TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 2** (0-1) of the Reds' final series of the 2009 season, a 3-game set vs **Jimmy Trdinich's** Pirates, and **Game 5** (2-2) of a 6-game homestand that also included a 2-1 series win vs the **Cardinals**.

STREAKING: The Reds have won 8 of their last 11g, 12 of their last 17g and 25 of their last 38g...in the last 17g **Reds batters** are hitting .278 (158-568) with 92 runs scored (5.4 r/g), including a team-best .443 by **Joey Votto** (27-61, 14 2b, 12rbi)...**Reds pitchers** in the last 17g have posted a 3.14era (152ip, 53er)...**Reds relievers** in the last 17g have posted a 2.56era (45.2ip, 13er), dropping the bullpen's overall ERA from **3.70** to **3.60**...**Reds starters** in the last 14g have posted a 3.08era (87.2ip, 30er).

DOT, DOT, DOT: The Redlegs have won 19 of their last 24g vs **NL Central** opponents and are **44-34 (.564)** within the division overall...the Reds' next victory will be **Dusty Baker's** 1,313th as manager, which will tie him with **Ned Hanlon** for 27th on the all-time list...**Reds defenders** so far have produced a **.985 fielding percentage**, which would establish a franchise record for a non-strike season (.984, 6 times, last in 2007)...the Cincinnati Reds Hall of Fame's **Class of 2010** will be announced at a press conference Tuesday at 4:30 p.m. in the Hall of Fame...celebrating birthdays tomorrow are **OF Drew Stubbs** (25) and first base coach **Billy Hatcher** (49).

IN SEPTEMBER: The Reds went **18-9** in September, tied with the Rockies for the second-best record in the Major Leagues last month (NYY, 19-9)...the Reds' 18 wins were their most in September since **2000** (18-11)...are 0-2 so far in October...haven't won more than 18 games to finish a season *beginning 9/1* since the exciting **1999** club went **20-12** in September/October.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: **1B Joey Votto** hit **16 doubles** in September, the most by any player in the Major Leagues last month and a club record for a calendar month (**Harry Heilmann**, 15 doubles, **July 1930**)...last week **Votto** became the first Major League batter to hit 10 doubles in a 5-game span since Pit's **Paul Waner** did it in **1932**...hit 5 of those doubles vs the Pirates as part of a stretch in which he reached base in 8 straight plate apps, raising his BA from .304 to .315 (5 doubles, 2 singles, 1 walk)...courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

CLIMBING THE STANDINGS: For the 11th straight day the Reds are in fourth place in the National League Central Division...before climbing to fourth on 9/22, the Reds spent 73 consecutive days in fifth (72 days) or sixth place (1 day, 8/22)...with 2g remaining, the Reds trail third-place Mil by 2.0g and lead the fifth-place Astros by 2.0g...the Reds will clinch fourth place with their next victory or the Astros' next loss...the Brewers will clinch third place with their next victory or the Reds' next loss.

MILESTONES: **Brandon Phillips** (95rbi) is trying to become only the second Reds second baseman ever to produce 100rbi in a season (**Joe Morgan**, 1976, 110 of his 111rbi as a 2B)...**Joey Votto** (.316) is trying to become the first Reds batter to hit .300 since **Sean Casey** (.312) and **Ken Griffey Jr.** (.301) did it in **2005**...**RHP Francisco Cordero** (39sv, 2nd in NL) is trying to become the first Reds pitcher to lead the National League in saves since **RHP Jeff Shaw** produced 42 saves in **1997**.

20-20-20: **Brandon Phillips** is the only player in Reds history to produce at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases in *3 consecutive seasons*...**Phillips** and Fla's **Hanley Ramirez** are the only Major League players to do it in each of the last 3 years.

ROSTER MATTERS: The 2 Reds players eligible for free agency following this season are **RHP Kip Wells** and **C Ramon Hernandez** (team option for 2010)...the 3 Reds players eligible for arbitration are **OF Jonny Gomes**, **C Corky Miller** and **OF Laynce Nix**...potentially eligible for arbitration as **Super 2s** are **RHP Jared Burton**, **RHP Nick Masset** and **RHP Micah Owings**.

FIRST WATCH: The Reds have allowed **114 first inning runs**, the most in the Major Leagues, and have been outscored in the opening frame, **114-80**...allowed first-inning runs in 56 of their 160g this season.

OPENING DAY LINEUP: Because of injuries and trades, the Reds will finish the season with just **10g** (5-5) that included the projected **2009 Opening Day** lineup of **C Ramon Hernandez**, **1B Joey Votto**, **2B Brandon Phillips**, **3B Edwin Encarnacion** (traded) **SS Alex Gonzalez** (traded), **RF Jay Bruce**, **CF Willy Taveras** and either **Chris Dickerson** or **Jerry Hairston Jr.** (traded) in LF...Reds manager **Dusty Baker** has produced **130 different lineups** in 160g.

REDS AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK (38-41 .481): The Reds have won 11 of their last 15 home games...are **2-2** on this homestand (2-1 vs StL, **0-1 vs Pit**)...went **8-13-4 in their previous 25 home series**...produced a winning record on 4 of their previous 12 homestands, including each of their previous 2 homestands (2-3, 2-4, **3-2**, **6-3**, 1-2, 3-3, 3-3, 2-2, 2-8, 2-5, **5-2**, **5-2**)...in 7 seasons at GABP are **279-286-1**...last season the Reds established the GABP record for victories in a season (**43-38**)...from 7/28-8/4 lost 8 straight home games, tying the ballpark record for consecutive home losses (8/5-8/16, 2008)...**at 217-217-1** the Reds had evened their overall record at GABP for the first time since **6/26/04** (57-57)...also reached .500 at **219-219-1**.

REDS ON THE ROAD (38-43, .469): The Reds went **12-12-2 in their 26 road series**...produced a winning or .500 record on 7 of their 12 road trips (**7-3**, **3-2**, **3-3**, 2-5, 2-4, **3-3**, 2-5, 0-6, **3-3**, **4-2**, 4-6, **5-1**)...entering this season and dating to 2006, **the Reds had losing records in 23 of their previous 28 road trips**.

IN THE STANDINGS (180): The Reds have spent the following days alone or tied at each position in the National League Central Division standings: FIRST - 1, SECOND - 9, THIRD - 46, FOURTH - 47, FIFTH - 75, SIXTH - 2...**at 20-14** and **26-20** were a season-high **6g over .500**...prior to this season hadn't been **6g over .500** since **2006**, when they reached a season-high **12g over .500** at **36-24**...**at 51-71** were a season-high **20g under .500**...on 9/10 and 9/11 faced season-high **20.5-game deficits**...have spent **64** days above, **15** days at and **101** days below .500.

REDS vs PIRATES: The Reds are **979-1,021 all-time** vs the Pirates, including 11-5 this season...Cin has won 8 of the last 9g vs Pit, including an 8-game winning streak from 8/23-9/24 of this season, their longest winning streak vs the Pirates since a 9-game winning streak in 1986, **Barry Bonds'** rookie year...**at Great American Ball Park:** Reds are 30-30 all-time, including 5-2 this season...**at PNC Park:** Reds are 37-33 all-time, including 6-3 in 2009...**last Pirates sweep:** at Cin: 7/23-7/24, 2003 (2g); 3/31-4/3, 2003 (3g);...at Pit: 8/20-8/21, 1998 (2g); 4/11-4/13, 2008 (3g).

Last Pitched: Sun at at Hou and suffered the 3-2 loss (7.1ip, 6h, 3er, 5bb, 5k, 1hr, 1wp, 111 pitches, 65 strikes)....left trailing, 3-2...allowed a pair of run-scoring groundouts to Berkman and Lee in the third inning and a solo HR to Quintero in the fourth.

Red Hots: The 23-year-old righthander is making his 30th start of the season, his sixth since a stint on the disabled list with inflammation in his right shoulder...was on the DL from **8/20-8/31**...in 5 starts since then is **2-1, 3.14** (28.2ip, 10er)...missed a scheduled start on 9/17 vs Fla with a throat infection...ranks second in the Major Leagues with 14 hit batsmen (Mil's Dave Bush, 15) and 3 times hit 2 batters in a game...in his 29 starts the Reds went 15-14 and scored 119 runs (4.10 r/g)...in 10 of his 29 starts threw at least 7.0 innings and in 18 of his 29 starts threw at least 6.0 innings...has 14 quality starts.

Streaking: The 6-3 win on 8/31 vs Pit snapped his career-high 6-game losing streak...through 16 starts on 7/1 was 8-4, 2.69 and made a strong bid for a spot on the National League All-Star team...**in his next 8 starts, from 7/6-8/15, went 0-6, 10.64** until he went on the DL...in 5 starts from 4/22-5/13 went **4-0, 1.25**...the 4-game winning streak was the longest of his career...in each of 4 starts from 4/22-5/8 threw at least 7.0 innings while allowing no more than 1 run, the longest streak of that kind by a Reds pitcher since **Tim Belcher** had a 4-game run from **5/27-6/13, 1992** (courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

World Baseball Classic: Started the Dominican Republic's second game of the tournament and threw 4.2 scoreless innings to earn the 9-0 win vs Panama in the San Juan bracket (4.2ip, 3h, 1bb, 5k).

Cueto's Starts vs Pirates: **4/11 vs Pit**, in his season debut suffered the 10-2 loss (6ip, 8h, 4er, 1bb, 9k, 1hr, 109 pitches, 67 strikes)...left trailing, 4-0...allowed McLouth's 2-run HR in the first inning...in the fourth allowed Wilson's RBI-double and Morgan's RBI-triple...**5/3 at Pit**, in the 5-0 victory threw 8.0 shutout innings in the best start of his young career (4h, 1bb, 9k, 109 pitches, 68 strikes)....the 8.0 innings are a career high...allowed only 4 singles...**8/31 vs Pit**, in the nightcap of the day/night doubleheader and his first appearance after a stint on the disabled list earned the 6-3 victory to snap his career-high 6-game losing streak (5+ip, 3h, 1er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 85 pitches, 56 strikes)...left leading, 4-1...allowed only a sixth-inning leadoff HR to McCutchen, his final batter..**9/22 at Pit**, in his first appearance since 9/12 earned the 10-4 victory (5ip, 9h, 2er, 0bb, 2k, 1hr, 101 pitches, 68 strikes)....left leading, 5-2...allowed a leadoff HR to McCutchen and an RBI-double by Ceden0 in the fourth inning...missed his previous start with a throat infection.

Red Hots: Tomorrow will make his 20th start of the season and the 37th start of his Major League career...**in his last 8 starts is 5-1,**

1.89 and twice was the victim of blown saves...in his 19 starts the Reds went 8-11 and scored 93 runs (4.89 r/g)...has 9 quality starts, including 6 of his last 8 apps...a team-high 3 times was the victim of blown saves.

2009 Season: Began the year at Class AAA Louisville, where he went 3-5, 4.57 with 2 complete games and a shutout in 8 starts before he was promoted on 5/22...started the 7-6 loss vs Cle on 5/23, then was optioned back to Louisville the next day...made 6 more starts for the Bats (5-0, 0.81) before he was recalled again to start on 6/27 at Cle...has been with the Reds since then...twice was named the International League’s **Pitcher of the Week**.
