisville single-game record...in 2 starts from **6/1-6/7** went 2-0 without allowing a run (14.2ip, 11h, 2bb, 14k).

Career Highs: **Innings:** 7.1 (2x), 7/3/09 vs StL & 7/27/09 vs SD (longest) and 1.2 (shortest, non-injured), 6/26/07 at Phi & 3bf (shortest, injured) 8/12/09 at StL; **Hits:** 15, 7/26/08 vs Col; **Runs:** 9, 7/21/09 at LAD; **Earned Runs:** 7, 7/16/09 vs Mil; **Walks:** 7, 6/27/09 at Cle; **Strikeouts:** 6, 7/8/09 at Phi; **HR allowed:** 3, 6/15/08 vs Bos (Ellsbury solo, Crisp 2-run, Drew solo).

Bailey's Most Recent Starts: **7/3 vs StL** and was the victim of a blown save in the 7-4 loss (7.1ip, 3h, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hbp, 104 pitches, 70 strikes)...left leading, 3-0, but was charged with 2 of the runs that scored on Pujols' grand slam off Weathers...Pujols drove in 5 of the Cardinals' 7 runs...**7/8 at Phi**, recorded a career-high 6 strikeouts but received no decision in the 3-2 loss (6ip, 7h, 2er, 0bb, 6k, 1hr, 95 pitches, 63 strikes)...left with the score tied, 2-2...allowed only an RBI-single to Howard in the fourth inning and a 2-out, solo HR to Werth in the sixth...Phillies won it in the ninth on Victorino's game-ending single off Weathers...**7/16 vs Mil**, in the Reds' second-half opener suffered the 9-6 loss (5.1ip, 6h, 7er, 4bb, 3k, 1hr, 101 pitches, 58 strikes)...left trailing, 4-2, but was charged with 3 more runs scored off Masset...in the third inning allowed a 3-run HR to Fielder...was charged with 4 of the Brewers' 5 runs in the sixth...**7/21 at LAD** and allowed a career-high 9 runs in the 12-3 loss (2.2ip, 8h, 9r, 6er, 2bb, 0k, 1hbp, 2wp, 81 pitches, 45 strikes)...left trailing, 9-1...in the first inning allowed a 2-run triple to Ramirez...in the second allowed a 2-run HR to Kemp...in the third allowed 5 more runs (3 unearned) on 2 hits, 2 walks, a hit batsman and 2 errors...**7/27 vs SD**, tied his career-high with 7.1 innings and snapped the Reds' season-high 6-game losing streak with a 6-4 victory (6h, 3er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 111 pitches, 75 strikes)...left leading, 6-3...in the fifth inning allowed an RBI-single to Rodriguez...in the sixth allowed back-to-back solo HR to Cabrera (first career) and AGonzalez...**8/1 vs Col** and suffered the 6-2 loss (5.1ip, 7h, 5er, 2bb, 4k, 1hr, 100 pitches, 65 strikes)...left trailing, 5-2...allowed 3 runs in the fourth inning on a 2-ruin single to Stewart and a sac fly to Gonzalez...in the fifth allowed a solo HR to Smith and in the sixth gave up a run-scoring double to Tulowitzki...**8/7 at SF** and received no decision in the 10-5 victory (6+ip, 9h, 5er, 1bb, 2k, 2hr, 108 pitches, 70 strikes)...left trailing, 4-3, but was charged with another run scored off Masset...allowed a pair of 2-run HR, to Molina in the first inning and to Velez in the fifth...**8/12 at StL** and in the 5-2 loss left the game after 3 batters when he was hit on the arch of his left foot by a Pujols line drive (3h, 3r, 2er, 0bb, 0k, 12 pitches, 8 strikes)...**8/18 vs SF** and received no decision in the 10-inning, 8-5 loss (5.2ip, 7h, 5er, 3bb, 4k, 92 pitches, 54 strikes)...left with the score tied, 5-5...in the third inning allowed a solo HR to Uribe...took a 5-1 lead into the sixth inning but allowed 4 runs on 2 walks and 4 hits...the Giants won it with 3 runs in the 10th off Cordero.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: #56 Matt Maloney

Last Pitched: On Sun for Louisville at Toledo and suffered the 6-3 loss (6ip, 6h, 4er, 2bb, 7k).

Last Pitched For The Reds: On 6/18 vs Atl and suffered the 7-0 loss (5.2ip, 6h, 6er, 2bb, 5k, 2hr, 106 pitches, 69 strikes)...left trailing, 4-0, but was charged with 2 more runs scored off Fisher...allowed a solo HR to Diaz in the fourth inning and a 2-run HR to McLouth in the fifth.

Red Hots: The 25-year-old lefthander tomorrow will make his fourth career start, all this season, and his first since 6/18...in his previous 3 starts the Reds went 1-2 and scored 5 runs (1.67 r/g)...has 1 quality start, in his Major League debut...on 6/6 vs Cubs made his Major League debut after 99 minor league apps and 98 minor league starts...was born in **Sandusky, Ohio** and lives in **Columbus**...graduated from **Huron (OH) High School**...his media guide bio is on page 135.

Southpaw: Is the only **lefthanded pitcher** to start a game for the Reds this season..when he debuted became only the second LHP to start a game for the Reds over a stretch of **236 games**...in **2008**, righthanders started Cin's first 161 games until **Adam Pettyjohn** took the hill for the season finale...**Pettyjohn's start** snapped a streak of **180 consecutive starts** by Reds righthanders...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, prior to **Maloney's debut** only the Reds, Padres and Cardinals had not started a lefthanded pitcher to that point in the season...the Cardinals remain the only team in the majors who haven't started a LHP.

Major League Debut: On 6/6 vs Cubs, in his Major League debut was the victim of a blown save in the 11-inning, 4-3 victory (6+ip, 6h, 2er, 1bb, 4k, 1hbp, 2hr, 89 pitches, 58 strikes)...left leading, 3-2, but the Cubs tied it in the eighth inning with a run off Weathers...allowed both runs on solo homers, by Scales with 2 outs in the fourth inning and by Soto leading off the seventh...stranded 4 baserunners, all in the first 2 innings...first career strikeout victim was Dempster...singled off Dempster in his first career plate appearance...pitched in front of a sellout crowd.

With The Bats: Began the season with Louisville and in 10 starts there went 4-3, 2.00 before he was recalled on 6/6 to start against the Cubs...when promoted led the Bats' staff in starts (10, tied with **Homer Bailey**), innings pitched (67.1) and strikeouts (58)...in his last 5 starts for Louisville prior to that 6/6 promotion went 2-2, 0.73...in 12 starts after he returned to the Bats following this stint with the Reds went 5-6, 4.04 (75.2ip, 34er)...was the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April (3gs, 2-0, 1.86).
