Red Hot

Brandon Phillips has hit safely in 4 straight games (10-15, .667, 2hr, 6rbi), including two 2-hit games and two 3-hit games, and in 11-13g (22-54, .407, 2hr, 10rbi)...he leads all National League second basemen with 85rbi and 23 stolen bases...according to Elias Sports Bureau, his .571 batting average (16-28) over the last 8g is the highest of any player in the Major Leagues with at least 20ab over that span....Pit's Lastings Milledge is second at .542 (13-24).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (1-0) of a 3-game series vs **Alex Ritchey's** Braves and **Game 2** (1-0) of a 10-game road trip that includes upcoming visits to Col's **Coors Field** (4g) and the friendly confines of Chi's **Wrigley Field** (3g)...will be the Reds' first 4-game series in **Denver** since **April 1998** and the third of their 3 scheduled trips to **Chicago**...tonight's game is **Game 2** (1-0) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive days**, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (**1-0 at Atl**, 4g at Col, 3g at Chi, 3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla)...their next day off is **Mon, 9/21**...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with 13g at **Great American Ball Park** and 15g on the road.

REHAB WATCH: **OF Jay Bruce** (broken right wrist) and **C Ryan Hanigan** (concussion) last night made their second rehab apps with Louisville and participated in the longest game in the history of Indianapolis' **Victory Field**...in the Bats' 16-inning, 4-2 win **Bruce** played RF and went 0-for-3 with a walk and a run scored, while **Hanigan** caught and went 1-for-4 with a double and a run scored...**Bruce** (2g, 0-6, 1bb, 1r on rehab) has been eligible to come off the DL since 7/27, **Hanigan** (2g, 2-7, 1 2b, 1r on rehab) will be eligible Wednesday.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs are **0-8 on Saturdays** since their 5-2 win at StL on **5/4**...with 773 career apps **LHP Arthur Rhodes** ranks 48th on that all-time list...**Don Sutton** is 47th with 774 apps...at **52-0** the Reds club is the National League's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **109 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues and have been outscored in the opening frame, **109-71**...allowed first-inning runs in 53 of their 134g this season.

STAFF EXPANSION: Reds minor league field coordinator **Freddie Benavides** has joined manager **Dusty Baker's** coaching staff...on 9/14, **Benavides** will be replaced by Class AA Carolina manager **David Bell**...on 9/22, Class AAA Louisville manager **Rick Sweet** will join the staff in relief of **Bell**.

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...he will be honored in a pregame ceremony on **Wed, 9/16**...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **111 different lineups** in 134g.

SURGERIES: Seven Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: When he pitches **LHP Pedro Viola** (pronounced vee-OLA) will become the seventh Reds player this season to make his Major League debut, joining **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum** and **OF Drew Stubbs**...in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto**, **IF Paul Janish**, **OF Jay Bruce**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Daryl Thompson**, **IF Adam Rosales**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **RHP Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

EMMY AWARD: For the second consecutive year, Reds TV rightsholder **FOX Sports Ohio** has won an **Emmy Award** for its *Reds Live* pre-game show (sports programs category)...congratulations to hosts **Jim Day** and **Jeff Picoro**, producer **Kent Weaver** and directors **Brian Hunterman** and **Roy Alfors**...FOX Sports Ohio also won an **Emmy** for its **Columbus Blue Jackets** NHL game coverage (live sporting event category).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (31-37 .456): The Reds' current 4-game home winning streak ties their season high (5/24-5/27)...went 5-2 on their most recent homestand (1-2 vs LAD, 4-0 vs Pit), including their first 4-game home sweep of the **Pirates** since **August 1975**...went **6-13-3 in their 22 home series**...produced a winning record on 3 of their 11 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **272-282-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...last season established the ballpark record for victories in a season (43-38)...at **217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (30-36 .455): The Reds' current 5-game road winning streak is their longest of the season...are 1-0 on this road trip (1-0 at Atl, 4g at Col, 3g at Chi)...went **9-10-2 in their previous 21 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 10 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (152): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 59, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on **8/30** were a season-high **19.5 games out of first place**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **73** days below .500.

REDS vs BRAVES: The Reds are 1,073-964 all-time vs the Braves franchise, including 4-3 this season...**at Turner Field:** Reds are 17-28, including 1-0 this season...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 9/28-9/29, 1987 (2g); 5/30-6/1, 2008 (3g); 4/9-4/13, 1980 (4g)...at Atl: 4/15-4/16, 1986 (2g); 7/16-7/18, 2007 (3g); 4/13-4/16, 1990 (4g).

IF Paul Janish pitched in the ninth inning of the 15-3 loss vs Mil on 5/6 (1ip, 5h, 5er, 0bb, 2k, Fielder 2-run HR) and in the eighth inning of the historic 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (1ip, 4h, 6er, 2bb, 1k, Werth grand slam)...he became the first Reds position player to pitch since Lenny Harris on 6/1/98 at SF and the first Reds position player to pitch more than once in a season since OF Mel Queen took the mound 7 times during the second half of the 1966 campaign.				

Reds Pitchers: Rank 10th in the National League with a 4.35 staff ERA...**on the road trip are 1-0, 1.00 (9ip, 1er)...in the last 12g are 10-2, 3.49 (116ip, 45er)...**already have 11 team shutouts, their highest total since they had 11sho in 1999...haven't had more than 11 shutouts since 1990, when they threw 12...had 6 shutouts all of last year.

Reds Starters: Rank 12th in the National League with a 4.71 rotation ERA...**on the road trip are 1-0, 1.29 (7ip, 1er)...in the last 12g are 7-1, 3.22 (78.1ip, 28er)...**have produced 64 quality starts (**Arroyo 18, Harang 14, Cueto 12, Owings 6, Bailey 6, Volquez 3, Lehr 3, Maloney 1, Wells 1**)...the Reds went 45-19 in those quality starts (.703)...from **6/3-6/10** produced a season-high **7 consecutive quality starts**, their best stretch since they threw 8 consecutive QS from **8/6-8/14, 2005**...through the first 41g of the season used just 5 starting pitchers, their longest such streak to begin a year since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994 campaign**...on 5/23 vs Cle, in the club's 42nd game, **RHP Homer Bailey** became the Reds' sixth starting pitcher...**Aaron Harang** threw a 3-hitter in the 2-0 win vs Pit in the club's fifth game of the season...was the earliest complete game by a Reds pitcher since **Pete Harnisch** beat the Cardinals, 3-0 in Busch Stadium, in the **fourth** contest of the **1999** campaign.

Reds Relievers: Rank third in the National League with a 3.66 bullpen ERA (LAD 3.19, SF 3.52)...**on the road trip are 0-0-1, 0.00 (2ip, 0r)...in the last 12g are 3-1, 4.06 (37.2ip, 17er)...**in 7.1 innings during the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 13r/12er, the bullpen's highest single-game totals since identical totals in a 16-3 loss on **6/1/98 at SF**...bullpen's ERA excluding that game drops from 3.66 to 3.46 (408ip, 157er)...didn't blow a save until the club's 36th game, a 6-5 loss in 16 innings on 5/16 at SD...for the second straight season the Reds' bullpen was the last in the Major Leagues to suffer a blown save...in 2008 didn't blow a save until the 41st game (5/14)...over the last 2 seasons **Cordero** has recorded **65** of the bullpen's **67** saves (34sv in 2008, 31sv in 2009)...**David Weathers** (6/10/09 at Wsh) and **Micah Owings** (9/1/09 vs Pit) have the club's only other 2 saves over the last 2 seasons.

41g, 0-0-0, 5.10

Has posted a 3.18era in 10 apps since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list (11.1ip, 4er)...from 7/26-8/9 was on the DL with right shoulder fatigue...made rehab apps for Dayton (1g, 1ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 3k) and Louisville (2g, 1-0, 2ip, 0h, 0bb, 2k)...began the season with Cin and posted a 6.33era in 20 apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 6/1, when Edinson Volquez came off the disabled list...never left the team and was recalled the next day, when Volquez returned to the disabled list...posted a 2.19era in 9 more apps for the Reds before he was optioned to Louiville on 7/1...returned to Cin on 7/20 and made 2 more apps before he went on the disabled list with the right shoulder injury...overall made 10 apps for Louisville (3-0, 0.82, 11ip, 8h, 1er, 3bb, 10k).

Was an All-Star for the third time (2004 for Tex, 2007 for Mil)...has recorded at least 30 saves for the third straight season and for the fifth time in the last 6 seasons...with 31 saves ranks among the National League leaders...converted 31-33 save opps...including last season has recorded 65 of the bullpen's last 67 saves (34sv in 2008, 31sv in 2009, Weathers 1sv in 2009, Owings 1sv in 2009)...with 242 career saves ranks 29th on that all-time list...Dan Quisenberry is 28th with 244...in the 3-0 victory on 4/22 at Chi recorded his 100th save in the National League to become only the 11th pitcher in history with at least 100 saves in each league (see box).
