International League Stars

In on-field ceremonies prior to tonight's game the Reds will recognize International League Manager of the Year **Rick Sweet** and IL Most Valuable Pitcher **Justin Lehr**...**Sweet's** Louisville Bats produced the best record in the league at **84-58** (.592)...he is the first manager to win the award in consecutive seasons since Richmond's **Eddie Haas** was recognized in 1981 and 1982...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville, **Lehr** combined to finish **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...he tied for the IL lead in wins and ranked fourth in ERA, 3 times was the league's Pitcher of the Week and was the starting pitcher for the IL in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland...here tonight to present the awards are Reds President of Baseball Operations and GM **Walt Jocketty**, International League President **Randy Mobley** and Bats President **Gary Ulmer**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs the National League Central Division champion Cardinals and **Game 2** (1-0) of the Reds' final homestand of the season...will finish the 2009 campaign here this weekend with a 3-game set vs the **Pirates**.

STREAKING: The Reds have won 7 of their last 8g, 11 of their last 14g and 24 of their last 35g...in the last 14g **Reds** batters are hitting .297 (140-472) with 85 runs scored (6 r/g), including a team-best .490 by **Joey Votto** (25-51, 13 2b, 12rbi)...**Reds pitchers** in the last 14g have posted a 2.53era (125ip, 36er).

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs have won 18 of their last 21g vs **NL Central** opponents and are **43-32 (.573)** within the division overall...Cin's 17 wins this month are the most in September since **2000** (18-11)...**Reds relievers** in the last 14g have posted a 1.29era (35ip, 5er), dropping the bullpen's overall ERA from **3.70** to **3.53**...**Reds defenders** have produced a **.985 fielding percentage**, which would establish a franchise record for a non-strike season (.984, 6 times, last in 2007).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **1B Joey Votto** has **15 doubles** in September, tying the club record for a calendar month established by **Harry Heilmann** in **July 1930**...last week he became the first Major League batter to hit 10 doubles in a 5-game span since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...hit 5 of those doubles vs the Pirates as part of a stretch in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps, raising his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...no Major League player has produced more than 15 doubles in a month since Bal's **Brian Roberts** had 17 in **June 2008** and no National League batter has done it since Phi's **Aaron Rowand** had 16 doubles in **July 2007**...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: For the eighth straight day the Reds are in fourth place in the National League Central Division...before climbing to fourth last Wed, the Reds spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds trail third-place Mil by 2.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by 2.0g...**can clinch fourth place** with any combination of Reds wins and Astros losses totaling 4.

MILESTONES: **Brandon Phillips** (95rbi) is trying to become only the second Reds second baseman ever to produce 100rbi in a season (**Joe Morgan**, 1976, 110 of his 111rbi as a 2B)...**Joey Votto** (.319) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**...**Bronson Arroyo** enters tonight's final start 9 strikeouts shy of **1,000** for his career.

20-20-20: **Brandon Phillips** is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in *3 consecutive seasons*...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **127 different lineups** in 157g.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (37-39 .487): The Reds have won 10 of their last 12 home games...are **1-0** on this homestand (**1-0 vs StL**, 3g vs Pit)...went **7-13-4 in their previous 24 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their previous 12 homestands, including each of their last 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2, 5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **278-284-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-43, .469): The Reds went **12-12-2 in their 26 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3, 4-2**, 4-6, **5-1**).

IN THE STANDINGS (177): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 44, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **98** days below .500.

REDS vs CARDINALS: The Reds are 935-1,059 all-time vs the Cardinals, including 7-7 this season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 28-26, including 4-3 this season...**Albert Pujols'** 15 homers here trail only **Lance Berkman's** 21 as the most by a visiting player...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 5/1-5/2, 2006 (2g); 9/11-9/13, 2007 (3g); 5/5-5/8, 2003 (4g).

Beginning with his 3-0 win at NYM on 7/10, Bronson Arroyo's 2.15era ranks second among all Major League pitchers (min. 15gs): Adam Wainwright 10-3, 1.98 BRONSON ARROYO 6-5, 2.15 Jair Jurrjens..... 8-3, 2.28 Chris Carpenter 10-1, 2.29 Felix Hernandez 9-2, 2.43 CC Sabathia 11-2, 2.64

Wins Beginning 6/29/08
In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, Bronson Arroyo made the shortest start of his career and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer (1+ip, 11h, 10er)...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29/08, Arroyo has 25 wins, tied for third-most in the Major Leagues since then: CC Sabathia 30-9, 2.68 Roy Halladay 28-15, 2.74 BRONSON ARROYO .. 25-17, 3.77 Justin Verlander..... 25-17, 3.98 Cliff Lee 25-14, 3.02

Iron Man

Since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season, **Bronson Arroyo** ranks among the Major League leaders in games started and innings pitched:

innings pitched...is 1 of only 4 pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons, a club that also includes **Dan Haren** (223.1), **Javier Vazquez** (213.1) and **Mark Buehrle** (207.1)...**Andy Pettitte** (190.1) will fall shy of the mark...**Arroyo** will lead the Reds in starts for the fourth straight season and in innings pitched for the third time in 4 years.

Quality: Leads the pitching staff with 22 quality starts...produced QS in each of his last 12 apps (**4-4, 2.16**, 87.2ip, 21er), the longest streak of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a team-best string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20)...no Reds pitcher has produced a string of more than 12 straight quality starts since **Jose Rijo** had **15 straight** quality apps from **7/6-9/15, 1993**.

Last Pitched: Thu at Pit and earned the 4-1 victory (7ip, 5h, 1er, 1bb, 4k, 1hr, 108 pitches, 78 strikes)...left leading, 4-1...allowed only a solo HR to Milledge leading off the seventh inning...Cordero earned his 250th career save.

Red Hots: Is making his 33rd start of the season...with 14 wins in 1 shy of his career high (2008)...is 9 strikeouts shy of 1,000...beginning 7/10 has posted a **2.15era** in 15 starts (109ip, 26er), the second-best ERA in the Major Leagues since then (**Adam Wainwright**, 1.98)...his 25 wins beginning 6/29/08 are tied for third-most in the Major Leagues...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 12 starts...in his 32 starts the Reds went 15-17 and scored 117 runs (3.66 r/g).

Streaking: In each of his last 11 starts threw at least 7.0 innings without allowing more than 3 earned runs (1.99era, 81.1ip, 18er)...according to Elias Sports Bureau, that's the longest such streak by any Major League pitcher since **Chris Carpenter** did it in 11 straight starts in 2005...no Major League pitcher has produced more than 11 consecutive starts of at least 7ip and 3er or fewer in a single season since **Curt Schilling** did it in 12 straight starts from **6/25-8/21, 2002**...since 1900, no Reds pitcher ever produced more than 11 consecutive starts of 7ip and 3er or fewer.

Milestones: In each of the last 5 seasons produced at least **32 starts** and **200**
