End of An Era

The 2009 season was the last covered by **Hal McCoy** as beat writer for the *Dayton Daily News* and by FOX Sports Ohio broadcaster **George Grande**...**McCoy** worked for the *DDN* for 46 years and is enshrined in the writers' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown...the longest-tenured baseball beat writer in the country, the 2009 campaign was **McCoy's** 37th covering the Redlegs...**Grande** had been part of the Reds TV broadcast team, along with **Chris Welsh**, since 1993.

A LOOK AHEAD: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Reds won 10 of their last 13g, 14 of their last 19g and 27 of their last 40g...also won 21 of their last 26g vs **NL Central Division** opponents and overall vs the Central finished **46-34** (.575)...**Reds defenders** established franchise records in a non-strike season for **fielding percentage** (.985) and **fewest errors** (89)...**Joey Votto** (.322) became the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...his **.322ba** was the highest by a Reds batter since **Casey** hit **.324** in **2004**...**Paul Janish** took over at shortstop after the 8/14 trade of **Alex Gonzalez** to the Red Sox and from that point forward led all Major League shortstops with a .995 fielding percentage (minimum 100 total chances).

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: The Reds won the season's last 2 **National League Player of the Week** awards...**Joey Votto** earned recognition for the week ending **9/27** after he led the Major Leagues in hitting (.560), hits (14), doubles (10), extra-base hits (11), total bases (27) and runs scored (11) while leading the NL and ranking second in the majors in on-base percentage (.593) and slugging percentage (1.080)...**RHP Homer Bailey** won the award for the last week of the season after allowing just 1 earned run over 13.0 innings (14k) in a 7-2 win vs StL and a 6-0 win over the Pirates.

IN SEPTEMBER: The Reds went **18-9 in September**, tied with the Rockies for the second-best record in the Major Leagues that month (NYY, 19-9)...the Reds' 18 wins were their most in September since **2000** (18-11)...went **2-2 in October**...the Reds' 20 wins *beginning 9/1* were the most since the **1999** club went **20-12** in September/October.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **1B Joey Votto** hit **16 doubles** in September, the most by any player in the Major Leagues last month and a club record for a calendar month (**Harry Heilmann**, 15 doubles, **July 1930**)...from 9/22-9/26 **Votto** became the first Major League batter to hit 10 doubles in a 5-game span since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...hit 5 of those doubles vs Pit as part of a stretch in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps, raising his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk).

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: The Reds spent the last 13 days of the season in fourth place in the NL Central...before climbing to fourth on 9/22, the Reds spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22).

20-20-20: **Brandon Phillips** is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 HR and 20 steals in **3 consecutive seasons**...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it each of the last 3 years.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds allowed **115 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and were outscored in the opening frame, **115-81**...allowed first-inning runs in 57 of their 162g.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds finished the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** produced **130 different lineups** in 162g, fifth-most in the National League and ninth-most in the majors.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (40-41 .494): The Reds won 13 of their last 17 home games...went **9-13-4 in their 26 home series**...produced a winning record on 5 of their 13 homestands, including each of the last 3 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2, 6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2, 5-2, 4-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **281-286-1**...from 8/31-9/17 put together a season-high 8-game home winning streak...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record.

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-43, .469): The Reds went **12-12-2 in their 26 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3, 3-2, 3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3, 4-2**, 4-6, **5-1**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (182): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 49, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **103** days below .500.

SURGERIES: **Seven** Reds players had surgical procedures, including **C Ramon Hernandez** (cleaned out left knee), **SS Alex Gonzalez** (removed loose bodies, right elbow), **RHP Mike Lincoln** (cervical disc replacement), **C/IF/OF Wilkin Castillo** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **IF Danny Richar** (repaired torn labrum, left shoulder), **RHP Edinson Volquez** (repaired torn ulnar collateral ligament and torn flexor mass, right elbow) and **RHP Aaron Harang** (appendectomy).

ROSTER NOTES: Forty-six players appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds (25 position players, 21 pitchers)...8 Reds players made their Major League debuts, including **RHP Carlos Fisher**, **LHP Matt Maloney**, **IF Drew Sutton**, **RHP Robert Manuel**, **C Craig Tatum**, **OF Drew Stubbs**, **LHP Pedro Viola** and **IF/OF Juan Francisco**...19 players made their Reds debuts, including the 8 who made Major League debuts along with **OF Wladimir Balentien**, **1B Kevin Barker**, **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Ramon Hernandez**, **OF Darnell McDonald**, **OF Laynce Nix**, **3B Scott Rolen**, **CF Willy Taveras**, **RHP Justin Lehr**, **LHP Arthur Rhodes** and **RHP Kip Wells**.

FIRST TRANSACTION: On 4/28 the Reds disabled **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (chip fracture, left wrist) and recalled **IF Adam Rosales**...those roster moves, on the 23rd day of the season, were the first by the Reds since final cuts the day before Opening Day...was the club's longest stretch to start a season without a roster move since **1985**, when on the 37th day (5/14) the Reds recalled **Alan Knicely** and **Ron Robinson** and optioned to Class AAA Denver **Dann Bilardello** and **Carl Willis**...the Reds began a season without a player on the disabled list for the first time since **1990**.

STREAKING: At **78-84** (.481) the Reds finished below .500 for the ninth consecutive season...is their longest stretch of sub-.500 finishes since 1945-55, when they failed to reach the even mark in 11 straight seasons...haven't finished .500 since 2000, when manager **Jack McKeon's** club went **85-77** (.525).

IF Paul Janish pitched in the ninth inning of the 15-3 loss vs Mil on 5/6 (1ip, 5h, 5er, 0bb, 2k, Fielder 2-run HR) and in the eighth inning of the historic 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi (1ip, 4h, 6er, 2bb, 1k, Werth grand slam)...he became the first Reds position player to pitch since Lenny Harris on 6/1/98 at SF and the first Reds position player to pitch more than once in a season since OF Mel Queen took the mound 7 times during the second half of the 1966 campaign.				

Reds Pitchers: Ranked seventh in the National League with a 4.18 staff ERA...had 12 team shutouts, their highest total since they had 12sho in 1990.

Reds Starters: Rank ninth in the National League with a 4.50 rotation ERA...produced 79 quality starts (**Arroyo 23, Harang 14, Cueto 14, Bailey 10, Owings 6, Lehr 4, Volquez 3, Wells 3, Maloney 2**)...the Reds went 55-24 in those quality starts (.696)...from **6/3-6/10** produced a season-high **7 consecutive quality starts**, their best stretch since they threw 8 consecutive QS from **8/6-8/14, 2005**...through the first 41g of the season used just 5 starting pitchers, their longest such streak to begin a year since **RHP John Roper** became the staff's **sixth** different starter in the **42nd game** of the **1994 campaign**...on 5/23 vs Cle, in the club's 42nd game, **RHP Homer Bailey** became the Reds' sixth starting pitcher...**Aaron Harang** threw a 3-hitter in the 2-0 win vs Pit in the club's fifth game of the season...was the earliest complete game by a Reds pitcher since **Pete Harnisch** beat the Cardinals, 3-0 in Busch Stadium, in the **fourth** contest of the **1999** campaign

Reds Relievers: Rank third in the National League with a 3.53 bullpen ERA (LAD 3.14, SF 3.49)...in 7.1 innings during the 22-1 loss on 7/6 at Phi allowed 13r/12er, the bullpen's highest single-game totals since identical totals in a 16-3 loss on **6/1/98 at SF**...bullpen's ERA excluding that game drops from 3.53 to 3.39 (488.1ip, 184er)...didn't blow a save until the club's 36th game, a 6-5 loss in 16 innings on 5/16 at SD...for the second straight season the Reds' bullpen was the last in the Major Leagues to suffer a blown save...in 2008 didn't blow a save until the 41st game (5/14)...over the last 2 seasons **Francisco Cordero** has recorded **73** of the bullpen's **75** saves (34sv in 2008, 39sv in 2009)...**David Weathers** (6/10/09 at Wsh) and **Micah Owings** (9/1/09 vs Pit) have the club's only other 2 saves over the last 2 seasons.

61 BRONSON ARROYO, rhp **33gs, 15-13, 3.84, 3cg, 2sho**
In each of the last 5 seasons produced at least 32 starts and 200 innings pitched...is 1 of only 4 pitchers to record at least 200 innings in each of the last 5 seasons (Dan Haren, Javier Vazquez, Mark Buehrle)...since he was acquired by the Reds prior to the 2006 season leads all Major League pitchers with 136 starts and leads the National League with 871.2 innings pitched...in 2009 led the Reds' pitching staff in wins (15), starts (33), complete games (3), shutouts (2) and innings pitched (220.1ip)...led the Reds in starts for the fourth straight season, in complete games for the second straight year and in innings pitched for the third time in 4 years...ranked among the National League leaders in shutouts (T1st), HR allowed (31, 2nd), innings pitched (4th), wins (T4th), losses (13, T4th) and hits allowed (214, 10th)...with 15 wins tied his career high (2008)...in each of his last 12 starts of the season threw at least 7.0 innings without allowing more than 3 earned runs (5-3, 1.91)...was the longest such streak by a Reds pitcher in the modern era and the longest by any pitcher in the Major Leagues since Curt Schilling did it in 12 straight starts from 6/25-8/21, 2002...in the last 20 years, the only other pitchers to produce such a streak of at least 12 straight starts are Greg Maddux (12, 1992) and Randy Johnson (14, 1999)...also led the staff with 23 quality starts...beginning 7/28 finished the season with 13 consecutive quality starts (5-4, 2.06), the longest streak by a Reds pitcher since Jose Rijo had 15 straight quality apps from 7/6-9/15, 1993...produced 15 quality starts in his last 16 apps...pitched into the seventh inning in each of his last 13 starts...beginning 7/10 posted a 2.07era in his last 16 starts of the season,

the best ERA in the Major Leagues in that span...in his 33 starts the Reds went 16-17 and scored 123 runs (3.73 r/g)...finished the season 3 strikeouts shy of 1,000...went 9-8, 5.38 in 18 starts before the All-Star break and 6-5, 2.24 in 15 starts after the break...allowed at least 1 run in the first inning of 12 of his 33 starts...posted a 6.27era in the first inning and a 3.41era after the first frame...from 8/8-8/19 put together a 17.0-inning scoreless streak, the longest by a Reds pitcher this season and tying his career high...began a season 3-0 for the third time in his career but for the first time won his first 3 starts of a season...was the first Reds pitcher to begin the season in the rotation and win his first 3 starts since LHP Pete Schourek did it in 1996 and the first righthander since Jack Armstrong won his first 5 starts of 1990...as a batter ranked T4th in the NL with a team-high 14 sac bunts.

34 HOMER BAILEY, rhp **20gs, 8-5, 4.53**
In his last 9 starts of the season beginning 8/23 went 6-1, 1.70 and twice was the victim of blown saves...was the best ERA in the Major Leagues over that span...won the National League's Player of the Week Award for the last week of the season after allowing just 1 earned run over 13.0 innings (14k) in a 7-2 win vs StL and a 6-0 win over the Pirates...in his 20 starts the Reds went 9-11 and scored 99 runs (4.95 r/g)...had 10 quality starts, including each of his last 4 apps and 7 of his last 9 apps...a team-high 3 times was the victim of blown saves...began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...finished the season in Cin...in 14 apps overall for the Bats went 8-5, 2.71 with 2cg and 1sho...produced 11 quality starts, including quality starts in each of his last 7 apps there (5-1, 1.07)...in his first start of the season for Louisville allowed a season-high 8 earned runs in 5.1 innings (13.50era)...in his last 13 starts for the Bats posted a 2.03era...in 6 minor league starts between his 5/22 and 6/27 promotions went 5-0, 0.81...twice was named the International League's Pitcher of the Week.

45 BILL BRAY, lhp **3g, 0-0-0, 0.00 at Louisville**
Made just 3 apps for Class AAA Louisville before an elbow injury ended his season...on 4/16 went on the Bats' disabled list with a strained left elbow...on 5/19 had "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in that elbow (Dr. Timothy Kremchek)...is expected to miss 10-12 months from the date of surgery.

51 JARED BURTON, rhp **53g, 1-0-0, 4.40**
Began the season with Cin and posted a 6.33era in 20 apps before he was optioned to Louisville on 6/1, when Edinson Volquez came off the disabled list...never left the team and was recalled the next day, when Volquez returned to the disabled list...posted a 2.19era in 9 more apps for the Reds before he was optioned to Louisville on 7/1...returned to Cin on 7/20 and made 2 more apps before he went on the disabled list with right shoulder fatigue (7/26-8/9)...in 22 apps after he came off the DL posted a 2.35era, including a 1.20era in his last 15 apps of the season...didn't allow a run in his last 9 apps (9ip)...overall made 10 apps for Louisville (3-0, 0.82, 11ip, 8h, 1er, 3bb, 10k).

48 FRANCISCO CORDERO, rhp **68g, 2-6-39, 2.16**
Was an All-Star for the third time (2004 for Tex, 2007 for Mil, 2009 for Cin)...with 39 saves ranked second in the National League (SD's Heath Bell, 42) and led the team for the second straight season...recorded at least 30 saves for the third straight season and for the fifth time in the last 6 seasons...converted 39-43 save opps, including a season-best streak of 15 straight conversions to begin the year...with 250 career saves ranks 28th on that all-time list...in the 3-0 victory on 4/22 at Chi recorded his 100th save in the National League to become only the 11th pitcher in history with at least 100 saves in each league...from 8/25-8/28 pitched 4 straight days and from 9/14-9/18 pitched 5 straight days.

47 JOHNNY CUETO, rhp **30gs, 11-11, 4.41**
Ranked second on the staff to Bronson Arroyo in victories (11), starts (30) and innings pitched (171.ip) and second to Aaron Harang in strikeouts (132)...ranked second in the Major Leagues with a team-high 14 hit batsmen (Mil's Dave Bush, 15)...from 8/20-8/31 was on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...after he came off the DL went 3-1, 3.63 in his final 6 starts...missed a scheduled start on 9/17 vs Fla with a throat infection...had 14 quality starts, including 2 strings of 5 consecutive QS (4/22-5/13, 5/24-6/14)...in his 30 starts the Reds went 16-14 and scored 127 runs (4.23 r/g)...once was the victim of a blown save...in 10 of his 30 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 19 of his 30 starts threw at least 6.0 innings...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69 and made a strong bid for a spot on the National League All-Star team...in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64 until he went on the DL...snapped that losing streak with a 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went 4-0, 1.25...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since Tim Lincecum had a 4-game stretch from 5/27-6/13, 1992...started the Dominican Republic's second game of the World Baseball Classic and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).

46 CARLOS FISHER, rhp **39g, 1-1-0, 4.47**
