Climbing the Standings

At **71-81**, for the second straight day the Reds and Astros are tied for fourth place in the National League Central Division...is Cin's highest spot in the standings since **7/10** (4th, -4.5)...from 7/11 until Tuesday the Redlegs spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds and Astros trail third-place Mil by 4.0g.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **Zach Trdinich's** Pirates and **Game 3** (2-0) of the Reds' final road trip of the season (**2-0 at Pit**, 3g at Hou)...beginning Tuesday, the Redlegs will finish the 2009 season with 6g at **Great American Ball Park** (3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit).

G-20 SUMMIT: The City of Pittsburgh today and tomorrow is hosting the **G-20 Summit**...**President Obama** is chairing this meeting of leaders from countries around the globe that represent 85 percent of the world's economy...the leaders will review the progress made since the Washington and London Summits and will discuss further actions to assure a sound and sustainable recovery from the current global financial and economic crisis...the **Group of Twenty** (G-20) formally was established in 1999 to bring together major industrialized and developing economies to discuss key issues in the global economy.

IN THIS SERIES: **Joey Votto** is 7-for-9 (5 2b, 2rbi, 6r), including a streak in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps that raised BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...**Reds batters** are 30-for-81 (.370, 9 2b), including 14-for-38 with RISP (.368), with 22 runs scored...**Reds pitchers** have posted a 3.00era (18ip, 6er).

DOT. DOT. DOT: The Redlegs have won 3 straight games, 7 of their last 9g and 20 of their last 30g...won the last 7 contests vs the Pirates...**Reds starting pitchers** in the last 5g have posted a **2.18era** (33ip, 8er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 9g have posted a **0.74era** (24.1ip, 2er)...Class AAA Louisville's **Rick Sweet**, the International League Manager of the Year for the second straight season, tomorrow will join the Major League coaching staff to finish the season.

MILESTONES: **Joey Votto** (.314) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (38sv) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

LEADING OFF: The Reds have **3 leadoff home runs** in their last 8g, including 2 by **Drew Stubbs** (9/15 off Hou's **Roy Oswalt**, Sat off Fla's **Ricky Nolasco**) and another by **Darnell McDonald** in his only start of the season batting first (Thu off Fla's **Anibal Sanchez**)...**Stubbs** leads the club with 3 leadoff HR (other, 8/31 off Pit's **Daniel McCutchen**), the most by a Reds batter in a season since **Ryan Freel** produced 3 leadoff homers in **2006**...no Reds batter has produced more than 3 leadoff homers in a season since **Jerome Walton** had **4** in **1995** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **114 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **114-79**...allowed first-inning runs in 56 of their 152g this season.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **122 different lineups** in 152g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

REDS ON THE ROAD (35-42, .455): The Reds are **2-0** on this road trip (**2-0 at Pit**, 3g at Hou)...went **10-12-2 in their previous 24 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 11 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4, 3-3, 2-5, 0-6, 3-3, 4-2, 4-6**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (171): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 37, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **92** days below .500.

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **978-1,020 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 10-4 this season...**Cin won the last 7g vs Pit...at PNC Park:** Reds are 36-33 all-time, including **5-3 this season**...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 8/31-9/2, 2009 (4g)...at Pit: 8/3-8/4, 2007 (2g); 8/26-8/28, 2005 (3g); 7/2-7/5, 1992 (4g).

UP NEXT: REDS at ASTROS: The Reds are 408-382-1 all-time vs the Astros, including **10-3 this season**...won the last 7g overall vs Hou, all in Cin...**at Minute Maid Park:** Reds are 30-47, including **3-1 this season**.

In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, **Bronson Arroyo** made the shortest start of his career and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer (1+ip, 11h, 10er)...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29/08, **Arroyo** has 24 wins, tied for fourth-most in the Major Leagues since then:

In The Big Inning: Allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 12 of his 31 starts...has posted an 6.68era in the first inning (31ip, 23er) and a 3.56era after the first frame (174ip, 69er).

Zeroes: From 8/8-8/19 put together a **17.0-inning scoreless streak**, the longest by a Reds pitcher this season and tying his career high (7/2-7/19, 2004).

Career Highs: **Innings:** 9.0 (longest, 8x), last on 8/13/09 for Cin vs Wsh and 1+4bf (shortest, 2x), 6/24/08 for Cin at Tor & 5/6/09 for Cin vs Mil; **Hits:** 13, 9/26/08 for Cin at StL; **Runs:** 10 (2x), 6/23/00 for Pit at NYM & 6/24/08 for Cin at Tor; **Earned Runs:** 10, 6/24/08 for Cin at Tor; **Walks:** 5 (4x), last on 8/20/08 at Chi; **Strikeouts:** 12, 7/19/04 for Bos at Sea; **HR allowed:** 4, 4/7/08 vs Phi (Rollins leadoff, Burrell 2, Jenkins); **Complete Games:** 9, last on 8/13/09 for Cin vs Wsh (7-0 win); **Shutouts:** 3, last on 8/13/09 for Cin vs Wsh (7-0 win).

Last Pitched: Sat vs Fla and suffered the 3-2 loss (8ip, 6h, 3er, 1bb, 6k, 2hr, 117 pitches, 75 strikes)...left trailing, 3-2...allowed all 3 runs on home runs, including Cantu's solo shot leading off the fifth inning and a pinch-hit, 2-run HR to Gload in the eighth.

Red Hots: Is making his 32nd start of the season...posted a **1.99era** in August, a **2.42era** since the All-Star break and a **2.21era** in his last 14 starts (102ip, 25er)...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 11 starts...in his 31 starts the Reds went 14-17 and scored 113 runs (3.65 r/g).

Milestones: In each of the last 5 seasons produced at least **30 starts** and **200 innings pitched**...is one of only a handful of pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons...**Dan Haren** (217.1), **Mark Buehrle** (207.1) and **Javier Vazquez** (204.1) already joined that elite club...**Arroyo** will lead the Reds in starts for the fourth straight season and in innings for the third time in 4 years.

Quality: Leads the pitching staff with 21 quality starts...produced QS in each of his last 11 apps (**3-4, 2.23**, 80.2ip, 20er), the longest streak of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a team-best string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20).

As Luck Would Have It....: Went **9-8**, **5.38** in 18 starts before the All-Star break...in the second half is **4-5** in 13 starts despite a sterling **2.42era**.

Tomorrow at Astros: LHP Matt Maloney

Last Pitched: Thu vs Fla, pitched instead of sick scheduled starter Johnny Cueto and in the 3-2 win earned his first Major League victory (5ip, 7h, 2er, 1bb, 3k, 1bhp, 96 pitches, 65 strikes)...left leading, 3-2...allowed both runs in the fifth inning on an RBI-single to Ramirez, his 100th RBI of the season, and an RBI-double to Uggla...was his first appearance since 9/8, a start cut short by a blister on his left middle finger.

Red Hots: The 25-year-old lefthander tomorrow at Hou will make his seventh career start, all this season, and his third since he was sidelined for a week with a blister on his left middle finger...will be his first career appearance vs the Astros...at the end of the minor league season was with Class AA Carolina, where he made 1 start after he was optioned there between games of the day/night DH on 8/31 vs Pit...rejoined the club in time for the 9/8 start at Col...in his
