Central Casting

The Reds have won their last 8 games vs National League Central Division rivals (1-0 at Pit, 3-0 at Mil, 4-0 vs Pit)...is their longest winning streak vs NL Central opponents since an 8-game stretch from **5/31-6/8**, **2006** (1-0 at Chi, 3-0 vs Hou, 3-0 vs StL, 1-0 vs Chi)...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, since divisional play began in 1969 the club record for consecutive victories within the division is 9, accomplished 5 times and most recently from **5/22-5/31**, **1995** (3-0 vs Hou, 1-0 at Chi, 3-0 at StL, 2-0 at Pit).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs Carol Misevich's Cubs and Game 8 (3-4) of a 10-game road trip that included a 3-0 sweep at Atl's Turner Field (3-0) followed by an 0-4 visit to Col's Coors Field...was the Reds' first sweep in Atlanta since 7/16-7/18, 2007 and their first ever 4-game sweep loss to the Rockies...including today's game the Reds will finish the season with 13g at Great American Ball Park (3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla, 3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit) and 9g on the road (3g at Chi, 3g at Pit, 3g at Hou).

<u>PLAYIN' EVERY DAY</u>: Today's game is **Game 8** (3-4) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive** days, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, **3g at Chi**, 3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla)...their next day off is **Monday**, **9/21**, when they will travel to Pittsburgh to begin their final road trip of the season.

<u>POT, DOT, DOT</u>: The Reds were in Chicago on 9/11/01...Dusty Baker has 1,299 victories as a Major League manager...today's 20.5-game deficit is the Reds' largest of the season...the Reds will be eliminated from National League Central Division contention with any combination of Reds losses or Cardinals wins totaling 2...their elimination number in the Wild Card is 5...tomorrow, bullpen catcher Mike Stefanski will celebrate his 40th birthday...at 53-0 the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **110 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues and have been outscored in the opening frame, **110-72**...allowed first-inning runs in 54 of their 140g this season.

MICAH UPDATE: RHP Micah Owings left Sun's 4-2 victory at Atl after he was hit in the helmet by a Kenshin Kawakami pitch with the bases loaded in the top of the 12th inning...he did not have symptoms of a concussion but suffered a perforation to his left ear drum and a cut to his face that required 5 stitches...a CT scan was normal...Owings flew here yesterday and is expected to work out with the team today, when his playing status will be updated...the HBP forced in the run that snapped the 2-2 tie and made Owings the winning pitcher.

HAL McCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he will be honored in a pregame ceremony at Great American Ball Park on **Wednesday**...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

<u>OPENING DAY LINEUP</u>: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **116 different lineups** in 140g.

<u>SURGERIES</u>: Seven Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including C Ramon Hernandez (cleaned out left knee), SS Alex Gonzalez (removed loose bodies, right elbow), RHP Mike Lincoln (cervical disc replacement), C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), IF Danny Richar (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), RHP Edinson Volquez (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and RHP Aaron Harang (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: Seven Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including RHP Carlos Fisher, LHP Matt Maloney, IF Drew Sutton, RHP Robert Manuel, C Craig Tatum, OF Drew Stubbs and LHP Pedro Viola..in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: RHP Johnny Cueto, IF Paul Janish, OF Jay Bruce, LHP Daniel Ray Herrera, RHP Daryl Thompson, IF Adam Rosales, OF Chris Dickerson, RHP Ramon Ramirez, C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo and RHP Josh Roenicke.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (31-37 .456): The Reds' current 4-game home winning streak ties their season high (5/24-5/27)...went 5-2 on their most recent homestand (1-2 vs LAD, 4-0 vs Pit), including their first 4-game home sweep of the Pirates since August 1975...went 6-13-3 in their 22 home series...produced a winning record on 3 of their 11 homestands (2-3, 2-4, 3-2, 6-3, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, 5-2)...in 7 seasons at GABP are 272-282-1... from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)... last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...at 217-217-1 the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since 6/26/04 (57-57)...also reached .500 at 219-219-1.

REDS ON THE ROAD (32-40, .444): The Reds are 3-4 on this road trip (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, 3g at Chi)...went 10-11-2 in their previous 23 road series...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 10 road trips (7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4, 3-3, 2-5, 0-6, 3-3, 4-2)...entering this season and dating to 2006, the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips.

IN THE STANDINGS (158): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 65, SIXTH - 2...at 20-14 and 26-20 were a season-high 6g over .500...prior to this season hadn't been 6g over .500 since 2006, when they reached a season-high 12g over .500 at 36-24...at 51-71 were a season-high 20g under .500...today's 20.5-game deficit is a season high...have spent 64 days above, 15 days at and 79 days below .500.

REDS vs **CUBS**: The Reds are 1,051-1,083 all-time vs the Cubs, including 983-1,012 since 1900 and 4-8 this season... against the Cubs in September/October, the Reds are 21-19 over the last 7 seasons and 35-33 over the last 12 years... **at Great American Ball Park**: Reds are 26-28, including 2-4 this season...**at Wrigley Field**: Reds are 402-431 all-time, including 2-4 this season...**last Reds sweep**: at Cin: 4/25-4/26, 1994 (2g); 9/24-9/26, 2002 (3g); 4/8-4/11, 1983 (4g)... at Chi: 5/14-5/15, 1966 (2g); 8/8-8/10, 2005 (3g); 8/16-8/18, 1968 (4g)...**last Cubs sweep**: at Cin: 4/26-4/27, 1995 (2g); 5/28-5/30, 2001 (3g)...at Chi: 7/21-7/22, 2004 (2g); 7/24-7/26, 2009 (3g).

Last Pitched: On 9/1 vs Pit and earned the 11-5 victory (6ip, 6h, 4er, 5bb, 2k, 1hr, 114 pitches, 69 strikes)...left leading, 9-4...allowed 2 runs in the third inning, including a 2-run HR by Jones, and 2 more runs in the fourth...was bothered after that game by a sore right groin.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced LEER...media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his eighth career start, all this season, but his first appearance since 9/1...was scheduled to start Mon at Col but was scratched with a sore right groin...in August led the staff in wins (3)...in his 7 starts the Reds went 4-3 and scored 37 runs (5.29 r/g)...has 3 quality apps in 6 starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on 7/31 vs Col made his first Major League appearance since 5/22/06 for Mil at Cin and his first career big league start...on 8/5 vs Chi earned his first career victory since 5/18/06 vs Phi (5-4 Brewers win)...on 8/11 at StL singled off Mitchell Boggs for his first Major League hit.

<u>Most Valuable Pitcher</u>: Was named the International League's **Most Valuable Pitcher**...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville combined to finish 13-3, 3.31 in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...3 times was IL Pitcher of the week...was the starting pitcher for the IL in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland.

Shutout: In his 4-0 victory on 8/5 vs the Cubs threw a complete-game shutout in just his second Major League start (4h, 1bb, 4k)...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since Charlie Leibrandt beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on 4/13/80 and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' Clay Buchholz threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start.

2009 Season: In December was signed by the Phillies to a minor league contract and began the season with Class AAA Lehigh Valley (8g, 7gs, 5-2, 4.75)...on 5/22 was traded to the Reds in exchange for cash...went 8-1, 2.51 in 11 starts and 1 relief appearance at Class AAA Louisville before he was promoted on 7/31 to take the spot in the rotation vacated

by **RHP Micah Owings**, who went on the disabled list with a tight right shoulder...overall at Class AAA went **13-3**, **3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...when promoted, his 13 victories tied for the most among all minor league pitchers...3 times was International League Pitcher of the Week, including twice for Lehigh Valley in the first 5 weeks of the season and from **7/20-7/26** for Louisville (2gs, 2-0, 1.88)...was IL's starting pitcher in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland.

Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Sun at Pit and received no decision in the 12-inning, 4-2 victory (6ip, 3h, 1er, 2bb, 9k, 2hbp, 107 pitches, 72 strikes)... left with the score tied, 1-1, but Ross homered on the first pitch by Burton in the bottom of the seventh...didn't allow a hit until LaRoche singled with 1 out in the fourth inning...in the fifth allowed a 2-out, RBI-double to Prado...as a batter, led off the third inning with a single and scored the game's first run.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow will make his 27th start of the season, his third since a stint on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...was on the DL from 8/20-8/31...in 2 starts since then is 1-0, 1.64 (11ip, 2er)...ranks among the Major League leaders in hit batsmen (13) and 3 times hit 2 batters in a game...in his 26 starts the Reds went 13-13 and scored 100 runs (3.85 r/g)...in 9 of his 26 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 17 of his 26 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Streaking: The 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit snapped his career-high 6-game losing streak...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69... in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went 4-0, 1.25...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since **Tim Belcher** had a 4-game run from 5/27-6/13, 1992 (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

Quality: Has 13 quality starts...put together 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14),

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).
