Hal McCoy Night

Beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* is retiring following this season...at 6:40 p.m. tonight he will be honored by the Reds in a ceremony on the field at Great American Ball Park...former Red and current Astro **Aaron Boone** will catch Hal's ceremonial first pitch...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Reds.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Sally Gunter's** Astros and **Game 3** (2-0) of a 7-game homestand that also includes a long weekend 4-game set vs the **Marlins** that begins tomorrow...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with **11g at Great American Ball Park** (1g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla, 3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit) and **6g on the road** (3g at Pit, 3g at Hou).

DOT. DOT. DOT: **RHP Ramon Ramirez** today is celebrating his 27th birthday...the Reds have won their last 6g at **Great American Ball Park**, their longest home winning streak of the season...have won their last 6g overall vs the Astros, all here at GABP...at **55-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings...will be eliminated from National League Wild Card contention with any combination of Reds losses or **Rockies** wins totaling **2**.

PLAYIN' EVERY DAY: Tonight's game is **Game 13** (6-6) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive days**, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, 1-2 at Chi, **2-0 vs Hou**, 4g vs Fla)...their next day off is **Monday**, when they will travel to Pittsburgh to begin their final road trip of the season.

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **113 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **113-74**...allowed first-inning runs in 55 of their 145g this season.

STAFF EXPANSION: Class AA Carolina manager **David Bell** temporarily has joined **Dusty Baker's** coaching staff...on 9/22, Class AAA Louisville manager **Rick Sweet** will join the staff in relief of **Bell**.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **119 different lineups** in 145g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

EMMY AWARD: For the second consecutive year, Reds TV rightsholder **FOX Sports Ohio** has won an **Emmy Award** for its *Reds Live* pre-game show (sports programs category)...congratulations to hosts **Jim Day** and **Jeff Piecoro**, producer **Kent Weaver** and directors **Brian Hunterman** and **Roy Alfors**...FOX Sports Ohio also won an **Emmy** for its **Columbus Blue Jackets** NHL game coverage (live sporting event category).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (33-37 .471): The Reds' current 6-game home winning streak is a season high...are **2-0** on this homestand (2-0 vs Hou, 4g vs Fla)...went **6-13-3 in their previous 22 home series**...produced a winning record on 3 of their previous 11 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **274-282-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

REDS ON THE ROAD (33-42 .440): The Reds went **4-6** on their most recent road trip (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, 1-2 at Chi)...went **10-12-2 in their 24 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their 11 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, 4-2, 4-6)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (163): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 69, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g** over .500 at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **84** days below .500.

REDS vs ASTROS: The Reds are 407-382-1 all-time vs the Astros, including 9-3 this season...the Reds' 4-2 win at Minute Maid Park on 4/19/09 was their 400th victory vs Hou...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 21-32-1, including 6-2 this season...their 3-game sweep in May was Cin's first here vs Hou since September 2000...have won 6 straight vs the Astros at GABP, following an 11-game losing streak here vs Hou...**Lance Berkman's** 21 homers at GABP are the most by any Reds opponent (**Albert Pujols** 2nd, 15)...among opposing pitchers, **Roy Oswalt's** 7 victories here are second only to the 8 wins by Chi's **Carlos Zambrano**...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 9/22, 1992 (2g, DH); 5/25-5/27, 2009 (3g); 5/21-5/24, 2004 (4g)...at Hou: 9/14-9/15, 1981 (2g); 6/2-6/4, 2006 (3g); 6/24-6/27, 1999 (4g).

UP NEXT: REDS vs MARLINS: The Reds are 78-59 all-time vs the Marlins, including 1-1 this season and 7-3 the last 2 seasons...have won 10 of their last 13g vs Fla...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 11-8, including 4-0 in 2008 and 7-0 the last 2 seasons...have won the last 8g here.

Last Pitched: Fri at Chi, in his first start since 9/1 suffered the 6-4 loss (4.2ip, 5h, 5er, 3bb, 1k, 1hr, 1hbp, 1wp, 81 pitches, 47 strikes)...left trailing, 5-4....allowed Soto's sac fly in the second inning, a 2-run single to Ramirez with 2 outs in the third and a solo HR to Soto in the fourth....after Gomes' 3-run HR in the top of the fifth tied the game at 4-4, allowed an RBI-single to Ramirez with 2 outs in the bottom of the inning...skipped his previous scheduled start with a sore right groin.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced **LEER**...media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his ninth career start, all this season, and his second appearance since skipping a start with a sore right groin... was scheduled to start on 9/7 at Col but was scratched with the injury... in August led the staff in wins (3)...in his 8 starts the Reds went 4-4 and scored 41 runs (5.13 r/g)...has 3 quality apps in 6 starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on **7/31 vs Col** made his first Major League appearance since **5/22/06 for Mil at Cin** and his first career big league start...on **8/5 vs Chi** earned his first career victory since **5/18/06 vs Phi** (5-4 Brewers win).

Most Valuable Pitcher: Was named the International League's **Most Valuable Pitcher**...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville combined to finish **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...3 times was IL Pitcher of the week...was the starting pitcher for the IL in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland.

Shutout: In his 4-0 victory on **8/5 vs the Cubs** threw a complete-game shutout in just his second Major League start (4h, 1bb, 4k)...became the first Reds pitcher to throw a shutout in his first or second career start since **Charlie Leibrandt** beat the Braves, 5-0, in his big league debut on **4/13/80** and the first pitcher to do it for any team since the Red Sox' **Clay Buchholz** threw a no-hitter on 9/1/07 vs Bal in his second career start...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Scattering Hits: In his 5-4 victory on **8/11 at StL**, earned the decision after allowing 11 hits, all singles, and 1 run in 6+ innings...according to **Elias Sports Bureau**, became just the third pitcher since 1900 to earn a win while allowing zero or 1 run and at least 11 hits in 6.0 innings pitched or less...the other 2 were Cle's **Jack Kralick** in **1965** (6ip, 11h, 1r) and Bal's **Pat Rapp** in **2000** (6ip, 11h, 1r).

2009 Season: In December was signed by the Phillies to a minor league contract and began the season with Class AAA Lehigh Valley (8g, 7gs, 5-2, 4.75)...on 5/22 was traded to the Reds in exchange for cash...went 8-1, 2.51 in 11 starts and 1 relief appearance at Class AAA Louisville before he was promoted on 7/31 to take the spot in the rotation vacated by **RHP Micah Owings**, who went on the disabled list with a tight right shoulder...overall at Class AAA went **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...when promoted, his 13 victories tied for the most among all minor league pitchers...3 times was International League Pitcher of the Week, including twice for Lehigh Valley in the first 5 weeks of the season and from **7/20-7/26** for Louisville (2gs, 2-0, 1.88)...was IL's starting pitcher in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland.

Career Highs: **Innings:** 9.0, 8/5/09 vs Chi; **Hits:** 11, 8/11/09 at StL; **Runs:** 6, 8/22/09 at Pit; **Earned Runs:** 6, 8/22/09 at Pit; **Walks:** 6, 7/31/09 vs Col; **Strikeouts:** 7, 8/27/09 at Mil; **HR allowed:** 2, 8/27/09 at Mil (Fielder 3-run, Cameron solo).

Tomorrow vs Marlins: Johnny Cueto

Last Pitched: Sat at Chi and was a victim of a blown save in the 7-5 victory (5.1ip, 4h, 3er, 3bb, 3k, 86 pitches, 54 strikes)...left leading, 5-2, but was charged with 1 run scored off Herrera...Cubs tied it in the seventh on Soto's 2-run double off Masset...after Theriot's infield single in the first inning didn't allow another hit until Lee's bloop single in the sixth.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander tomorrow vs Fla will make his 28th start of the season, his fourth since a stint on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...was on the DL from **8/20-8/31**...in 3 starts since then is **1-0, 2.76** (16.1ip, 5er)...leads the Major Leagues in hit batsmen (14) and 3 times hit 2 batters in a game...in his 27 starts the Reds went 14-13 and scored 107 runs (3.96 r/g)...in 9 of his 27 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 17 of his 27 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Streaking: The 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit snapped his career-high 6-game losing streak...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69... **in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64**...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went **4-0, 1.25**...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since **Tim Belcher** had a 4-game run from **5/27-6/13, 1992** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

Quality: Has 13 quality starts...put together 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).
