#### Climbing the Standings

At **72-81**, the Reds are in fourth place alone in the National League Central Division...is Cin's highest spot in the standings since **7/10** (4th, -4.5)...from 7/11 until Tuesday the Redlegs spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds trail third-place Mil by 3.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by half a game.

<u>TONIGHT'S GAME</u>: Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs MJ Trahan's Astros and Game 4 (3-0) of the Reds' final road trip of the season (3-0 at Pit, 3g at Hou)...beginning Tuesday, the Redlegs will finish the 2009 championship season with 6g at Great American Ball Park (3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit).

IN THE PIRATES SERIES: Joey Votto went 8-for-13 (6 2b, 4rbi, 7r), including a streak in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps that raised BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...Reds batters vs the Pirates hit .330, including .415 with RISP (17-41), with 11 doubles and 26 runs scored...Reds pitchers posted a 2.33era.

**DOT, DOT.** The Redlegs have won 4 straight games, 8 of their last 10g and 21 of their last 31g...have won the last 7g vs the Astros, all at Great American Ball Park, and have won 15 of their last 17g overall vs **NL Central opponents**... **Reds starting pitchers** in the last 6g have posted a **2.03era** (40ip, 9er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 10g have posted a **0.68era** (26.1ip, 2er)...**Francisco Cordero's** save in yesterday's 4-1 win at Pit was the **250th of his career**...Class AAA Louisville's **Rick Sweet**, the International League Manager of the Year for the second straight season, has joined the Major League coaching staff for the rest of the season.

**ELIAS SAYS...**: In yesterday's 4-1 win at Pit, **Bronson Arroyo** allowed just 1 run in 7.0 innings...was the 11th straight start in which **Arroyo** threw at least 7.0 innings without allowing more than 3 earned runs...according to Elias Sports Bureau, that's the longest such streak by any Major League pitcher sinced **Chris Carpenter** did it in 11 consecutive starts for the Cardinals in 2005.

MILESTONES: Joey Votto (.314) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since Sean Casey (.312) and Ken Griffey Jr. (.301) did it in 2005...RHP Francisco Cordero (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since RHP Jeff Shaw produced 42 saves in 1997.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are RHP Kip Wells and C Ramon Hernandez (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are OF Jonny Gomes, C Corky Miller and OF Laynce Nix...potentially eligible for arbitration as Super 2s are RHP Jared Burton, RHP Nick Masset and RHP Micah Owings.

**LEADING OFE**: The Reds have **3 leadoff home runs** in their last 9g, including 2 by **Drew Stubbs** (9/15 off Hou's **Roy Oswalt**, Sat off Fla's **Ricky Nolasco**) and another by **Darnell McDonald** in his only start of the season batting first (9/17 off Fla's **Anibal Sanchez**)...**Stubbs** leads the club with 3 leadoff HR (other, 8/31 off Pit's **Daniel McCutchen**), the most by a Reds batter in a season since **Ryan Freel** produced 3 leadoff homers in **2006**...no Reds batter has produced more than 3 leadoff homers in a season since **Jerome Walton** had **4** in **1995** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including RHP Carlos Fisher, LHP Matt Maloney, IF Drew Sutton, RHP Robert Manuel, C Craig Tatum, OF Drew Stubbs, LHP Pedro Viola and IF/OF Juan Francisco...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with OF Wladimir Balentien, 1B Kevin Barker, OF Jonny Gomes, C Ramon Hernandez, OF Darnell McDonald, OF Laynce Nix, 3B Scott Rolen, CF Willy Taveras, RHP Justin Lehr, LHP Arthur Rhodes and RHP Kip Wells.

<u>FIRST WATCH</u>: The Reds have allowed **114 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **114-79**...allowed first-inning runs in 56 of their 153g this season.

<u>OPENING DAY LINEUP</u>: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **123 different lineups** in 153g.

SURGERIES: Seven Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including C Ramon Hernandez (cleaned out left knee), SS Alex Gonzalez (removed loose bodies, right elbow), RHP Mike Lincoln (cervical disc replacement), C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), IF Danny Richar (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), RHP Edinson Volquez (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and RHP Aaron Harang (appendectomy).

**REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (36-39 .480)**: The Reds have won 9 of their last 11 home games...went **5-2** on their most recent homestand (3-0 vs Hou, 2-2 vs Fla)...went **7-13-4 in their 24 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their 12 homestands, including each of their last 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **277-284-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (36-42, .462): The Reds are 3-0 on this road trip (3-0 at Pit, 3g at Hou)...went 11-12-2 in their previous 25 road series...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 11 road trips (7-3, 3-2, 3-3, 2-5, 2-4, 3-3, 2-5, 0-6, 3-3, 4-2, 4-6)...entering this season and dating to 2006, the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips.

IN THE STANDINGS (172): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 38, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at 20-14 and 26-20 were a season-high 6g over .500...at 51-71 were a season-high 20g under .500...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high 20.5-game deficits...have spent 64 days above, 15 days at and 93 days below .500.

<u>REDS vs ASTROS</u>: The Reds are 408-382-1 all-time vs the Astros, including **10-3 this season**...won the last 7g overall vs Hou, all in Cin...the Reds' 4-2 win at Minute Maid Park on 4/19/09 was their 400th victory vs Hou...<u>at Minute Maid Park</u>: Reds are 30-47, including **3-1 this season**.

2B Brandon Phillips is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in 3 consecutive seasons...Phillips and Fla's Hanley Ramirez are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years...listed below are the only 4 Reds players to reach those milestones in at least 3 seasons:

#### Disabled

This season Nineteen players made 21 apps on the Reds' disabled list...the 19 disabled players is the club's highest total since 2003, when 19 players were disabled 25 times...6 Reds players currently are on the disabled list.

Last Pitched: Thu vs Fla, pitched instead of sick scheduled starter Johnny Cueto and in the 3-2 win earned his first Major League victory (5ip, 7h, 2er, 1bb, 3k, 1hbp, 96 pitches, 65 strikes)...left leading, 3-2...allowed both runs in the fifth inning on an RBI-single to Ramirez, his 100th RBI of the season, and an RBI-double to Uggla...was his first appearance since 9/8, a start cut short by a blister on his left middle finger.

**Red Hots**: The 25-year-old lefthander is making his seventh career start, all this season, and his third since he was sidelined for a week with a blister on his left middle finger...is his first career appearance vs the Astros...at

the end of the minor league season was with Class AA Carolina, where he made 1 start after he was optioned there between games of the day/night DH on 8/31 vs Pit...rejoined the club in time for the 9/8 start at Col...in his previous 6 starts the Reds went 2-4 and scored 13 runs (2.17 r/g)...has 1 quality start, in his Major League debut...on 6/6 vs Cubs made his Major League debut after 99 minor league apps and 98 minor league starts...was born in **Sandusky**, **Ohio** and lives in **Columbus**... graduated from **Huron (OH) High School**.

Long Ball: Allowed 2 home runs in each of his first 4 Major League starts but none in 2 starts since then...has allowed 18 runs overall, including 11 runs produced by the 8 homers (5 solo, three 2-run HR)...became the first pitcher to allow multiple homers in his first 4 career starts since Brett Hinchliffe allowed at least 2 homers in all 5 of his starts for the Mariners and Mets from 1999-2001, the only starts of his Major League career (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

Southpaw: Is the only lefthanded pitcher to start a game for the Reds this season...when he debuted on 6/6 became only the second LHP to start a game for the Reds over a stretch of 236 games...in 2008, righthanders started Cin's first 161 games until Adam Pettyjohn took the hill for the season finale...Pettyjohn's start snapped a streak of 180 consecutive starts by Reds righthanders...according to Elias Sports Bureau, prior to Maloney's debut only the Reds, Padres and Cardinals had not started a lefthanded pitcher to that point in the season...StL remains the only team in the Major Leagues that has not started a LHP.

Major League Debut: On 6/6 vs Cubs, in his Major League debut was the victim of a blown save in the 11-inning, 4-3 victory (6+ip, 6h, 2er, 1bb, 4k, 1hbp, 2hr, 89 pitches, 58 strikes)...left leading, 3-2, but the Cubs tied it in the eighth inning with a run off Weathers...allowed both runs on solo homers, by Scales with 2 outs in the fourth inning and by Soto leading off the seventh...stranded 4 baserunners, all in the first 2 innings...first career strikeout victim was Dempster...singled off Dempster in his first career plate appearance...pitched in front of a sellout crowd...was the second Reds player to make a Major League debut this season (RHP Carlos Fisher).

In The Minors: Began the season with Louisville and in 10 starts there went 4-3, 2.00 before he was recalled on 6/6 to start against the Cubs...when promoted led the Bats' staff in starts (10, tied with **Homer Bailey**), innings pitched (67.1) and strikeouts (58)...in his last 5 starts for Louisville prior to that 6/6 promotion went 2-2, 0.73...in 12 starts after he returned to the Bats following his stint with the Reds went 5-6, 4.04 (75.2ip, 34er)...made another start for the Reds, on 8/29 vs LA, but between games of the 8/31 DH vs Pit was optioned to Carolina, where he made 1 appearance before he was promoted for a third time on 9/8...was the organization's Minor League Pitcher of the Month for April (3gs, 2-0, 1.86).

At The Plate: As a batter for Louisville hit .316 (1hr, 2rbi, 5sh), including a solo home run on 4/17 at Indianapolis off **Daniel McCutchen**...in his first Major League plate appearance singled off Chi's **Ryan Dempster**...became first Reds pitcher to record a hit in his first career plate appearance since **Scott Randall** singled off **Kip Wells** on **9/18/03** at **Pit**...in the 6-3 loss vs Cubs on 6/6 pinch hit in the 14th inning and struck out to end the game.

Maloney's Most Recent Starts: 6/12 at KC, in his second career start suffered the 4-1 loss (6ip, 6h, 4er, 2bb, 5k, 2hr, 104 pitches, 63 strikes)...left trailing, 4-1... allowed a solo HR to Butler in the first inning, an RBI-single to DeJesus in the fifth and a 2-run HR to Callaspo in the sixth...Hochevar threw his first career complete game (3h, 80 pitches, 57 strikes)...length of game was 2:12...6/18 vs Atl and suffered the 7-0 loss (5.2ip, 6h, 6er, 2bb, 5k, 2hr, 106 pitches, 69 strikes)...left trailing, 4-0, but was charged with 2 more runs scored off Fisher...allowed a solo HR to Diaz in the fourth inning and a 2-run HR to McLouth in the fifth...8/29 vs LAD and suffered the 11-4 loss (6ip, 8h, 5er, 2bb, 5k, 2hr, 95 pitches, 59 strikes)...left trailing, 5-4...allowed a 2-run HR to Ramirez in the first inning and a solo HR to Furcal in the fifth that snapped 4-4 tie...the Dodgers scored 6 runs in the seventh inning off Fisher (5r) and Herrera (1r)...2 days later was optioned to Carolina between games of a doubleheader vs Pit...9/8 at Col and suffered the 3-1 loss (5ip, 4h, 1er, 0bb, 2k, 66 pitches, 41 strikes)...left trailing, 1-0, with a blister on his left middle finger... didn't pitch again until 9/17 vs Fla.

#### Tomorrow's Pitcher: RHP Justin Lehr

<u>Last Pitched</u>: On 9/16 vs Hou, tied the club record by allowing 5 home runs but received no decision in the 6-5 win (5ip, 11h, 5er, 1bb, 6k, 99 pitches, 67 strikes)...left trailing, 5-4, but the Reds scored a run in the sixth and another in the seventh...allowed solo HR to Matsui, Lee, Keppinger (2) and Blum...tied his career high with 11 hits allowed.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced LEER...media guide bio is avavailable in the press box...tomorrow will make his 10th career start, all this season, and his third appearance since skipping a start with a sore right groin...was scheduled to start on 9/7 at Col but was scratched with the injury...in his 2 starts since then is 0-1, 9.31 (9.2ip, 10er)...in August led the staff in wins (3)...in his 9 starts the Reds went 5-4 and scored 47 runs (5.22 r/g)...has 3 quality starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another...on 7/31 vs Col made his first Major League appearance since 5/22/06 for Mil at Cin and his first career big league start...on 8/5 vs Chi earned his first career victory since 5/18/06 vs Phi (5-4 Brewers win)...on 8/11 at StL singled off Mitchell Boggs for his first Major League hit.

Most Valuable Pitcher: Was named the International League's Most Valuable Pitcher...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville combined to finish 13-3, 3.31 in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...3 times was IL Pitcher of the week...was the starting pitcher for the IL in the Triple-A All-Star Game in Portland.
