Central Casting

The Reds have won their last 8 games vs National League Central Division rivals (1-0 at Pit, 3-0 at Mil, 4-0 vs Pit)...is their longest winning streak vs NL Central opponents since an 8-game stretch from **5/31-6/8, 2006** (1-0 at Chi, 3-0 vs Hou, 3-0 vs StL, 1-0 vs Chi)...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, since divisional play began in 1969 the club record for consecutive victories within the division is 9, accomplished 5 times and most recently from **5/22-5/31, 1995** (3-0 vs Hou, 1-0 at Chi, 3-0 at StL, 2-0 at Pit).

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Carol Misevich's** Cubs and **Game 8** (3-4) of a 10-game road trip that included a **3-0 sweep** at Atl's **Turner Field** (3-0) followed by an **0-4 visit** to Col's **Coors Field**...was the Reds' first sweep in Atlanta since **7/16-7/18, 2007** and their first ever 4-game sweep loss to the Rockies...including today's game the Reds will finish the season with **13g at Great American Ball Park** (3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla, 3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit) and **9g on the road** (3g at Chi, 3g at Pit, 3g at Hou).

PLAYIN' EVERY DAY: Today's game is **Game 8** (3-4) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive days**, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, **3g at Chi**, 3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla)...their next day off is **Monday, 9/21**, when they will travel to Pittsburgh to begin their final road trip of the season.

DOT. DOT. DOT: The Reds were in Chicago on **9/11/01**...**Dusty Baker** has **1,299 victories** as a Major League manager...today's **20.5-game deficit** is the Reds' largest of the season...the Reds will be eliminated from National League Central Division contention with any combination of Reds losses or Cardinals wins totaling **2**...their elimination number in the **Wild Card** is **5**...tomorrow, bullpen catcher **Mike Stefanski** will celebrate his 40th birthday...at **53-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **110 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues and have been outscored in the opening frame, **110-72**...allowed first-inning runs in 54 of their 140g this season.

MICAH UPDATE: RHP Micah Owings left Sun's 4-2 victory at Atl after he was hit in the helmet by a **Kenshin Kawakami** pitch with the bases loaded in the top of the 12th inning...he did not have symptoms of a concussion but suffered a perforation to his left ear drum and a cut to his face that required 5 stitches...a CT scan was normal...**Owings** flew here yesterday and is expected to work out with the team today, when his playing status will be updated...the HBP forced in the run that snapped the 2-2 tie and made **Owings** the winning pitcher.

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he will be honored in a pregame ceremony at Great American Ball Park on **Wednesday**...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez, 1B Joey Votto, 2B Brandon Phillips, 3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce, CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **116 different lineups** in 140g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: **Seven** Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Carlos Fisher, LHP Matt Maloney, IF Drew Sutton, RHP Robert Manuel, C Craig Tatum, OF Drew Stubbs and LHP Pedro Viola**...in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto, IF Paul Janish, OF Jay Bruce, LHP Daniel Ray Herrera, RHP Daryl Thompson, IF Adam Rosales, OF Chris Dickerson, RHP Ramon Ramirez, C/ IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (31-37 .456): The Reds' current 4-game home winning streak ties their season high (5/24-5/27)...went 5-2 on their most recent homestand (1-2 vs LAD, 4-0 vs Pit), including their first 4-game home sweep of the **Pirates** since **August 1975**...went **6-13-3 in their 22 home series**...produced a winning record on 3 of their 11 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **272-282-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...at **217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (32-40, .444): The Reds are **3-4** on this road trip (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, **3g at Chi**)...went **10-11-2 in their previous 23 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 10 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3, 4-2**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (158): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 1, **SECOND** - 9, **THIRD** - 46, **FOURTH** - 35, **FIFTH** - 65, **SIXTH** - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g** over .500 at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g** under .500...today's **20.5-game deficit** is a season high...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **79** days below .500.

REDS vs CUBS: The Reds are 1,051-1,083 all-time vs the Cubs, including 983-1,012 since 1900 and 4-8 this season...against the Cubs in September/October, the Reds are 21-19 over the last 7 seasons and 35-33 over the last 12 years...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 26-28, including 2-4 this season...**at Wrigley Field:** Reds are 402-431 all-time, including 2-4 this season...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 4/25-4/26, 1994 (2g); 9/24-9/26, 2002 (3g); 4/8-4/11, 1983 (4g)...at Chi: 5/14-5/15, 1966 (2g); 8/8-8/10, 2005 (3g); 8/16-8/18, 1968 (4g)...**last Cubs sweep:** at Cin: 4/26-4/27, 1995 (2g); 5/28-5/30, 2001 (3g)...at Chi: 7/21-7/22, 2004 (2g); 7/24-7/26, 2009 (3g).

IF Paul Janish pitched in the ninth inning of the 15-3 loss vs Mil on 5/6 (1ip, 5h, 5er, 0bb, 2k, Fielder 2-run HR) and in the eighth inning of the historic 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (1ip, 4h, 6er, 2bb, 1k, Werth grand slam)...he became the first Reds position player to pitch since Lenny Harris on 6/1/98 at SF and the first Reds position player to pitch more than once in a season since OF Mel Queen took the mound 7 times during the second half of the 1966 campaign.				

Reds Pitchers: On the road trip are 3-4, 2.87 (62.2ip, 20er)...in the last 18g are 12-6, 3.39 (169.2ip, 64er)...already have 11 team shutouts, their highest total since they had 11sho in 1999...haven't had more than 11 shutouts since 1990, when they threw 12... had 6 shutouts all of last year.

Reds Starters: On the road trip are 2-2, 2.38 (41.2ip, 11er)...in the last 18g are 8-3, 3.03 (113ip, 38er)...have produced 67 quality starts (Arroyo 19, Harang 14, Cueto 13, Owings 6, Bailey 6, Volquez 3, Lehr 3, Wells 2, Maloney 1)...the Reds went 47-20 in those quality starts (.701)...from 6/3-6/10 produced a season-high 7 consecutive quality starts, their best stretch since they threw 8 consecutive QS from 8/6-8/14, 2005...through the first 41g of the season used just 5 starting pitchers, their longest such streak to begin a year since RHP John Roper became the staff's sixth different starter in the 42nd game of the 1994 campaign....on 5/23 vs Cle, in the club's 42nd game, RHP Homer Bailey became the Reds' sixth starting pitcher...Aaron Harang threw a 3-hitter in the 2-0 win vs Pit in the club's fifth game of the season...was the earliest complete game by a Reds pitcher since Pete Harnisch beat the Cardinals, 3-0 in Busch Stadium, in the fourth contest of the 1999 campaign.

Reds Relievers: On the road trip are 1-2-3, 3.86 (21ip, 9er)...in the last 18g are 4-3, 4.13 (56.2ip, 26er)...7.1 innings during the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 13r/12er, the bullpen's highest single-game totals since identical totals in a 16-3 loss on 6/1/98 at SF...bullpen's ERA excluding that game drops from 3.69 to 3.50 (427ip, 166er).

51 JARED BURTON, rhp

42g, 0-0-0, 5.29

Has posted a 3.97era in 11 apps since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list (11.1ip, 5er)...from 7/26-8/9 was on the DL with right shoulder fatigue...made rehab apps for Dayton (1g, 1ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 3k) and Louisville (2g, 1-0, 2ip, 0h, 0bb, 2k)...began the season with Cin and posted a 6.33era in 20 apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 6/1, when Edinson Volquez came off the disabled list...never left the team and was recalled the next day, when Volquez returned to the disabled list...posted a 2.19era in 9 more apps for the Reds before he was optioned to Louiville on 7/1...returned to Cin on 7/20 and made 2 more apps before he went on the disabled list with the right shoulder injury...overall made 10 apps for Louisville (3-0, 0.82, 11ip, 8h, 1er, 3bb, 10k).

Was an All-Star for the third time (2004 for Tex, 2007 for Mil)...has recorded at least 30 saves for the third straight season and for the fifth time in the last 6 seasons...with 33 saves ranks among the National League leaders...converted 33-36 save opps...the last 2 seasons has recorded 67 of the bullpen's 69 saves (34sv in 2008, 33sv in 2009, Weathers 1sv in 2009, Owings 1sv in 2009)...with 244 career saves is tied with Dan Quisenberry for 28th on that all-time list...Dave Righetti is 27th with 252...in the 3-0 victory on 4/22 at Chi recorded his 100th save in the National League to become only the 11th pitcher in history with at least 100 saves in each league (see box).
