2B Brandon Phillips is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in *3 consecutive seasons*...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years.

Player of the Week

1B Joey Votto this week leads all Major League batters in hitting (.619), doubles (10), extra-base hits (11), total bases (26) and runs scored (11)...has 10 doubles in his last 5g...he is the first Major League player to produce 10 doubles over a 5-game span in a single season since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

TODAY'S GAME: Is the Reds' last road game of the year, **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs popular broadcaster **Bill Brown's** Astros and **Game 6** (5-0) of this season-ending road trip (3-0 at Pit, **2-0 at Hou**)...beginning Tuesday, the Redlegs will finish the 2009 championship season with 6g at **Great American Ball Park** (3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit).

STREAKING: During the Reds' current 6-game winning streak **Joey Votto** is 14-for-25 (.560, 10 2b, 2hr, 10rbi, 12r), including a stretch Tue and Wed at Pit in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps that raised his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...**Votto** leads all Major Leaguers in hitting beginning 9/10 (28-60, .467, 14 2b, 2hr, 12rbi)...**Reds batters** during the winning streak are hitting .344 (77-224), including .400 with RISP (32-80), with 21 doubles and 54 runs scored (9 r/g)...**Reds pitchers** during the winning streak have posted a 2.67era (54ip, 16er).

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: For the fifth straight day the Reds are in fourth place in the National League Central Division...is Cin's highest spot in the standings since **7/10** (4th, -4.5)...from 7/11 until Tuesday the Redlegs spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds trail third-place Mil by 3.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by 2.5g.

DOT. DOT. DOT: The Redlegs have won 6 straight games, 10 of their last 12g and 23 of their last 33g...have won the last 9g vs the Astros and 17 of their last 19g overall vs **NL Central opponents**...scored at least 10 runs in 4 of their last 5 games...**Reds starting pitchers** in the last 9g have posted a **2.68era** (57ip, 17er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 12g have posted a **1.11era** (32.1ip, 4er)...the Reds have just 1 error in their last 7g and 4 errors in their last 18g...tomorrow **RHP Micah Owings** will celebrate his 27th birthday.

MILESTONES: **Brandon Phillips** (95rbi) is trying to become only the second Reds second baseman ever to produce 100rbi in a season (**Joe Morgan**, 110rbi as a 2B in 1976)...**Joey Votto** (.319) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**...**Bronson Arroyo** is 9 strikeouts shy of **1,000** for his career.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

LEADING OFF: The Reds have **3 leadoff home runs** in their last 11g, including 2 by **Drew Stubbs** (9/15 off Hou's **Roy Oswalt**, 9/19 off Fla's **Ricky Nolasco**) and another by **Darnell McDonald** in his only start of the season batting first (9/17 off Fla's **Anibal Sanchez**)...**Stubbs** leads the club with 3 leadoff HR (other, 8/31 off Pit's **Daniel McCutchen**), the most by a Reds batter in a season since **Ryan Freel** produced 3 leadoff homers in **2006**...no Reds batter has produced more than 3 leadoff homers in a season since **Jerome Walton** had **4** in **1995** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **125 different lineups** in 155g.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (36-39 .480): The Reds have won 9 of their last 11 home games...went **5-2** on their most recent homestand (3-0 vs Hou, 2-2 vs Fla)...went **7-13-4 in their 24 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their 12 homestands, including each of their last 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **277-284-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-42, .475): The Reds are **5-0** on this road trip (3-0 at Pit, **2-0 at Hou**)...including this one went **12-12-2 in their 26 road series**...including this one produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**, 4-6, **5-0**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (174): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 40, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **95** days below .500.

REDS vs ASTROS: The Reds are 410-382-1 all-time vs the Astros, including **12-3 this season**...have won the last 9g vs Hou...the Reds' 12 wins are the most vs Hou in a season since 1995 (12-1)...haven't won 13g vs Hou in a season since 1987 (13-5)...**at Minute Maid Park:** Reds are 32-47, including **5-1 this season**...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 9/22, 1992 (2g, DH); 9/14-9/16, 2009 (3g); 5/21-5/24, 2004 (4g)...at Hou: 9/14-9/15, 1981 (2g); 6/2-6/4, 2006 (3g).

UP NEXT: REDS vs CARDINALS: The Reds are 934-1,059 all-time vs the Cardinals, including 6-7 this season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 27-26, including 3-3 this season...**Albert Pujols'** 15 homers there trail only **Lance Berkman's** 21 as the most by a visiting player.

Last Pitched: Tue at Pit, in his first appearance since 9/12 earned the 10-4 victory (5ip, 9h, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 1hr, 101 pitches, 68 strikes)...left leading, 5-2...allowed a leadoff HR to McCutchen and an RBI-double by Cedeno in the fourth inning...missed his previous start with a throat infection.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander is making his 29th start of the season, his fifth since a stint on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...was on the DL from **8/20-8/31**...in 4 starts since then is **2-0, 2.95** (21.1ip, 7er)...missed a scheduled start on 9/17 vs Fla with a throat infection...leads the Major Leagues in hit batsmen (14, tied with Mil's Dave Bush) and 3 times hit 2 batters in a game...has 13 quality starts...in his 28 starts the Reds went 15-13 and scored 117 runs (4.18 r/g)...in 9 of his 28 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 17 of his 28 starts threw at least 6.0 innings.

Streaking: The 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit snapped his career-high 6-game losing streak...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69 and made a strong bid for a spot on the National League All-Star team...**in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64** until he went on the DL...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went **4-0, 1.25**...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since **Tim Belcher** had a 4-game run from **5/27-6/13, 1992** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).

Cueto's 2009 Starts vs Astros: **4/17 at Hou**, in his second start of the season received no decision in the 2-1 victory...left trailing, 1-0...allowed only 1 hit through 4.2 scoreless innings - an infield single by Tejada leading off the fourth - but with 2 outs in the fifth walked Oswalt and Bourn, allowed a single to Tejada and then walked Berkman to force in the game's first run...Lincoln then came in to induce Lee to ground out and end the inning...Cueto, Lincoln, Herrera, Masset and Cordero held Astros hitters to 4 singles...**4/27 vs Hou** and received no decision in the 4-1 loss...left with the score tied, 1-1...allowed only a solo HR to Berkman leading off the sixth inning, snapping his scoreless streak at career-high 12 innings...the Astros scored 3 runs in the ninth off Cordero.

Tuesday vs Cardinals: Homer Bailey

Last Pitched: Wed at Pit and earned the 12-2 victory (6ip, 4h, 2er, 3bb, 0k, 1wp, 95 pitches, 58 strikes)...left leading, 9-2...allowed only a pair of sac flies, to Moss in the fourth inning and to Jones in the fifth...the 10-run win was the Reds' largest margin of victory of the season.

Red Hots: On Tue vs StL will make his 19th start of the season and the 36th start of his Major League career...**in his last 7 starts is 4-1, 1.99** and twice was the victim of blown saves...in his 18 starts the Reds went 7-11 and scored 86 runs (4.78 r/g)...has 8 quality starts, including 5 of his last 7 apps...a team-high 3 times was the victim of blown saves.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...has been with the Reds since then...twice this season was named the International League's **Pitcher of the Week**...in 2 starts the week of **4/20-4/26** went 2-0, 2.92 with 18 strikeouts in 12.1 innings (10h, 6bb)...in the 10-3 win at Toledo on 4/26, over 6.1 innings he struck out a career-high 15 batters to tie the Louisville single-game record...in 2 starts from **6/1-6/7** went 2-0 without allowing a run (14.2ip, 11h, 2bb, 14k).
