TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs the National League Central Division champion Cardinals and **Game 3** (2-0) of the Reds' final homestand of the season...will finish the 2009 campaign here this weekend with a 3-game set vs the **Pirates** beginning tomorrow night.

STREAKING: The Reds have won 8 of their last 9g, 12 of their last 15g and 25 of their last 36g...in the last 15g **Reds batters** are hitting .294 (148-504) with 91 runs scored (6.1 r/g), including a team-best .473 by **Joey Votto** (26-55, 14 2b, 12rbi)...**Reds pitchers** in the last 15g have posted a 2.49era (134ip, 37er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 15g have posted a 1.26era (35.2ip, 5er), dropping the bullpen's overall ERA from **3.70** to **3.53**...**Reds starters** in the last 12g have posted a 2.49era (79.2ip, 22er).

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs have won 19 of their last 22g vs **NL Central** opponents and are **44-32 (.573)** within the division overall...the Reds' next victory will be **Dusty Baker's** 1,313th as manager, which will tie him with **Ned Hanlon** for 27th on the all-time list...**Reds defenders** so far have produced a **.985 fielding percentage**, which would establish a franchise record for a non-strike season (.984, 6 times, last in 2007).

IN SEPTEMBER: The Reds' 18 wins last month were their most in September since **2000** (18-11)...haven't won more than 18 games to finish a season *beginning 9/1* since the exciting **1999** club went **20-12** in September/October.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **1B Joey Votto** has **16 doubles** in September, a club record for a calendar month (**Harry Heilmann**, 15 doubles, **July 1930**)...last week **Votto** became the first Major League batter to hit 10 doubles in a 5-game span since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...hit 5 of those doubles vs the Pirates as part of a stretch in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps, raising his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...no Major League player has produced 16 or more doubles in a month since Bal's **Brian Roberts** had 17 in **June 2008** and no National League batter has done it since Fla's **Kevin Millar** had 17 doubles in **September 2002**...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: For the ninth straight day the Reds are in fourth place in the National League Central Division...before climbing to fourth on 9/22, the Reds spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...the Reds trail third-place Mil by only 1.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by 3.0g...**Cin can clinch fourth place** with any combination of Reds wins and Astros losses totaling 2.

MILESTONES: **Brandon Phillips** (95rbi) is trying to become only the second Reds second baseman ever to produce 100rbi in a season (**Joe Morgan**, 1976, 110 of his 111rbi as a 2B)...**Joey Votto** (.318) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**.

20-20-20: **Brandon Phillips** is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in *3 consecutive seasons*...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

LEADING OFF: From 9/15-9/19 the Reds produced **3 leadoff home runs** in 5g, including 2 by **Drew Stubbs** (9/15 off Hou's **Roy Oswalt**, 9/19 off Fla's **Ricky Nolasco**) and another by **Darnell McDonald** in his only start of the season batting first (9/17 off Fla's **Anibal Sanchez**)...**Stubbs** leads the club with 3 leadoff HR (other, 8/31 off Pit's **Daniel McCutchen**), the most by a Reds batter in a season since **Ryan Freel** produced 3 leadoff homers in **2006**...no Reds batter has produced more than 3 leadoff homers in a season since **Jerome Walton** had **4** in **1995** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **128 different lineups** in 158g.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (38-39 .494): The Reds have won 11 of their last 13 home games...are **2-0** on this homestand (**2-0 vs StL**, 3g vs Pit)...including this one went **8-13-4 in their 25 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their previous 12 homestands, including each of their last 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **279-284-1**...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008).

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-43, .469): The Reds went **12-12-2 in their 26 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**, 4-6, **5-1**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, the **Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (178): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 45, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...at **20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g** over .500 at **36-24**...at **51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **99** days below .500.

REDS vs CARDINALS: The Reds are 936-1,059 all-time vs the Cardinals, including 8-7 this season...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 29-26, including 5-3 this season...**Albert Pujols'** 15 homers here trail only **Lance Berkman's** 21 as the most by a visiting player...**last Reds sweep:** at Cin: 5/1-5/2, 2006 (2g); 9/11-9/13, 2007 (3g); 5/5-5/8, 2003 (4g).

UP NEXT: REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **979-1,020 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 11-4 this season...Cin has won the last 8g vs Pit, their longest winning streak vs the Pirates since a 9-game winning streak in 1986, **Barry Bonds'** rookie year...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 30-29 all-time, including 5-1 this season.

Last Pitched: On 9/20 vs Fla and threw a season-high 7+ innings to earn the 8-1 victory (5h, 1er, 0bb, 2k, 1hbp, 92 pitches, 61 strikes)...left leading, 8-1, with 2 runners on base but Herrera stranded both...didn't allow a hit until Ramirez single with 2 outs in the fourth inning...allowed only an RBI-single to Carroll in the eighth.

Red Hots: Media guide bio is available in the press box...is making his 10th appearance and seventh start for the Reds, his first appearance since 9/20...**went 2-1, 3.79 in his 6 starts (35.Zip, 15er) and 0-1, 4.15 in his 3 relief apps (8.Zip, 4er)**...in his 6 starts the Reds went 5-1 and scored 25 runs (4.17 r/g)...his appearance on 8/26 at Mil was his first Major League start since 7/21/08, snapping a string of 66 consecutive relief apps for the Rockies, Royals, Nationals and Reds.

2009 Season: Was signed by the Nationals during spring training...began the season at Class AAA Syracuse and was promoted on 4/20 after posting a 2.45era in 2 starts...from 5/31-6/14 was on Wsh's disabled list with a strained right shoulder...was released on 7/6 and the next day was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract...was assigned to Class AAA Louisville and posted a 3.07 in 1 start and 4 relief apps before he was promoted on 7/31, along with RHP Justin Lehr, when the Reds traded IF/OF Jerry Hairston Jr. to the Yankees and 3B Edwin Encarnacion and RHP Josh Roenicke to the Blue Jays...made his Reds debut on 8/10 at StL after Cueto left in the second inning with an injury.

Wells' Most Recent Starts: **8/26 at Mil**, in his first start since 7/21/08 received no decision in the 10-inning, 4-3 victory (5ip, 7h, 3er, 3bb, 2k, 2hr, 1hbp, 97 pitches, 55 strikes)...left trailing, 3-2, but the Reds tied it in the eighth inning and won it in the 10th...allowed all 3 runs on a pair of home runs in the fifth inning, a solo HR to Gerut with 1 out and a 2-out, 2-run HR to Fielder...**8/31 vs Pit**, in the opener of the day/night doubleheader was the victim of a blown save in the 4-3 victory (6ip, 2h, 2er, 4bb, 2k, 1hbp, 108 pitches, 60 strikes)...left leading, 3-2, but the Bucs tied it with a run in the seventh inning off Fisher...allowed both runs in the second on RBI-singles to Jaramillo and McCutchen...**9/5 at Atl** and allowed just 1 hit in 6.0 shutout innings to earn the 3-1 victory (4bb, 4k, 1hbp, 97 pitches, 51 strikes)...left leading, 3-0....was his first victory since 4/17/08 for Col at SD, snapping a 6-game losing streak...allowed only Anderson's single leading off the second inning...stranded 6 baserunners...**9/10 at Col** and suffered the 5-1 loss (5ip, 6h, 5er, 3bb, 3k, 1hr, 76 pitches, 47 strikes)...left trailing, 5-1...with 2 outs in the fifth inning allowed 5 runs on a walk and 4 hits, including a 2-run HR by Atkins...the rally began on Young's bunt single back to Wells...**9/15 vs Hou**, threw a season-high 6.2 innings but received no decision in the 5-4 victory (5h, 4er, 2bb, 1k, 1hr, 98 pitches, 62 strikes)...left with the score tied, 4-4...threw 28 pitches in the top of the first inning, when the Astros scored 3 times on 3 hits, a walk and 3 stolen bases...allowed just 1 run and 2 hits the rest of his outing...from the third through the seventh innings retired 13 consecutive batters.

Last Pitched: Sat at Hou and earned the 10-4 victory (5ip, 6h, 4er, 2bb, 4k, 2hr, 1hbp, 80 pitches, 44 strikes)...left leading, 8-4...allowed solo HR to Pence in the second inning and to Tejada in the third...in the fifth allowed Tejada's RBI-single and Berkman's run scoring-GIDP.

Red Hots: Last name is pronounced **LEER**...media guide bio is available in the press box...tomorrow vs Pit will make his 11th career start, all this season, and his fourth appearance since skipping a start with a sore right groin...was scheduled to start on 9/7 at Col but was scratched with the injury...**in his 3 starts since then is 2-1, 8.59 (14.Zip, 14er)**...will start tomorrow instead of **LHP Matt Maloney**, who has been bothered by a blister on his left middle finger...in August led the staff in wins (3)...in his 10 starts the Reds went 6-4 and scored 57 runs (5.7 r/g)...has 3 quality starts and fell 3 outs shy of producing another.

Most Valuable Pitcher: Was named the International League's **Most Valuable Pitcher**...at Leigh Valley (Phillies) and Louisville combined to finish **13-3, 3.31** in 18 starts and 2 relief apps...tied for the International League lead in victories and ranked fourth in ERA...3 times was IL Pitcher of the Week...was the starting pitcher for the IL in the **Triple-A All-Star Game** in Portland...last night was recognized at the ballpark in a pre-game ceremony, along with International League Manager of the Year **Rick Sweet**.
