Today's Transaction

Today the Reds returned from a rehabilitation assignment and reinstated from the 15-day disabled list **C Ryan Hanigan** (#29)...since 8/25 he had been on the DL with a concussion suffered 2 days earlier at Pit on a foul tip off his face mask...made 5 rehab apps at Louisville (.389, 2 doubles, 2rbi, 1 walk, 4 runs scored).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (0-2) of a 4-game series vs **Jimmy Hartley's** Rockies and **Game 6** (3-2) of a 10-game road trip that included a weekend sweep at Atl's **Turner Field** (3-0) and entails an upcoming series at the friendly confines of Chi's **Wrigley Field** (3g)...is the Reds' first 4-game series in **Denver** since **April 1998**...tonight's game is **Game 6** (3-2) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive days**, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (3-0 at Atl, **0-2 at Col**, 3g at Chi, 3g vs Hou, 4g vs Fla)...their next day off is **Mon, 9/21**...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with 13g at **Great American Ball Park** and 11g on the road.

REHAB WATCH: **OF Jay Bruce** (broken right wrist) is on a rehabilitation assignment with Louisville (5g, .278, 5-18, 2bb, 3k, 2sb, 3r)...the Bats play at Durham tonight in the first game of the International League playoffs (best-of-5 series)...**Bruce** has been eligible to come off the disabled list since 7/27.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Reds have won 7 of their last 9g and 12 of their last 16g...**Dusty Baker** has **1,299 victories** as a Major League manager...at **53-0** the Reds club is the NL's only undefeated team when leading after 8 innings.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **110 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues and have been outscored in the opening frame, **110-71**...allowed first-inning runs in 54 of their 138g this season.

MICAH UPDATE: **RHP Micah Owings** left Sun's 4-2 victory at Atl after he was hit in the helmet by a **Kenshin Kawakami** pitch with the bases loaded in the top of the 12th inning...he did not have symptoms of a concussion but suffered a perforation to his left ear drum and a cut to his face that required 5 stitches...a CT scan was normal...**Owings** is expected to fly to Chicago tomorrow and work out with the team on Friday, when his playing status will be updated...the HBP forced in the run that snapped the 2-2 tie and made **Owings** the winning pitcher.

STAFF EXPANSION: Reds minor league field coordinator **Freddie Benavides** has joined manager **Dusty Baker's** coaching staff...on Monday, **Benavides** will be replaced by Class AA Carolina manager **David Bell**...on 9/22, Class AAA Louisville manager **Rick Sweet** will join the staff in relief of **Bell**.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **114 different lineups** in 138g.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUTS: **Seven** Reds players made their Major League debuts this season, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs** and **LHP Pedro Viola**...in 2008, 10 Reds players made their Major League debuts: **RHP Johnny Cueto**, **IF Paul Janish**, **OF Jay Bruce**, **LHP Daniel Ray Herrera**, **RHP Daryl Thompson**, **IF Adam Rosales**, **OF Chris Dickerson**, **RHP Ramon Ramirez**, **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** and **RHP Josh Roenicke**.

MINOR MATTERS: Carolina **1B Yonder Alonso** was named **Carolina League Player of the Week** after leading the league in hitting (.458), on-base percentage (.536), hits (11), doubles (4), extra-base hits (5) and runs (6)...**Juan Francisco** and **RHP Mark Serrano** were named the organization's **Minor League Players of the Month for August**...**Francisco** played at Class AA Carolina and Class AAA Louisville and in 29g combined to hit .381 with 10 doubles, 1 triple, 8hr and 27rbi...**Serrano** pitched for Class A Dayton and went 2-1, 2.08 in 6 starts (30.1ip, 20h, 6bb, 30k).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (31-37 .456): The Reds' current 4-game home winning streak ties their season high (5/24-5/27)...went 5-2 on their most recent homestand (1-2 vs LAD, 4-0 vs Pit), including their first 4-game home sweep of the **Pirates** since **August 1975**...went **6-13-3 in their 22 home series**...produced a winning record on 3 of their 11 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **272-282-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

REDS ON THE ROAD (32-38 .457): The Reds are **3-2** on this road trip (3-0 at Atl, **0-2 at Col**, 3g at Chi)...went **10-10-2 in their previous 22 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their previous 10 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3, 4-2**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (156): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: **FIRST** - 1, **SECOND** - 9, **THIRD** - 46, **FOURTH** - 35, **FIFTH** - 63, **SIXTH** - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on **8/30** were a season-high **19.5 games out of first place**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **77** days below .500.

REDS vs ROCKIES: The Reds are 71-69 all-time vs the Rockies, including 0-5 this season and 1-5 in 2008...since **6/2/07** have lost 12 of their last 13g vs Col, including each of the last 7g...the Reds and Rockies are playing a 4-game series for the first time since **7/13-7/16, 2006** at Cin (4-0 Reds sweep) and are playing a 4-game series at Coors Field for the first time since **4/10-4/13, 1998** (Reds won series, 3-1)...**at Coors Field:** Reds are 25-34, including 0-2 this season and 1-2 in 2008...the Reds were involved in 3 of the highest scoring games in Coors Field history (24-12 win on 5/19/99, 18-7 wins on 4/10/98 & 8/29/96)...went 3-7 at Mile High Stadium...**last Rockies sweep:** at Cin: 7/31-8/2, 2009 (3g)...at Col: 7/23, 1998 (2g, day/night DH); 6/3-6/5, 2005 (3g).

In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, Bronson Arroyo made the shortest start of his career and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer (1+ip, 11h, 10er)...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29/08, Arroyo has 23 wins, tied for third-most in the Major Leagues since then:

Last Pitched: Fri at Atl and earned the 3-1 victory (7ip, 6h, 1er, 3bb, 4k, 1hr, 99 pitches, 64 strikes)...left leading, 3-1... allowed only McLouth's solo HR with 2 outs in the sixth inning.

Red Hots: Is making his 29th start of the season...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 8 starts...posted a **1.99era** in 6 starts in August...his 23 wins beginning 6/29/08 are tied for third-most in the Major Leagues (see box to the left)...in his previous 28 starts the Reds went 13-15 and scored 105 runs (3.75 r/g).

Quality: Leads the pitching staff with 18 quality starts...produced QS in each of his last 8 apps (**2-3, 2.15**, 58.2ip, 14er), the longest streak of quality starts by a Reds pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a team-best string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20).

As Luck Would Have It.....: Went **9-8, 5.38** in 18 starts before the All-Star break...in the second half is **3-4** in 10 starts despite a sterling **2.41era**.

Zeroes: From **8/8-8/19** put together a **17.0-inning scoreless streak**, the longest by a Reds pitcher this season and tying his career high (7/2-7/19, 2004).

Workhorse: Since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 131 starts and leads the National League with 834.1 innings pitched.

In The Big Inning: Allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 12 of his 28 starts...has posted an 7.39era in the first inning (28ip, 23er) and a 3.66era after the first frame (155ip, 63er).
