At tonight's **Hispanic Heritage Night** celebration, **Ramon Hernandez** and former Red **Alex Gonzalez** are hosting from the **Academy of Multilingual Immersion Studies** 200 fans in moon deck Section 143 as part of their **Los Amigos del Beisbol de Los Rojos** ticket program targeting local hispanic families...the guests received transportation to and from the game, a custom Reds cap and a \$10 concession voucher...bullpen coach **Porky Lopez** and players **Edinson Volquez**, **Wladimir Balentien** and **Adam Rosales** visited the school yesterday.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (1-1) of a 4-game series vs **Marty Sewell's** Marlins and **Game 6** (4-1) of a 7-game homestand that includes a 3-game sweep of the **Astros**...including tonight's game the Reds will finish the season with **8g at Great American Ball Park** (2g vs Fla, 3g vs StL, 3g vs Pit) and **6g on the road** (3g at Pit, 3g at Hou).

DOT, DOT, DOT: Last night's 4-3 loss snapped the Reds' season-high 8-game home winning streak and their 9-game winning streak vs the Marlins at Great American Ball Park.

PLAYIN' EVERY DAY: Tonight's game is **Game 16** (8-7) in a stretch during which the Reds will play **17 consecutive days**, their longest uninterrupted stretch of the season (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, 1-2 at Chi, 3-0 vs Hou, 1-0, **1-1 vs Fla**)...their next day off is **Monday**, when they will travel to Pittsburgh to begin their final road trip of the season.

HAL MCCOY: Reds beat writer **Hal McCoy** of the *Dayton Daily News* will retire following this season...earlier this week he was honored in a pregame ceremony at Great American Ball Park...**McCoy** has worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign is **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs.

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **113 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **113-77**...allowed first-inning runs in 55 of their 148g this season.

STAFF EXPANSION: Class AA Carolina manager **David Bell** temporarily has joined **Dusty Baker's** coaching staff...Friday in Houston, Class AAA Louisville manager **Rick Sweet** will join the staff in relief of **Bell**.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **120 different lineups** in 148g.

SURGERIES: Seven Reds players have had surgical procedures this season, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

EMMY AWARD: For the second consecutive year, Reds TV rightsholder **FOX Sports Ohio** has won an **Emmy Award** for its *Reds Live* pre-game show (sports programs category)...congratulations to hosts **Jim Day** and **Jeff Picoro**, producer **Kent Weaver** and directors **Brian Hunterman** and **Roy Alferts**...FOX Sports Ohio also won an **Emmy** for its **Columbus Blue Jackets** NHL game coverage (live sporting event category).

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (35-38 .479): Last night's 4-3 loss snapped the Reds' 8-game home winning streak, their season high and 1 shy of the ballpark record...are **4-1** on this homestand (3-0 vs Hou, 1-1 vs Fla)...went **7-13-3 in their previous 23 home series**...including this homestand produced a winning record on 4 of their 12 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2, 4-1**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **276-283-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

REDS ON THE ROAD (33-42, .440): The Reds went **4-6** on their most recent road trip (3-0 at Atl, 0-4 at Col, 1-2 at Chi)...went **10-12-2 in their 24 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 6 of their 11 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3, 4-2**, 4-6)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (166): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 35, FIFTH - 72, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **87** days below .500.

REDS vs MARLINS: The Reds are 79-60 all-time vs the Marlins, including 2-2 this season and 8-4 the last 2 seasons...have won 11 of their last 15g vs Fla...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 12-9, including 1-1 this season and 8-1 the last 3 seasons...have won 9 of the last 10g here vs Fla...**at Land Shark Stadium:** Reds are 35-32, including 1-1 in 2008 and 15-10 the last 7 seasons..

Wins Beginning 6/29/08
In the 14-1 loss on 6/24/08 at Tor, Bronson Arroyo made the shortest start of his career and became only the sixth starting pitcher in Major League history to allow at least 10 earned runs in a game in which he retired 3 batters or fewer (1+ip, 11h, 10er)...beginning with his next start, a 9-5 win at Cle on 6/29/08, Arroyo has 24 wins, fourth-most in the Major Leagues since then: CC Sabathia 28-9, 2.79 Roy Halladay 27-14, 2.82 Cliff Lee 25-13, 2.90 BRONSON ARROYO .. 24-16, 3.83 7 pitchers 23 wins

Iron Man
Since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season, Bronson Arroyo ranks among the Major League leaders in games started and innings pitched: Category NL ML Starts 133 1st 1st IP 848.1 1st 5th

pitcher this season...last year, **Edinson Volquez** produced a team-best string of 12 straight QS (4/22-6/20).

As Luck Would Have It....: Went **9-8, 5.38** in 18 starts before the All-Star break...in the second half is **4-4** in 12 starts despite a sterling **2.33era**.

In The Big Inning: Allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 12 of his 30 starts...has posted an 6.90era in the first inning (30ip, 23er) and a 3.56era after the first frame (167ip, 66er).

Last Pitched: Mon vs Hou and earned the 3-1 victory (7ip, 6h, 1er, 0bb, 6k, 108 pitches, 79 strikes)...left trailing, 1-0, but the Reds took the lead in the bottom of the seventh inning on Bruce's 2-run single off Wright...allowed only Lee's run-scoring double with 2 outs in the sixth.

Red Hots: Is making his 31st start of the season...posted a **1.99era** in August, a **2.33era** since the All-Star break and a **2.11era** in his last 13 starts (94ip, 22er)...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 10 starts...in his 30 starts the Reds went 14-16 and scored 111 runs (3.70 r/g).

Milestones: Enters tonight's game with **30 starts** and **197.0 innings pitched**...is 3.0 innings shy of his **fifth consecutive season** during which he made 30 starts and threw 200 innings...is looking to become one of only a handful of pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons...**Dan Haren** (209.1) and **Mark Buehrle** (204.0) already joined that club, and others on the cusp are **Javier Vazquez** (197.1), **Roy Oswalt** (181.1) and **Andy Pettitte** (178.1)...**Arroyo** will lead the Reds in starts for the fourth straight season and in innings pitched for the third time in 4 years.

Quality: Leads the pitching staff with 20 quality starts...produced QS in each of his last 10 apps (**3-3, 2.11**, 72.2ip, 17er), the longest streak of quality starts by a Reds
