Disabled

This season **Nineteen** players made **21 apps** on the Reds' disabled list...the **19 disabled players** is the club's highest total since **2003**, when **19 players** were disabled **25 times**...**6 Reds players** currently are on the disabled list.

Climbing the Standings

At **70-81** the Reds and Astros are tied for fourth place in the National League Central Division. Cin's highest spot in the standings since **7/10** (4th, -4.5)...from 7/11 until yesterday the Redlegs spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds and Astros trail the third-place Brewers by 4.0g.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Terry Rodgers'** Pirates and **Game 2** (1-0) of the Reds' final road trip of the season (**1-0 at Pit**, 3g at Hou)...beginning Tuesday, the Redlegs will finish the 2009 season with 6g at **Great American Ball Park** (3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit).

G-20 SUMMIT: The City of Pittsburgh is preparing to host the 2-day **G-20 Summit** that begins here tomorrow...**President Obama** will chair this meeting of leaders from countries around the world that represent 85 percent of the world's economy...the leaders will review the progress made since the Washington and London Summits and will discuss further actions to assure a sound and sustainable recovery from the global financial and economic crisis...the **Group of Twenty** (G-20) formally was established in 1999 to bring together major industrialized and developing economies to discuss key issues in the global economy.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs have won 5 of their last 7g and 6 of their last 9g...Friday in Houston, Class AAA Louisville's **Rick Sweet**, the International League Manager of the Year for the second straight season, will join the Major League coaching staff to finish the season.

MILESTONES: **Joey Votto** (.308) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (38sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

LEADING OFF: The Reds have **3 leadoff home runs** in their last 7g, including 2 by **Drew Stubbs** (9/15 off Hou's **Roy Oswalt**, Sat off Fla's **Ricky Nolasco**) and another by **Darnell McDonald** in his only start of the season batting first (Thu off Fla's **Anibal Sanchez**)...**Stubbs** leads the club with 3 leadoff HR (other, 8/31 off Pit's **Daniel McCutchen**), the most by a Reds batter in a season since **Ryan Freel** produced 3 leadoff homers in **2006**...no Reds batter has produced more than 3 leadoff homers in a season since **Jerome Walton** had **4** in **1995** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...on 9/16 he was honored in a pregame ceremony at Great American Ball Park...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **114 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **114-78**...allowed first-inning runs in 56 of their 151g this season.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **122 different lineups** in 151g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (36-39 .480): The Reds have won 9 of their last 11 home games...went **5-2** on their most recent homestand (3-0 vs Hou, 2-2 vs Fla)...went **7-13-4 in their 24 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their 12 homestands, including each of their last 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **277-284-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (34-42, .447): The Reds are **1-0** on this road trip (1-0 at Pit, 3g at Hou)...went **10-12-2 in their previous 24 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 11 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**, 4-6)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (170): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 36, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **91** days below .500.

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **977-1,020 all-time** vs the Pirates, including **9-4 this season...at PNC Park:** Reds are 35-33 all-time, including **4-3 this season...last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 8/31-9/2, 2009 (4g)...at Pit: 8/3-8/4, 2007 (2g); 8/26-8/28, 2005 (3g).

Last Pitched: Fri vs Fla, threw 7.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 8 strikeouts but was the victim of a blown save in the 4-3 loss (3h, 2bb, 117 pitches, 76 strikes)...left leading, 2-0, but the Marlins scored 4 unearned runs in the top of the ninth off Cordero and Burton... the Reds lost for the first time all season when leading after 8 innings... had been 57-0.

Red Hots: Is making his 18th start of the season, the 35th start of his Major League career and his third start of the season vs the Pirates...**in his last 6 starts is 3-1, 1.83** (39.1ip, 8er) and twice was the victim of blown saves...in his 17 starts the Reds went 6-11 and scored 74 runs (4.35 r/g)...has 7 quality starts, including 4 of his last 6 apps...a team-high 3 times was the victim of blown saves...from 8/23-9/2 put together a career-high **11-inning scoreless streak**.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...in that 5/23 start vs the Indians became only the sixth different pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season, in the club's 42nd game...was the longest such streak to begin a season since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994** campaign.

At Louisville: In 14 apps for the Bats produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps (5-1, 1.07, 50.1ip, 47h, 6er, 12bb, 45k)...in his first start of the season allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era) and in his last 13 starts posted a 2.03era (84.1ip, 19er)...following his last start for the Bats ranked among the International League leaders in innings pitched (89.2, 1st), wins (8, 2nd), strikeouts (82, 2nd) and ERA (2.71, 10th)...**for the Bats, in 6 starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81.**

IL Pitcher of the Week: Twice this season was named the International League's **Pitcher of the Week**...in 2 starts the week of **4/20-4/26** went 2-0, 2.92 with 18 strikeouts in 12.1 innings (10h, 6bb)...in the 10-3 win at Toledo on 4/26, over 6.1 innings he struck out a career-high 15 batters to run (14.2ip, 11h, 2bb, 14k).

Career Highs: Innings: 8.0, 8/28/09 vs LAD (longest) and 1.2 (shortest, non-injured), 6/26/07 at Phi & 3bf (shortest, injured) 8/12/09 at StL; **Hits:** 15, 7/26/08 vs Col; **Runs:** 9, 7/21/09 at LAD; **Earned Runs:** 7, 7/16/09 vs Mil; **Walks:** 7, 6/27/09 at Cle; **Strikeouts:** 8 (2x), 9/2/09 vs Pit & 9/18/09 vs Fla; **HR allowed:** 3, 6/15/08 vs Bos (Ellsbury solo, Crisp 2-run, Drew solo).

Tomorrow's Pitcher: Bronson Arroyo

Last Pitched: Sat vs Fla and suffered the 3-2 loss (8ip, 6h, 3er, 1bb, 6k, 2hr, 117 pitches, 75 strikes)...left trailing, 3-2...allowed all 3 runs on home runs, including Cantu's solo shot leading off the fifth inning and a pinch-hit, 2-run HR to Gload in the eighth.

Red Hots: Tomorrow will make his 32nd start of the season... posted a **1.99era** in August, a **2.42era** since the All-Star break and a **2.21era** in his last 14 starts (102ip, 25er)...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 11 starts...his 24 wins beginning 6/29/08 are tied for fourth-most in the Major Leagues and his 2.21era since 7/10/09 ranks second...in his 31 starts the Reds went 14-17 and scored 113 runs (3.65 r/g).

Milestones: In each of the last 5 seasons produced at least **30 starts** and **200 innings pitched**...is one of only a handful of pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons...**Dan Haren** (217.1), **Javier Vazquez** (204.1) and **Mark Buehrle** (204.0) already joined that elite club, and others on the cusp are **Andy Pettitte** (184.1) and **Roy Oswalt** (181.1)...**Arroyo** will lead the Reds in starts for the fourth straight season and in innings pitched for the third time in 4 years.

Workhorse: Since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 134 starts and leads the National League with 856.1 innings pitched.

Quality: Leads the pitching staff with 21 quality starts...produced QS in each of his last 11 apps (**3-4, 2.23**, 80.2ip, 20er), the longest streak of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a team-best string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20).

As Luck Would Have It....: Went **9-8, 5.38** in 18 starts before the All-Star break...in the second half is **4-5** in 13 starts despite a sterling **2.42era**.
